From Patterns to Possibilities: Teaching Creativity Across Genres

Dr. William Pearson is a teacher, composer, and organist. He is currently the Coordinator of Music Theory and Aural Skills at Old Dominion University and the Organist at Larchmont United Methodist Church. His compositional practice is split between writing experimental acoustic chamber music derived from handmade graphic scores, and film music derived from recorded improvisation and digital processing. Recent works include *The Amphibian*, which was toured throughout the US and Russia by The Fifth House Ensemble in collaboration with the Tuvan throat-singing ensemble Alash, and several film scores for Aeon Magazine. His academic research questions how notation, performance, and listening work together as a form of musical communication, and he folds those insights into hands-on lessons that help students hear, question, and shape music for themselves.

Workshop Description:

This workshop introduces participants to three often-overlooked music-theoretical tools—Neo-Riemannian harmonic analysis, syntactic/semantic lyric analysis, and groove theory—and shows how each can help students forge creative and interpretive links across genres and styles. Together we will turn these ideas into practical compositional, improvisational, and interpretive exercises, enabling students to see how theory informs practice and to discover fresh connections among all the music they make and hear.

About the program:

The Piano Recital for King's Grant Presbyterian Church will include two sonatas by Beethoven: the beloved Op. 13 "Pathetique" Sonata (a relatively early work) and one of his most forward-looking, late sonatas, the beautiful Op. 109.

In between the Beethoven sonatas will be the lyrical three "Petrarch Sonnets" by Franz Liszt, and a couple short works by modern women composers.

About the artist:

Steinway Artist Eric Ruple is on the piano faculty at James Madison University. He enjoys an active career as a solo and chamber musician, including several performances at the Kennedy Center in Washington, DC and Steinway Hall in New York. For a number of years, he was pianist for the Virginia Symphony Orchestra, including several "Harry Potter Live" shows and pianist for Bernstein's "Prelude, Fugue and Riffs" with the VSO Jazz Ensemble. His recording "Musica Incognito" with hornist Ian Zook has earned unanimously positive review from several national and international publications. A second CD with violinist Brendon Elliott, both in Virginia and on WQXR: National Public Radio, New York City.

He is a member of the American Liszt Society and has been a regular adjudicator in Hong Kong. He twice served as Interim Director for the JMU School of music.
