Teacher Responsibility Policy For TMTF and VMTA Events

Each event page in the Tidewater Music Teachers Forum Yearbook and Student Activity Book contain the following statement that a teacher must sign to indicate that he/she will assist on the day of the event:

Responsibility Policy: A participating teacher must assist on one day during the event or provide a substitute. If a teacher or his/her substitute does not help on the day of the event, the teacher must pay a \$75 penalty fee.

Please note that there is a change of policy for Teacher's Responsibility for Play-A-Thon starting in this year.

If this statement is not signed, the registration will not be accepted.

If a teacher (or his/her substitute) fails to assist on the day of the event, the teacher must pay the \$75 fee. The teacher will not be able to participate in TMTF events for the remainder of the teaching year until the \$75 fee is paid.

In the case of illness or emergency on the day of the event, the teacher must notify the chairperson as soon

Performance and Evaluation Opportunities for Students

Sacred Music Festival – The purpose of the TMTF Sacred Music Festival is to promote church music by teaching students to accompany congregational hymn singing and play Sacred Music in its various forms. The Sacred Music Festival is an evaluation in which the students are judged on their own ability in playing two sacred pieces plus technique. It is not a competition. No memorization is required. All students of any age and length of study may participate. Students will receive a certificate for participation.

Student Recitals – TMTF Student Recitals are held two times during the year at two locations. Any teacher may submit up to four students for each date. Two additional students may be submitted as alternates to be included if time permits. Each student performs one memorized piece.

Play-A-Thon – The purpose of this event is to give students a performing opportunity without the necessity of memorization while raising funds to help support the TMTF Scholarships. Students may play any style of music with their teacher's approval. The event will be held at a local mall. Students are asked to obtain pledges for their performance. Cash awards will be given to the students who obtain the highest amount of pledges.

VMTA Theory Tests – The VMTA Theory Tests are based on twelve musical levels of study and not on school grades. Students may enter the program at any level. An oral test may be given to first grade students; all other grades will take a written test. A student may take only one level a year and may skip levels at the teacher's discretion. The knowledge required for tests is cumulative, and tests may include questions based on materials required for previous levels. There are certificates of participation for all students passing the test. Additional seals and ribbons are given for superior, excellent, and very good. More details are available in the syllabus which can be found on-line or obtained from the chairman.

VMTA Sight Reading Festival – Sight reading is an essential part of music education and should be encouraged for all students. The preparation involved, and the test itself, should be an educational and rewarding experience that will make the student a better sight reader. Certificates, seals, and ribbons are awarded according to the rating the student receives. Contact the chairman to obtain a syllabus of this event.

VMTA Skills Test – The VMTA Skills Tests emphasize technical development. These tests cover Primer through Level 12 of scales, chords, cadences and arpeggios to be performed at specific metronome markings. All material for the test must be memorized. Students may enter the program at any level. They may take two levels a year up to Level 8 and may skip levels at the teacher's discretion. All students who earn a passing score or above will receive a *Certificate of Participation*; along with ribbons given for superior, excellent and very good. Students passing Level 12 will also receive a medal. A syllabus for this event can be obtained from the State Chairperson or on the VMTA Website.

Levels of Progress – The TMTF Levels of Progress is not a competitive event, but rather an opportunity for all students – regardless of age, ability or length of study - to gain the experience of perfecting two pieces to perform for an outside examiner. Levels of Progress includes Primer Level through Level 12. Students may enter in piano, voice, organ, strings, guitar or ensembles. Teachers from within the Tidewater Music Teachers Forum serve as judges for Levels of Progress and complete evaluation sheets for each entrant. Students are judged on a standard of excellence and not against each other. Each student receives a certificate as an award for his/her effort and achievement.

Honors Auditions and Recitals – The TMTF Honors Recitals are for students who maintain a high standard of performance in the studio and who have the desire to compete. Honors Recitals Auditions are for students in all levels of voice, and in levels 4 through 12 of piano, piano ensemble, organ or strings. To qualify for the Honors Recitals Auditions, students must first participate in the Levels of Progress. Students are grouped in the Honors Recitals Auditions according to their stage of repertoire, not according to age or school grade. Each performance receives a numerical grade. From each level, the performers receiving the highest grades are selected for the Honors Recitals. Of the two pieces performed by each participant, the judges select which piece is to be played in the recital. A certificate is awarded to each student who performs in the Honors Recitals.

VMTA Eastern District Auditions – Students compete in one of four levels determined by the school grade the student is in at the time of the next fall convention. Entrants must pass theory and sight reading tests at the designated level for their school grades. Three compositions representing three different periods are performed. Winners and alternates will compete at the VMTA competitions in the fall.

Glen Mayberry Scholarship – High school seniors who have been accepted as music majors in college are eligible for this award. An applicant must submit an application with references and perform a program of two works which should be chosen from the four different music history periods.

The David Carr Glover Scholarship Award – Students in school grades five through eight may apply for financial assistance with their music education. This scholarship is intended for students who exhibit financial and motivational needs. The award can be used for music camp, purchase of music, tickets to concerts, opportunities for special study, lessons, etc. Students must perform two memorized pieces of contrasting styles (one of which should be a David Carr Glover composition) and submit an application with the intended use of the award. Amounts of the awards are determined yearly by the interest income of the Glover Scholarship CD, proceeds from the Play-A-Thon and the number of students participating.

MTNA Performance Competitions – This is a national, highly competitive opportunity for advanced students. Students enter the state competitions in the fall. Those winners proceed to the Southern Division competition in January. The Southern Division winners compete at the national conference in the spring. All information for the MTNA national competitions is on the MTNA website.



TMTF SACRED MUSIC FESTIVAL

PURPOSE:

The purpose of the Sacred Music Festival is to promote church music by teaching students to play sacred music in its various forms and to accompany congregational singing. This Festival is an evaluation, **not** a competition and is open to piano or solo instruments.

Fees are to be collected by each teacher who will then send one check payable to TMTF, to the Festival Chairman. **Fees are non-refundable.**

All teachers entering students are required to assist with the event. This ensures that the students will have someone to evaluate them for all their efforts. Any student may be entered, including adults. Each student will receive a certificate for participation.

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Two sacred pieces (hymns, praise music, solos) are required at each level. Memorization is not required.
2. Selections should be of contrasting moods (example: praise, prayer, thanks, etc.) and one may be seasonal (Christmas, Easter, patriotic, etc.).
3. The student must be able to explain the following starting at Level 3 or higher:
 - a. Keys and key signatures
 - b. Time signatures (note values and pulse if no time signature)
 - c. Lead sheet chords
4. The judging sheet will include questions similar to the following:
 - a. Is the tempo suitable for the piece?
 - b. Is the melody line easy to hear?
 - c. Did the student play confidently?
 - d. Was the pedal used correctly if applicable?
 - e. Did the phrasing reflect the words well?

*****COPYING CLAUSE*****

A student must use original music and will not be allowed to play any copied piece of music. This rule is made by MTNA in the interest of professional ethics.

Exceptions:

- a) Photocopied music downloaded from a computer website is permitted with proof of purchase.
- b) When using out-of-print or an unpublished manuscript, the student must provide written permission from the publisher or copyright holder to copy the music.
- c) When using legally downloaded public domain music, the student must provide written proof of free public domain status.

Judges will need a copy of the music. This may be an original OR a photocopy. The judge will keep the photocopy, and it will be destroyed following the Festival Chairman.

LITERATURE AND TECHNIQUE REQUIREMENTS

In levels Pre-Reading through 5, sacred literature in the form of method books may be used. Remember that words must be included for hymns meant to be sung, not solos for preludes, offertories, etc. If they are not in the books, you can write them in.

Pre-Reading: Two sacred pieces from Pre-reading material.
No technique required.

Primer: Two sacred pieces from Primer level material.
No technique required.

Level 1: Two sacred pieces from Level 1 material.
No technique required.

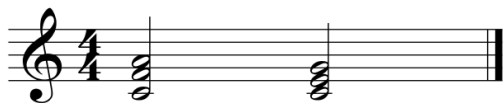
Level 2: Two sacred pieces from Level 2 material
Technique: Tonic chords, broken and/or blocked, hands separate. Five finger patterns, hands separate. (Optional)

Level 3: Two sacred pieces from Level 3 material.
Technique: Tonic chords, broken and/or blocked, hands together. Five finger patterns, hands together.

Level 4:

Two sacred pieces from Level 4 material OR the easiest hymns from the hymn book or four part Praise and Worship book.

Technique: Plagal cadence (IV-I) in root position, as follows, hands separate, or the “Amen” at the end of the hymn. One octave scales, hands separate or together.



Level 5:

Choose from one of the following categories:

- a. Two selections from a hymnal.
- b. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a lead sheet.
- c. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a sacred solo literature book.

Traditional:

- a. Use a standard four part hymnal, praise book or sacred solo book of your choice.
- b. Two verses are required for hymns and praise songs, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- EXCEPTION:** “Doxology” may be played at this level only, one time through.
- c. Prepare an appropriate introduction of at least two measures.
- d. Pedal is optional.
- e. Selections should be in easier key signatures, simple rhythms, and minimal moving parts.

Lead Sheets:

- a. Use a standard lead sheet of your choice.
- b. Two verses of each selection are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- c. Prepare an appropriate introduction of a least two measures.
- d. Choose selections with easier key signatures, simple rhythms, and minimal moving parts.
- e. Students MUST play or sing the melody.
- f. Students should use block chords, root position, at each chord change. Inversions may be used if desired.

Technique: Plagal cadence (IV-I) in root position, hands together. One octave scales, hands together.

Note: *On cadences only, piano style is optional (left hand plays only the root).*

Level 6:

Choose from one of the following categories:

- a. Two selections from a hymnal.
- b. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a lead sheet.
- c. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a sacred solo literature book.

Traditional:

- Use a standard hymnal of your choice.
- Two verses of each hymn or praise song are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- Prepare an appropriate introduction of at least two measures.
- Choose hymns with more advanced key signatures (2 or more sharps or flats).
- OPTIONAL:** The second verse may be played in an improvisational style. The melody must remain prominent. (Suggestions: Double the bass in the left hand, expand the right hand to include the tenor note, use broken chord accompaniment, eighth note patterns, etc.).

Lead Sheets:

- Use a standard lead sheet of your choice.
- Two verses are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- Prepare an appropriate introduction of a least two measures.
- Choose selections with easier key signatures, simple rhythms, and minimal moving parts.
- Students **MUST** play or sing the melody.

Technique: Plagal cadence in root position and inversions, hands separate (see example below). Two octave scales, hands separate. Two octave arpeggios, hands separate.

Note: *On cadences only, piano style is optional (left hand plays only the root).*



Level 7:

Choose from one of the following categories:

- Two selections from a hymnal.
- One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a lead sheet.
- One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a sacred solo literature book.

Traditional:

- Use a standard hymnal of your choice.
- Two verses of each hymn are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- Prepare an appropriate introduction of at least two measures.
- Pedal is required.
- Choose hymns that are more challenging harmonically, rhythmically or technically.
- OPTIONAL:** The second verse may be played in an improvisational style. The melody must remain prominent. (Suggestions: Double the bass in the left hand, expand the right hand to include the tenor note, use broken chord accompaniment, eighth note patterns, etc.). Remember that this is an accompaniment to congregational singing.

Lead Sheets:

- Use a standard lead sheet of your choice.
- Two verses of each selection are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- Prepare an appropriate introduction of a least two measures.
- Pedal is required.
- Choose hymns with more advanced key signatures and more advanced rhythms.
- Students **MUST** play or sing the melody.
- Students **MUST** play the song two times with a different style of accompaniment each time.

Technique: Plagal cadence in root position and inversions, hands together with pedal (see example at Level 6). Two octave scales, hands together. Two octave arpeggios, hands separate or together.

Note: *On cadences only, piano style is optional (left hand plays only the root).*

Level 8:

Choose from one of the following categories:

- a. Two selections from a hymnal.
- b. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a lead sheet.
- c. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a sacred solo literature book.

Traditional:

- a. Use a standard hymnal of your choice.
- b. Two verses of each hymn are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- c. Prepare an appropriate introduction of at least two measures.
- d. Pedal is required.
- e. Choose hymns with more advanced key signatures and more advanced rhythms.
- f. **REQUIRED:** The second verse **MUST** be played in an improvisational style. The melody must remain prominent. (Suggestions: Double the bass in the left hand, expand the right hand to include the tenor note, use broken chord accompaniment, eighth note patterns, etc.). Remember that this is an accompaniment to congregational singing.

Lead Sheets:

- a. Use a standard lead sheet of your choice.
- b. Two verses of each selection are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- c. Prepare an appropriate introduction of at least two measures.
- d. Pedal is required.
- e. Choose hymns with more advanced key signatures and more advanced rhythms.
- f. Students **MUST** play or sing the melody.
- g. Students **MUST** play the song two times with a different style of accompaniment each time.

Technique: Plagal cadence in root position and inversions, hands together with pedal (see example at Level 6). Two octave scales, hands together. Two octave arpeggios, hands together.

Note: *On cadences only, piano style is optional (left hand plays only the root).*

Levels 9-12: Traditional:

- a. Choose from one of the categories below **plus** one from letter “b”.
 1. Two selections from a hymnal.
 2. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a lead sheet.
 3. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a sacred solo literature book.
- b. One of the following options is required:
 1. Transpose one hymn.
 2. Prepare a published arrangement for an offertory or a prelude.
 3. Sight-read one hymn.
 4. Modulate from one hymn to the next.

Lead Sheets:

- a. Student must play the piece two times using different harmonization at least two time throughout and with a different style of accompaniment each time.
- b. The original piece as written must use at least four or more different chords.
- c. The student should use a varied presentation of the chord (broken, Alberti bass, register changes, rhythmic patterns).
- d. One of the following options is required:

Student Recitals

In addition, teachers will be limited to no more than 15 minutes of playing time for all of his/her students.

Music should be memorized for the recitals. Each student plays one piece. No changes in repertoire within one week prior to the recital. The same piece may not be performed twice. First teacher submitting the piece will be accepted.

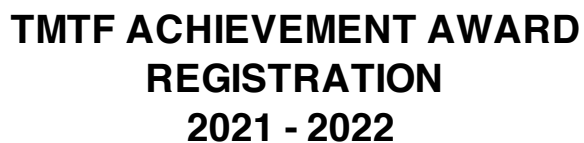

- ✓ The **“Teacher Registration Form”** should be sent to the chairman, Lynn Kleisler, and your time block and day will be assigned and returned to you. **The registration deadline is November 12, 2021.**

C. Studio Schedule and Pledge Validation Form

- ✓ This form is provided to help you keep track of the students who have registered to perform with your studio. It will also be used at the Play-A-Thon to log the students’ pledges.
- ✓ Fill in your name, day and time your studio will be performing.

This is the sixteenth year for our Play-A-Thon. Our goal in implementing this fund raiser is to support our scholarship programs, to expand our community support, and to provide another opportunity for students to perform in a fun environment.

The Play-A-Thon will be held at Greenbrier Mall and Pembroke Mall on December 3rd, 4th and 5th. VMTA THEORY TESTS

The VMTA Theory Tests will be administered on **Saturday, January 29, 2022** at Old Dominion University, Norfolk, Virginia. The Registration Deadline is **Wednesday, December 22, 2021**.

Please be aware that the date and location of this VMTA Theory Event might change because of the global Covid and Delta variant related viruses. Always check the TMTF Stafflines for confirmation details for this VMTA Theory Event.

The fee for taking the examination is \$14.00. One check, made payable to TMTF, should be submitted by the teacher for his/her students and sent to Marilyn Forman, the TMTF Theory Chairman. Applications are available in the TMTF Activity Book.

Students can only take one test per year. Students may enter the program at any level or skip levels at the discretion of their teacher. Tests are based on twelve musical levels of study and not on school grade level. An oral theory test may be given if requested. **Please send a note with the Registration form if your students need an oral test.** Students who previously failed a test can go on to the next level provided the private teacher tests and approves the student to proceed. The knowledge required for tests is cumulative, and tests may include questions based on materials required from previous levels.

Students who are absent the day of the test will receive a test but will not receive VMTA credit for that test.

The VMTA Theory Test is a prerequisite for students entering VMTA District Auditions. Failure of the test disqualifies the student for that year. For information regarding level requirements, refer to the TMTF Yearbook's *VMTA Eastern District Auditions* page or the VMTA State Yearbook's *VMTA District Auditions* page.

There are certificates of participation for all students passing the test. Additional seals and blue ribbons are given for *Superior* (95-100), seals and red ribbons for *Excellent* (88-94), seals and green ribbons for *Very Good* (81-87), and seals for *Good* (75-80). Certificates only are given for *Passing* (70-74), and below 70 is *Not Pass*.

Teachers can purchase a hard copy of the VMTA Sample Theory Syllabus from Marilyn Forman, TMTF Theory Chairman. The VMTA Sample Theory Syllabus includes 12 levels of practice tests with corresponding answer keys, New Terms Glossary, and aural CD's for each level. The cost of the Sample Theory Syllabus including the aural CD's is \$21.00. The cost of the VMTA Sample Theory Syllabus **without the aural CD's** is \$18.00. VMTA Keyboard Skill Test

The VMTA Keyboard Skills Tests will be administered on Sunday, February 13, 2022 at Diehn Performing Arts Center, Old Dominion University, Norfolk.

The registration **deadline** is **January 10, 2022**. The Postmark date is the same as the deadline date. There will be no make-up dates. Once the scheduling has been done there will be no changes.

The Skills Tests emphasize technical development. These tests cover twelve levels of scales, chords, cadences and arpeggios to be performed at specific metronome markings. All material for the test must be memorized. All students who pass or score higher will receive a certificate of participation, with ribbons given for Superior, Excellent and Very Good. Students passing Level 12 will also receive a medal.

Students may enter the program at any level. They may take two levels a year up to Level 8, and may skip levels at the teacher's discretion, providing the test being skipped was not failed.

A syllabus is available from the state chairperson for \$10.00 or free download from VMTA website **www.virginiamta.org**. Information for Skills Tests for single line instruments is available in the syllabus.

The VMTA Helen Parker Sight Reading Tests will be administered with the VMTA Skills Tests on Sunday, February 13, 2022 at Diehn Performing Arts Center, Old Dominion University, Norfolk.

The registration **DEADLINE** is **January 10, 2022**. The POSTMARK date is the same as the DEADLINE date. There will be no make-up dates. Once the scheduling has been done there will be NO CHANGES.

Sight Reading Tests are a prerequisite for students entering the VMTA District Auditions. Teachers should check the Sight Reading Syllabus to be sure they are entering students at the correct level. The Sight Reading Syllabus is available from the State Chairperson for \$10.00 or free download from VMTA website **www.virginiamta.org**.

Sight Reading is an essential part of music education and should be encouraged for all students. The preparation involved in preparing for the test should be educational and rewarding for the students. A student sight reads at two levels below his/her performance level. Each student receives encouraging comments, suggestions for improvement and a certificate of participation. **Memorization is now OPTIONAL for one or both pieces. See Preparation Page for more details.***

PREPARATION FOR LEVELS OF PROGRESS

1. Select the date/dates (up to 3 dates) for your students to perform. **Complete registration form for those dates, collect fees, and make ONE check** payable to TMTF. Mail to Chairperson, Elizabeth Baker. Fees are non-refundable.
2. Each student will perform two pieces of contrasting style and appropriate to the playing level (Primer – 12). Playing levels are determined by the teacher. **MEMORIZATION IS OPTIONAL FOR ALL STUDENTS. Memorization is still highly encouraged but now optional for one or both pieces. MUST be noted on JUDGING SHEET (revised in 2020).** Students may enter in piano, voice, strings, guitar, harp, brass, woodwinds, percussion or ensembles.

Please note: Ensembles must include only students and scheduled as one entry.
Ensembles will be judged as a group and not as individual students.
Ensembles must provide two scores - one for themselves and one for the judge.
3. **Technique Requirement:** Students will play the scales and cadences of the pieces performed. The number of octaves of scales is determined by the teacher. Beginning students should play some form of technique – possibly pentachords (five-finger patterns) or scales in tetrachords for their pieces and simple chords. Technique for ensembles is optional. List prepared technique on the BACK of each student's judging sheet.
4. **The student must:**
 - a. **Bring music with EVERY measure numbered. Students will not be allowed to play if they do not bring their music.** They will be allowed to make up, either that same day (if time is available) or at a later date. (Note: At his/her discretion, a judge may allow the student to play if they did not bring their music, but the evaluation will reflect the fact that the judge did not have music to refer to.)
 - b. **JUDGING SHEETS were revised in 2020.** Bring current judging sheet with **ALL** information completed at the top of the page and technique listed on the back.
The judging sheet for PIANO SOLO is in the TMTF Activity Book. Judging sheets for all other categories will be mailed or emailed to the teachers who need them.
5. ****MUSIC FOR THE JUDGES:** Following MTNA guidelines - If the student **DOES NOT** memorize one or both pieces, the student will play from the original music and a photocopy of the music **MUST BE FURNISHED for the judge.** The judge will keep the photocopy, which will be destroyed following Levels of Progress. If the student **DOES** memorize one or both pieces, **the judge will use the ORIGINAL music for the memorized piece(s).** In this instance, a photocopy is not allowed (See exceptions below).
6. **Rules for photocopied music:** (This is different than music provided for a judge. See above for details.) A student will not be allowed to play any copied piece of music. (Exceptions below.) This rule is made by MTNA in the interest of professional ethics.
Exceptions:
 - a. Photocopied music downloaded from a computer website is permitted with proof of purchase.
 - b. When using out-of-print or an unpublished manuscript, the student must present written permission from the publisher or copyright holder to copy the music.
 - c. When using legally downloaded public domain music, the student must provide written proof of free public domain status.
7. **The following lengths of time (includes performance and judging time) are allotted each student:**
Primer Level thru Level 6: 10 minutes Level 7 thru Level 12: 15 minutes
8. If a registered student is absent at Levels of Progress, his/her teacher may arrange a make-up audition with another teacher. All make-up auditions should be completed and reported to Elizabeth Baker by March 30, 2022 to insure accurate records of participation. **Students entering the Honors Recitals Auditions must participate in Levels of Progress either on the audition date or on a makeup date by March 30 in order to be allowed to audition for Honors Recital.**

LEVELS OF PROGRESS 2022 REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. **REGISTRATION FORMS FOR 2022 MUST BE USED.** Please complete a separate registration form for EACH DATE (up to 3 different dates) and mail or email to Elizabeth Baker, Levels of Progress Chairperson. **Please type or print legibly using black ink.**
2. Write piano, voice, etc. after each student's name. If all are one instrument (Ex. Piano), just write this at the top of the page. Please indicate if an Ensemble is a duet, duo (requiring two pianos), or a quartet. If an ensemble involves other instruments, please list the instruments. Each ensemble should be listed as ONE entry.
3. Tape recorders/CD players/mp3 players, etc. are not permitted in the judging rooms, EXCEPT for voice or instrumental players who will be using recorded accompaniments. Live accompanists are encouraged whenever possible. Please indicate on the registration form whether the student will be using live or recorded accompaniment, or unaccompanied.
4. Repeats should be observed only for short passages of four to eight measures.
5. If you have students with special needs, please indicate this on the registration form. The judge will be informed.
6. Please note any scheduling needs in the comments area. For instance: siblings who need to be scheduled close together, early or late audition time needed, any special needs of the student. **THERE WILL BE NO CHANGES IN SCHEDULING AFTER THE SCHEDULES ARE MADE.** If a student cannot audition at his/her scheduled time, it will be up to the teacher to schedule a make-up audition with another qualified teacher.
7. Please indicate on the registration form which location you (the teacher) prefer to work or judge. Unless there are extreme extenuating circumstances, please request to judge at a DIFFERENT location than where your students will audition. **PLEASE REMEMBER THAT ALL TEACHERS ARE EXPECTED TO WORK/JUDGE IF THEY ENTER STUDENTS.** * See the TEACHER RESPONSIBILITY POLICY section below for more very important information concerning this requirement.
8. Please collect all fees in advance and send the registration forms with ONE PERSONAL CHECK payable to TMTF to the Levels of Progress Chairperson, Elizabeth Baker (see registration forms for contact and mailing information).

DEADLINE FOR POSTMARK: FRIDAY, JANUARY 14, 2022. Please remember that you may also email your registration forms by this same deadline and mail your check by this same deadline.

9. The scheduling of the students will be done by the Area Coordinators/Schedulers for each Levels of Progress location.
10. A completed copy of your registration form(s) with your personal Teacher Code and rooms and times listed and a copy of the Teacher Instructions will be mailed or emailed to each teacher early in February.
The current PIANO SOLO judging sheet revised in 2020) is found in this Activity Booklet. A copy of all other judging sheets (piano duo, voice, instruments, etc.) will either be mailed or emailed to the individual teachers who register students in these categories. **DO NOT COPY JUDGING SHEETS FROM PREVIOUS YEARS FOR YOUR STUDENTS!**
Each teacher should make one copy of the necessary judging sheet for each participating student and complete **ALL** information at the top of the judging sheet. Please remember to include your Teacher Code on each judging sheet. Instruct your students to bring their music with all measures numbered and their completed judging sheet to his/her Levels of Progress audition. Bring photocopies for the judge ONLY IF the student has not memorized one or both pieces and will be playing from the ORIGINAL music. APPLICATION FEE: \$12.00 (Payable to TMTF)

COMPLETING THE REGISTRATION FORM AND JUDGING SHEETS:

- **Levels for the Honors Recitals Auditions are determined solely by the difficulty of the repertoire being performed, not by age, school grade or length of study.** Factors to consider are the student's ability to meet the technical requirements, interpretive details, and tempo demands of the piece. A helpful source for level determination is *The Pianist's Guide to Standard Teaching and Performance Literature* by Jane McGrath. There is also a leveling guide, written by TMTF teachers, included in this Activity Book. Please use these leveling sources. **Repertoire level selections must be within one level of one of these guides.** If a piece is not listed, check the technical and interpretive requirements of the student's piece and find a comparable level with repertoire that is listed. **Both pieces being performed must be of equal difficulty in order to maintain equality within a level. In case of differing opinions, the Honors Recitals Auditions Committee will make final decisions.**

Complete 1 (one) computer generated or typed judging sheet for each student. For neatness and uniformity, please copy judging sheets that have typed and pasted information. When mailing, do not fold judging sheets. Please send them flat. Judging sheets for ensemble and instruments other than piano are available on the TMTF website.

Scheduling requests must be included with the registration sheet. Requests include needed time frame or a need to coordinate sibling times. **DO NOT REQUEST A PARTICULAR DAY.** Assignment of levels to Saturday or Sunday can only be determined after registrations are received. Specific levels will be on one day only. You will be informed of the day for each level as soon as possible in April.

IMPORTANT DETAILS:

1. Time limits for both pieces combined have been established for each level as follows:
Levels 4 & 5 – Limit of 5 minutes playing time.
Levels 6 & 7 – Limit of 7 minutes playing time.
Levels 8 & 9 – Limit of 10 minutes playing time.
Levels 10, 11, 12 – Limit of 12 minutes playing time.
2. Repertoire for solo categories must be from standard recital or performance literature originally written for the performing instrument. **Simplifications, arrangements of orchestral literature, and teaching pieces from method books are not acceptable.** A student may not repeat pieces used in a previous Honors Recitals Audition. If necessary, the Honors Recitals Chairman may change a student's level in order to maintain a consistent standard within the level. The teacher will be notified if this occurs.

3. All categories (voice and instrumental) must have at least three entries to be able to participate. If there are fewer than five students in a level, that level will be combined with an adjacent level to be considered as one level.
4. Performances are selected for participation in the Honors Recitals based on a percentage of the numerical scores in each level. Alternates will be named for each level. If a selected performer cannot be present at the Honors Recitals, the alternate in the level will be asked to perform if the Honors Recitals Chairman has enough notice.

REPERTOIRE: Be sure to follow the Repertoire Guidelines. Repertoire choices should be within one level of Jane McGrath's book or the TMTF repertoire leveling list. For more detail see "Completing the Registration Form." **Students are required to play two pieces of equal difficulty (see #2 above). These pieces must be the same as those listed on the judges' grading and registration sheets. Students who play repertoire other than what is listed on the grading sheets will be disqualified from consideration for the Honors Recitals. Solos must be memorized; ensembles (including piano ensembles) need not memorize their pieces. Voice students must provide their own accompanists. Each movement of a sonatina or sonata will be considered as one piece. Solo and duet levels may not be more than one level apart for a student entering both categories. Ensemble partners must be within two levels of each other.**

Students must bring one copy of the music, with measures numbered, to the auditions. **LEGALLY DOWNLOADED COPIES OR PHOTOCOPIES WILL BE ALLOWED ONLY IF A "COMPETITION RELEASE FORM" (SEE P. 64) IS COMPLETED AND ATTACHED TO THE REGISTRATION FORM. A "Proof of Purchase" of a downloaded copy or a publisher's "permission to copy" must be attached to the copy being used on the day of the auditions. The student should show the music and proof/permission to the Auditions Chairman on the day of the auditions.** Students with illegal photocopies or transcript copies will not be considered for the Honors Recitals. A student may not play if there is no music to give to the judges. This rule applies to ALL categories.

DRESS for the Honors Recitals Auditions should show respect for the occasion. Students should be aware that participation in the Honors Recitals Auditions and the Honors Recitals is an honor. Therefore, their attire should show the respect due an important event and not draw attention away from the performance. **Casual attire is not acceptable. Do not lose up to three points due to inappropriate dress.** The dress code is listed below with the possible point deductions.

Girls: Knee-length dresses or skirts and dress shoes. No slacks, mini-skirts or immodest tops. Shoes must be appropriate for pedaling with a back or wide strap to support the heel. Soles should be firm, able to support the foot.

Slacks/mini-skirt-- minus 1 point
Immodest top -- minus 1 point
Improper shoes -- minus 1 point

Boys: Dress pants, dress shirt and tie, dress shoes. No jeans, athletic/cargo pants or athletic/fabric shoes. Coats are optional.

Jeans, sport pants -- minus 1 point
No dress shirt or no tie -- minus 1 point
Athletic/fabric shoes -- minus 1 point

The Honors Recitals will be held on Sunday, May 15, 2022 (Time: TBA) in Chandler Recital Hall at ODU. Rehearsals will be Saturday, May 14, 2022 (Time: TBA).

REMEMBER: Each teacher must complete the Responsibility Form on the Registration Page for the registration to be accepted. Please be aware of the Responsibility Policy at the beginning of this Activity Book. There will be a \$75 Penalty Fee for failure to help.

Determining Repertoire Levels for TMTF Honors Recitals Auditions

Repertoire levels for the TMTF Honors Recitals Auditions are determined by **difficulty of repertoire** (technical and tempo demands as well as needed artistic and interpretive skills), **not by age or school grade**. Due to teacher inquiries and in order to achieve more equal repertoire selection within levels, a selected list of levels for frequently performed pieces is printed below. The list compares two sources: a survey of various TMTF teachers and Jane McGrath's Pianist's Guide to Standard Teaching and Performance Literature (Alfred, 1995). If a particular piece is not listed, a teacher should compare its level of difficulty with a piece on the list which is comparable in technical, tempo and interpretive requirements and determine the level. Performance pieces should be within one level of either of the sources below. All Beethoven, Haydn and Mozart sonata movements should be Level 7 or above.
