

Are you going to the VMTA Conference this fall?!?

I hope the answer is "Yes!" If you are undecided or if you are leaning toward not going, I urge you to reconsider and decide on definitely attending this year. The conference is local, right here in Norfolk at ODU!

I have attended many conferences and I LOVE going!! I find them so beneficial for myself as an individual, as a music teacher, as a musician, and my studio benefits as well.

My top three reasons for attending conferences are:

- Hearing musical performances
- Professional development
- Making connections

For a very low registration fee, we are able to attend workshops and meet internationally known publishers, hear presenters from our own state and national organization, hear fantastic music from our own VMTA teachers, as well as internationally known musicians and our own students from Virginia who are competing in the state competitions.

Most of us in our profession do not get to talk with other adults on a regular basis, especially not with other music teachers because we are all working and teaching in our individual studios. Conferences are a great place to connect and share ideas with other music teachers and make great long-lasting friendships. Even at our local TMTF workshops and events, we are sometimes not able to stay and chat, but conferences are usually two and a half to three days long, providing plenty of time and opportunities to chat with other music teaching colleagues.

A couple of things you might be asking yourself:

Should I get a hotel room? I recommend yes. The conference schedule is a few full days; about 9:00 a.m. -10:00 p.m. For most of us, we normally are not used to having 10-12 hour days of networking, learning, teaching, etc. It will be fulfilling and exhausting. You will want to walk a few blocks away and rest at night, or if needed, during the day, rather than drive home. Also, on Saturday there will be a football game, so parking will be tricky, to say the least.

Is the cost worth it? Yes. For the reasons I mentioned above and much more. And remember, the expense is business-related.
