#### **Workshop description**

Dear Fellow Music Teachers.

I just finished reading the book When the World Stopped to Listen by Stuart Isacoff and I can heartily recommend that you read it. It is subtitled "Van Cliburn's Cold War Triumph and Its Aftermath." Even more interesting than the detailed description of the second Tchaikovsky International Piano Competition in Moscow in 1958 was learning what happened to all the competitors, most of all Van Cliburn. Many of you know that I was fortunate to attend the Van Cliburn International Piano Competition in Ft. Worth, Texas last summer. I've long been interested in this competition. The book asks the question, "what is Van Cliburn's legacy not only in the classical music world, but in the geopolitical landscape of the Cold War and beyond?"

Today, I ask, what is our legacy as music teachers? Are we working to make a living, fulfill a need for music education, win competitions? Or could we take the long view? I hope I'm infusing in my students the life-long love of music. The last thing I want to do is turn the student off and make them associate music education with feelings of anxiety and inadequacy. I realize that becoming a musician isn't for everyone, but living a life where music provides joy, pleasure, and fulfillment is a worthy goal.

TMTF, and by extension, VMTA and MTNA provide all the tools we need to become better music teachers. Let's take advantage of them. Come to our next TMTF monthly on January 20 for our **Teacher Round Table**. We will be discussing "Student Saver Pieces", led by Lynn Kleisler. Bring your favorite piano pieces and be inspired to inspire your students.
