I have extra handouts from the meeting that cover various aspects of the steps to this process. I also plan to make some copies of the Piano Teacher Profile Projects Handbook and the Piano Teacher Profile Projects Workbook too. I will have them set out at our next meeting for anyone who may be interested. The MTNA Certification Program was begun to improve the level of professionalism in the field of music teaching. For the teacher, it provides prestige, recognition and the potential for student recruitment and increased earning power. It also shows your students and community that

We have another great meeting coming up on March 8th with Dr. Kerry Carlin who is going to lead our Master Class. Dr. Carlin is "Professor Emeritus" at East Carolina University and is known for his very insightful pedagogical perspectives. Bio, Dr. Kerry Carlin, continued

Dr. Carlin studied at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, the Cleveland Institute of Music (BM), the Vienna Hochschule fur Musik, and Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music (MM, DME), where his piano teachers included Jorge Bolet, Gyorgy Sebok, Robert Goldsand, John Ogdon, Marion Hall, and Lili Krauss. He received the Certificate in Piano Pedagogy from The New School for Music Study in Princeton, NJ, where he studied under eminent piano pedagogues Frances Clark and Louise Goss, and has received Permanent Professional Certification from the Music Teachers National Association (MTNA).

As a researcher, Dr. Carlin has studied aspects of piano teacher effectiveness, piano teacher training, and trends in piano teaching. He has acted as presenter and panelist for the National Conference on Keyboard Pedagogy, the World Piano Pedagogy Conference, the Music Teachers National Association, and MTNA state affiliates. Dr. Carlin has been a contributor to Keyboard Companion (now Clavier Companion) and has authored for the European Piano Teachers Association. He has

performed solo and ensemble recitals in the US and Europe, including several years as pianist with the New England based Montage Trio. He currently serves as Immediate Past President of the North Carolina Music Teachers Association.

Dr. Carlin has taught at the New School for Music Study, Indiana University, Southeastern Massachusetts University (now the University of Massachusetts at Dartmouth), and is currently Professor Emeritus at the East Carolina University School of Music in Greenville, NC, where he taught for 34 years and served as Director of the Piano Pedagogy Program, the Group Piano Program, the ECU Summer Keyboard Camp, the ECU Young Artist Competition for Precollege Pianists, and several years as Chair of the Keyboard Department. During his time at East Carolina University, Dr. Carlin taught every course that the Piano Division of the Keyboard Department had to offer—such is the lot, or the pleasure, of being a piano pedagogue.

Dr. Carlin received the 2018 Teacher of the Year Award from the North Carolina Music Teachers Association (NCMTA) at their fall conference in October, 2018.
