## **President's Letter** October 2021

Dear Fellow Music Teachers.

I've been thinking about scams. And today, I'm sharing my

experiences with you to warn you to be careful.

Scam #1 - Have you heard about the free Yamaha grand piano? Yes, it's a scam. This scam has many variations. The email I received was from Chris Miche and went like this:

"Hello,

I have a Baby grand piano to give away to someone that can cherish and take good care of it. Please let me know if you would be interested or refer someone to me.

Regards,

Chris"

First red flag: Chris doesn't know my name. When I answered his email, he sent me photos and said his wife had died and wanted the piano to go to a good home. The problem was the piano was in Tennessee and would have to be shipped to Virginia.

This scam is all over the internet and has many variations. Some involve a widow who says her late husband wants the piano to go to a good home. These emails are targeting piano teachers. If you go for it, Chris will ask you to pay for shipping, up to \$1500, in cash. That's when you find out you're out the \$1500 and aren't getting the piano.

Scam #2 - I received a phone message which also sounded intriguing. The woman's voice said: "Hi, this is Joanie, from Thalia Elementary School and we're looking for music lessons to help out." First red flag: She mispronounced Thalia. And the phone number she left for a call-back had an 844 area code. Not legit - definitely a scam.

Just remember: If it seems too good to be true, it probably isn't true.

The guest artist for the conference is **Dr. Barbara Lister-Sink**, who is the Artistic Director of the School of Music and the Music Graduate Program at Salem College in North Carolina. She will be presenting three workshops, one of which will be on "The Bastien Family: A Tribute to Jane\_and Jim", one on "Bastien's New Traditions" and some of her family's music, and one on "Successful Piano Teaching in a Rapidly Changing World".

Dr. Barbara Lister–Sink's Concert will be on Friday evening, which will be preceded by the banquet. The Concerto Winner's/Commissioned Composer Concert is scheduled for Saturday evening. Both of these concerts will be held at William and Mary at Ewell Hall. There is still space for vendors at the conference and advertising in the Conference Program Book. ## Teachers,

The Tidewater Music Teachers Forum (TMTF) will administer the VMTA Theory Test on Saturday, January 29, 2022 at the Webb Center, Old Dominion University, Norfolk, Virginia.

\*Due to the pandemic and the present situation with the different virus variants, the location and date of this event might change. Look in the TMTF Stafflines each month for any changes to this VMTA Theory Event.

- ➢ 9:00 AM Levels 4 − 12
- Registration Deadline: Wednesday, December 22, 2021.
- Registration Fee: \$14.00/Student
- ▶ 10:30 AM Primer 3B
- Students can take only one test per year.

### The Registration Form and the Student Release Form\* are in the TMTF Activity Book.

\*Please make copies of the *Student Release Form* for your students to bring on the VMTA Theory Test day. Do not mail the *Student Release Forms* to the Theory Chairman.



There is a \$14.00 fee for taking the Theory Test. Teachers should include with the Registration Form one check, payable to TMTF, for his/her students, sent to the TMTF Theory Chairman, Marilyn Forman.

## Reminders:

Students can only take one test per year. Students may enter the program at any level or skip levels at the discretion of their teacher.
Students who previously failed a test can go to the next level provided the private teacher tests and approves the student to proceed.
An oral test can be given if requested.
Include this request on the Registration Form.

•The knowledge required for the Theory Test is cumulative, and may include questions based on materials required from previous levels. •There are no retakes for failures in the same year, and there are no make-ups for tests not taken. •Students who are absent the day of the Theory Test will receive a test but not receive VMTA credit for the test.


