Studio Companion Instructions

This book is a combination of our previous “Activity Book” and “Yearbook” in order to consolidate information. The first section of this book contains membership information, rosters, program information, and the event calendar.

The second section of this book contains all of the instructions and applications for TMTF and VMTA activities for students. The cover page for each event contains the basic information, so you can decide which one meets the needs of your students. Events are arranged by deadline date. Please send the applications to the appropriate chairpersons by the DEADLINE dates. Call the chairperson if you have any questions. Please be sure to use this year’s applications.

Note the teacher responsibility statement for the following events: Sacred Music Festival, Levels of Progress, Honors Recitals Auditions, VMTA Theory, VMTA Sight Reading, and VMTA Skills. **ALL TEACHERS ARE EXPECTED TO ASSIST OR FIND AN APPROPRIATE REPLACEMENT WHEN THEY ENTER STUDENTS IN THESE EVENTS.** Please read the “Teacher Responsibility” which can be found in this book. Please photocopy the sheets in this book or download them from www.tmtf.org the judging sheets for the Sacred Music Festival, Levels of Progress, Glen Mayberry Scholarship, David Glover Scholarship, and Honors Recitals Auditions according to the number of students that you have participating in the event. Judging sheets will not be mailed to the teachers before the event. When the events are over, completed judging sheets and certificates will be available at the upcoming TMTF meeting or mailed to the teachers. Sheets will also need to be copied for the Student Recitals, Play-A-Thon and Achievement Award.

A recent addition to event procedures is the *Student Pickup Authorization Form*. This form will be used to have quick access to parent contact information in case of emergency during a TMTF or VMTA event, as well as clarify pickup procedures during events where the parent may not stay for the duration (such as the Theory exam). Each student should bring a filled-in copy along with any judging sheets/etc. to an event requiring this form.

This form is not required for events where the parent and child stay together, such as recitals. Events that do require this form will have such an indication under the title on each event’s information page.

Event chairpersons and area coordinators should ensure that all participating students arrive with a completed form. Students should present the form to the room monitor or judge (or whoever would be the first to respond in an emergency) for the duration of the event. Students can retrieve their form following the event and reuse it in the future.

TMTF Mission and Vision

The Tidewater Music Teachers Forum of Virginia was founded by David Carr Glover and other interested music teachers in October of 1964. There were 31 charter members.

The present membership is composed of music teachers who are currently or were formerly involved in music education, in the areas of piano, organ, voice, theory, composition, strings, woodwinds, brass, and percussion. These teachers are from the Tidewater Virginia area which includes Norfolk, Virginia Beach, Chesapeake, Portsmouth, Suffolk and the surrounding communities.

The mission of the Tidewater Music Teachers Forum is to provide an organization wherein teachers may assemble for the purpose of:

- Establishing a code of ethics and a professional standard of music teaching;
- Elevating the status of the music teacher in the community; and
- Sharing related problems and exploring current trends in music education.

The Tidewater Music Teachers Forum typically meets on the third Friday of the month, from September through May (with the exception of December). Members are notified of meeting places and times. The business meeting and program are held from 10:00 a.m. until 12 noon. *In this TMTF year, 2026-2027, the September, February, March, and April meeting will be on the second Friday of the month.

We have nationally known musicians present workshops at our meetings and events are scheduled throughout the year for student and teacher participation.

The Tidewater Music Teachers Forum is affiliated with the Virginia Music Teachers Association and the Music Teachers National Association. Members are encouraged to enter students in the various auditions and competitions sponsored annually by the Virginia Music Teachers Association and the Music Teachers National Association. The Tidewater Music Teachers Forum administers three scholarships. See the "Scholarships" pages for details

The Tidewater Music Teachers Forum is an effective and unique organization for teachers of all instruments in the communities it encompasses. If you are not a member at the present time, you are cordially invited to join the Tidewater Music Teachers Forum of Virginia and, through sharing ideas and knowledge, together we will grow as professional music teachers. If you do not wish to join but would like to enter students in our local programs, the fee for non-members to enter students is \$20.00 per student. This price is only applicable to local activities. Non-TMTF teachers must also be able to volunteer their time to judge in the events they enter their students in.

MTNA Code of Ethics

VISION AND VALUES

The mission of MTNA is to advance the value of music study and music making in society and to support the professionalism of music teachers.

The mission is accomplished by members who teach with competence, act with integrity, and volunteer services to MTNA programs, provide professional support for colleagues and communities, and comply with all laws and regulations that impact the music teaching profession.

The mission calls for an ethical commitment to students, to colleagues and to society.

CODE OF ETHICS

The principles and aspirations found in the Code of Ethics are not conditions of membership, but are goals and ideals that each TMTF member should strive to make an essential part of his or her professional commitment to students, to colleagues, and to society.

COMMITMENT TO STUDENTS – The teacher shall conduct the relationship with students and families in a professional manner.

- The teacher shall respect the personal integrity and privacy of students unless the law requires disclosure.
- The teacher shall clearly communicate the expectations of the studio.
- The teacher shall encourage, guide and develop the musical potential of each student.
- The teacher shall treat each student with dignity and respect, without discrimination of any kind.
- The teacher shall respect the student's right to obtain instruction from the teacher of his/her choice.

COMMITMENT TO COLLEAGUES – The teacher shall maintain a professional attitude and shall act with integrity in regard to colleagues in the profession.

- The teacher shall respect the reputation of colleagues and shall refrain from making false or malicious statements about colleagues.
- The teacher shall refrain from disclosing sensitive information about colleagues obtained in the course of professional service unless disclosure serves a compelling professional purpose or is required by law.
- The teacher shall participate in the student's change of teachers with as much communication as possible between parties, while being sensitive to the privacy rights of the student and families.

COMMITMENT TO SOCIETY – The teacher shall maintain the highest standard of professional conduct and personal integrity.

- The teacher shall accurately represent his/her professional qualifications.
- The teacher shall strive for continued growth in professional competencies.
- The teacher is encouraged to be a resource in the community.

Teacher Responsibility Policy For TMTF and VMTA Events

Each event page in the Tidewater Music Teachers Forum Studio Companion contain the following statement that a teacher must sign to indicate that he/she will assist on the day of the event:

Responsibility Policy: A participating teacher must assist on one day during the event or provide a substitute. If a teacher or his/her substitute does not help on the day of the event, the teacher must pay a \$75 penalty fee.

If this statement is not signed, the registration will not be accepted. Please note that the policy on the Registration form for the TMTF Play-A-Thon is slightly different.

If a teacher (or his/her substitute) fails to assist on the day of the event, the teacher must pay the \$75 fee. The teacher will not be able to participate in TMTF events for the remainder of the teaching year until the \$75 fee is paid.

In the case of illness or emergency on the day of the event, the teacher must notify the chairperson as soon as possible and try to find a substitute to assist in his/her place.

In the case of extenuating circumstances, the event chairperson will have the option to waive the above penalties and fees.

Weather Policy For TMTF and VMTA Events

If a TMTF meeting is scheduled and there is inclement weather, the meeting will be cancelled if the schools are closed. If a TMTF event is scheduled and there is inclement weather, check for an email from the President to confirm that the event is cancelled. The President and the Chairman of the event will make this decision.

It is the responsibility of the teacher to check his/her email when there is inclement weather. If you do not have email, or email access, contact another colleague or the Chairman of the event.

2025-2026 Event Reports

SACRED MUSIC FESTIVAL

The Sacred Music Festival took place on November 15, 2025 at two locations. 7 teachers participated in this event with 49 students registered and 46 student performers.

ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

One hundred seven students from 5 TMTF teachers were enrolled in the 2026-2027 Achievement Awards program. Twenty 2026 TMTF Achievement Awards will be presented to twenty students of TMTF teachers Susan Atkins, Donna Halleck, Mun Lee Han, and Josephine Jones.

STUDENT RECITALS

On November 23rd, 2025, 18 students entered by 4 TMTF teachers played a lively recital at Coastal Virginia Unitarian Universalist Church in Virginia Beach. On February 15th, 2026, 11 students performed, representing 2 TMTF teachers at Royster Memorial Presbyterian Church in Norfolk. A free will offering to benefit the David Carr Glover Scholarship fund was collected at both recitals.

TMTF PLAY-A-THON

Our 20th Anniversary of the TMTF Play-A-Thon was a great success this past December of 2025. The final amount of pledge money collected was \$5,479.00. There were 105 students representing 11 teachers who participated in this event. The students who won a monetary award for raising the most amount of pledge money for this event are all from Joan Edwards' studio. Thank you Joan for your hard work! They brought in \$500, \$400 and \$130 respectively. First place students were awarded \$100, second place \$75 and third place \$50. Congratulations and a special thank you to the teachers whose students raised over \$600. They are Joan Edwards (\$1,340), Susan Atkins (\$1,000), Josephine Jones (\$625), and Mary Ann Medlin (\$605).

VMTA THEORY TEST

The 2026 VMTA Theory Test took place on January 31, 2026. Thirteen teachers participated in the test this year with a total of 170 students registered and 168 students who took the test. Scores were as follows: **Superior** - 81; **Excellent**- 55; **Very Good**- 23; **Good**- 5; **Pass**- 3; **Not Pass**- 1, **Absent** - 2. Congratulations to 18 students and their teachers for achieving a 100% or more on this year's VMTA Theory Test!

VMTA KEYBOARD SKILLS TEST

In the 2026 Skills Test, there were 7 teachers participating, 104 students registered, and 95 test-takers. Scores were as follows: **Superior** - 75; **Excellent**- 16; **Very Good**- 3; **Good**- 1.

VMTA SIGHT READING FESTIVAL

In the 2026 Sight Reading Festival, there were 7 teachers participating, 64 students registered, and 60 test-takers. Scores were as follows: **Superior** - 36; **Excellent**- 17; **Very Good**- 13; **Good**- 0; **Pass**- 4; **Fail**- 0.

TMTF LEVELS OF PROGRESS

The 2026 Levels of Progress took place over the weekend of March 7th and 8th with 205 student performers.

TMTF DAVID CARR GLOVER SCHOLARSHIP

The Glover Scholarship Auditions were held on April 22, 2026 at Monumental United Methodist Church in Portsmouth. We had seven teachers enter students in the event this year. Twenty-eight students auditioned and fourteen won a monetary award within grades 5 through 8. These awards included a first place of \$400, a second place of \$350, and a third place of \$300, and honorable mention awards of \$200 in each school grade. A Joan Moore Memorial Award of \$100 was also given to an eighth grader. Teachers who had student winners this year include Susan Atkins, Laura Cardin, Joan Edwards, Susan Grice, Mun Lee Han, Mary Ann Medlin and Josephine Jones.

TMTF HONORS RECITAL AUDITIONS AND RECITAL

The 2026 TMTF Honors Recitals Auditions were held on April 25th and 26th, 2026. Fifty-seven students from ten TMTF teachers registered for this event. Fifty-six students auditioned.

She has also served as a board member with the Friends of Music at Salem College, Charlotte Music Club, Charlotte MTA, and she was founder/director of the Charlotte Music Career Fair. For 30 years, Diane has served as a UNCG Piano Camp faculty member. She holds national certification from MTNA, and she has served as an adjudicator for piano, violin, and composition competitions in both North and South Carolina. Her articles and eleven book reviews are published in the American Music Teacher national magazine.

Alfred Cortot: Teaching, Interpretation, and the Art of Piano Pedagogy

Biography: Pianist Zachary Deak has appeared in recital as a soloist and chamber musician in the United States, France, Morocco, Portugal, Moldova, and the United Kingdom. He has performed at venues including the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion in Los Angeles, the Cité de la Musique and Salle Cortot in Paris, the Casa da Música in Porto, and the Institut Français in Agadir, Morocco. Recent highlights include a performance of Liszt's Piano Concerto No. 2 with the ODU Symphony Orchestra; a performance at the Jimmy Carter Forum on U.S.–China Relations at the Carter Center in Atlanta; a lecture-recital on American pedagogical piano music at the University of Music and Performing Arts in Vienna; a performance of Peace for clarinet and piano by Jessie Montgomery at the Virginia Arts Festival; and chamber music appearances in the Masters in the Chapel concert series in Venice, CA, and the Henry J. Bruman Summer Chamber Music Festival at UCLA. Deak's work as a performer is closely connected to his research on piano pedagogy, interpretation, and cultural memory. His article "Pianistic Memorization as Cultural Memory: Insights from Religious and Devotional Traditions" was published in the *Journal of Piano Research* in 2026, and his essay "The Seventh Book: An Interdisciplinary Approach to Piano Study" appeared in the *EPTA Piano Journal*. He is currently conducting ongoing research at the Bibliothèque musicale La Grange-Fleuret in Paris through a Cr  dit Agricole d'  le-de-France Research Fellowship for his project "Revivre le cours: Alfred Cortot, archives p  dagogiques et transmission interpr  tative sur le Steinway 1907." Deak received the Hopkinson Silver Medal at the Chappell Medal Piano Competition in London and worked intensively with Maria Jo  o Pires in Paris and Brussels. A graduate of the   cole Normale de Musique de Paris and the Royal College of Music in London, he received his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Piano Performance from the University of Southern California. He currently serves as Assistant Professor of Piano and Musicology and Director of Keyboard Studies at Old Dominion University in Norfolk, Virginia.

Workshop Description: This workshop explores the teaching legacy of Alfred Cortot, one of the most influential pianist-pedagogues of the twentieth century. The session will introduce Cortot's career, his work at the   cole normale de musique de Paris, his public courses in interpretation, and his famous   ditions de travail of Chopin, Liszt, Schumann, and other composers. Drawing on recent archival research in Paris and Switzerland, Zachary Deak will examine Cortot's distinctive approach to piano teaching. Particular attention will be given to his technical exercises and preparatory studies, as well as to his broader ideas about interpretation, style, imagination, and musical character. The workshop will also consider Cortot's use of analysis, metaphor, literary imagery, and poetic language as tools for shaping musical understanding. Deak will also share insights from recent workshops in Paris that explored Cortot's teaching methods with students today. The session will consider what Cortot's ideas can still offer modern piano teachers and performers, especially in relation to technique, interpretation, imagination, and musical communication.

Biography: Dr. Leonidas Lagrimas, NCTM, serves as Associate Professor of Piano and Piano Pedagogy at Western Carolina University. His main duties include Applied Piano and coordinating the Class Piano program. An emerging leader in piano pedagogy research, Dr. Lagrimas has presented at local, state, regional, and national music conferences for College Music Society, MTNA, NCKP, and NafME. He serves on the editorial board of *American Music Teacher*, the official MTNA journal, and is Editor of the *North Carolina Music Teachers Association Journal*. Dr. Lagrimas has been published in *Piano Magazine*, the *MTNA E-Journal*, *American Music Teacher*, and the Francis Clark Center's online webinar series.

As a performer, Dr. Lagrimas is active throughout the country as a solo and collaborative pianist. Recent and upcoming performances include Guest Artist recitals at the University of Florida, University of Alabama, Appalachian State University, UNC-Greensboro, and numerous faculty recitals at WCU. Past collaborative piano highlights include performances with Grammy-winning soprano Hila Plitmann, country superstar Lorrie Morgan, and multiple Carnegie Hall appearances. Active as musical theatre pianist, conductor, and music director, his recent regional credits include *Next to Normal* and *The Sondheim Tribute Revue* at Waynesville's HART Theatre, *Rock of Ages* and *9 to 5: The Musical* for Theatre Tallahassee, *In the Heights* and *American Idiot* for New Stage Theatreworks, and *Little Shop of Horrors* for Starring Buffalo! at Shea's 710 Theatre.

Leonidas holds a Ph.D. in Music Education and Piano Pedagogy from Florida State University. In addition to his teaching at WCU, he maintains a private piano studio and serves as President of the Asheville Area Piano Forum and President of the Virtual Local Music Teachers Association of North Carolina (VLMTA-NC). His previous full-time faculty appointments include SUNY-Fredonia and Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College, and prior to his doctoral studies he taught music in the New York City public schools for ten years.

Biography: American pianist Carol Leone is active as a soloist and chamber musician, appearing throughout the United States, Europe and Asia. A successful recording artist, Leone can be heard on MSR Classics, Gasparo, Crystal, and Augusta Read Thomas labels. Her recording, “Change of Keys” on MSR Classics garnered two 2016 Silver Global Awards. Of this recording, Fanfare magazine stated, “Leone plays with drive and sparkle, and with plenty of wit.” Regarding Leone’s Mozart, Dallas Morning News wrote of her “luminous tone... she took us into another, quite magical world.” Dr. Leone is Chair of Piano Studies and Professor of Piano at Southern Methodist University’s Meadows School of the Arts in Dallas, Texas. Leone’s professional training included study with legendary Polish pianist Mieczysław Horszowski at the Curtis Institute of Music, where she received the Performance Certificate. She was a private student of Guido Agosti in Rome following study at the Accademia Chigiana in Siena, where she earned the coveted Honors Diploma. She ultimately earned her doctorate from the UNT College of Music. During her studies, Leone was successful in several national piano competitions, including being awarded first prize in the National Beethoven Sonata Piano competition. At SMU, she has performed frequently as concerto soloist with the Meadows Symphony Orchestra and as part of a faculty piano trio with violinist Aaron Boyd and cellist Andres Diaz. She has also performed regularly with the Grammy-nominated contemporary music ensemble Voices of Change. Over the course of her 40-year career as a university piano professor, Dr. Leone has mentored a diverse group of talented students. Many of these individuals have gone on to achieve significant success, including becoming recording artists, esteemed university professors, and influential leaders within the profession. Leone has recently served as a guest teacher or lecturer at schools such as The Juilliard School, Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, the State University of Music and Performing Arts in Stuttgart, Trinity Laban Conservatory in London, Shanghai Normal University, and several Italian conservatories. She has served on the music faculty of summer festivals in Moscow, Vienna, South Korea, the Czech Republic, and Italy, and is regularly on the summer piano faculty of the Accademia Chigiana in Siena, Italy. Considered one of the world’s leading advocates and presenters of pianos with narrower keyboards, Dr. Leone has energized a worldwide movement to transform pianists’ artistry and wellness. She is a co-founder of the global movement Pianists for Alternately Sized Keyboards and of the International Stretto Piano Festival and serves as a board member for the DS Standard Foundation.

Workshop Description: Having the opportunity to perform and teach on pianos with narrow keyboards for the last 25 years has been an incredible gift! To fearlessly approach any significant work in the repertoire, knowing that it is within your grasp and that you needn’t fear injury has been a dream come true for me and for my students with smaller hand spans. When one considers that 87% of adult females, 24% of adult males, and 100% of young children are musically and technically limited by a keyboard size that is too large for them, and that injuries continue at a wholly unacceptable rate, the only logical solution is to offer alternative standards! I’m excited to tell you more about acoustic pianos with narrower keys!

SACRED MUSIC FESTIVAL INSTRUCTIONS

The purpose of the Sacred Music Festival is to promote church music by teaching students to play sacred music in its various forms and to accompany congregational singing. This Festival is an evaluation, **not** a competition and is open to piano or solo instruments.

BASIC INFORMATION

1. Two sacred pieces (hymns, praise music, solos) are required at each level. Memorization is not required.
2. Selections should be of contrasting moods(example: praise, prayer, thanks, etc.) and one may be seasonal (Christmas, Easter, patriotic, etc.).
3. The student must be able to explain the following starting at Level 3 or higher:
 - a. Keys and key signatures
 - b. Time signatures (note values and pulse if no time signature)
 - c. Lead sheet Chords
4. The judging sheet will include questions similar to the following:
 - a. Is the tempo suitable for the piece?
 - b. Is the melody line easy to hear?
 - c. Did the student play confidently?
 - d. Was the pedal used correctly if applicable?
 - e. Did the phrasing reflect the words well?

COPYING CLAUSE

1. Students are not permitted to play from photocopied music. This rule is made by MTNA in the interest of professional ethics.
2. Digital music downloaded and printed from the internet is permitted with proof of purchase.
3. When using out-of-print or an unpublished manuscript, the student must present written permission from the publisher or copyright holder to copy the music.
4. When using legally downloaded public domain music, the student must provide written proof of free public domain status.

Judges will need a copy of the music. This may be an original OR a photocopy. The judge will keep the photocopy, and it will be destroyed following the event by the Festival Chairperson.

LITERATURE AND TECHNIQUE REQUIREMENTS

In levels Pre-Reading through 5, sacred literature in the form of method books may be used. Remember that words must be included for hymns meant to be sung, not solos such as preludes, offertories, etc. If they are not in the books, you can write them in.

Pre-Reading: Two sacred pieces from Pre-reading material.
No technique required.

Primer: Two sacred pieces from Primer level material.
No technique required.

Level 1: Two sacred pieces from Level 1 material.
No technique required.

Level 2: Choose from one of the following categories:
a. Two sacred pieces from Level 2 material.
b. One sacred piece from Level 2 material and one Lead Sheet.
Lead Sheet: Melody with single bass note OR open 5th in left hand.
No technique required.

Level 3: Choose from one of the following categories:
a. Two sacred pieces from Level 3 material.
b. One sacred piece from Level 3 material and one Lead Sheet.
Lead Sheet: Melody with blocked LH chords in root position or inversions.
Technique: Tonic chords, broken and/or blocked, hands together. Five finger patterns, hands together.

Level 4: Choose from one of the following categories:
a. Two sacred pieces from Level 4 material OR the easiest hymns from the hymn book or four part Praise and Worship book.
b. One sacred piece from Level 4 material and one Lead Sheet.
Lead Sheet: Melody with improvised LH (different left hand chord patterns, chord rhythms, distribute chords between the hands, etc.).
Technique: Plagal cadence (IV-I) in root position hands separate, or the “Amen” at the end of the hymn. One octave scales, hands separate or together.



Level 5: Choose from one of the following categories:
a. Two selections from a hymnal.
b. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a lead sheet.
c. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a sacred solo literature book.
Traditional:
a. Use a standard four part hymnal, praise book or sacred solo book of your choice.
b. Two verses are required for hymns and praise songs, phrasing with words and punctuation.
EXCEPTION: “Doxology” may be played at this level only, one time through.
c. Prepare an appropriate introduction of at least two measures.

- d. Pedal is optional.
- e. Selections should be in easier key signatures, simple rhythms, and minimal moving parts.

Lead Sheets:

- a. Use a standard lead sheet of your choice.
- b. Two verses of each selection are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- c. Prepare an appropriate introduction of at least two measures.
- d. Choose selections with easier key signatures, simple rhythms, and minimal moving parts.
- e. Students **MUST** play or sing the melody.
- f. Students should use block chords, root position, at each chord change. Inversions may be used if desired.

Technique: Plagal cadence (IV-I) in root position, hands together. One octave scales, hands together.

Note: *On cadences only, piano style is optional (left hand plays only the root).*

Level 6: Choose from one of the following categories:

- a. Two selections from a hymnal.
- b. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a lead sheet.
- c. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a sacred solo literature book

Traditional:

- a. Use a standard hymnal of your choice.
- b. Two verses of each hymn or praise song are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- c. Prepare an appropriate introduction of at least two measures.
- d. Choose hymns with more advanced key signatures (2 or more sharps or flats).
- e. **OPTIONAL:** The second verse may be played in an improvisational style. The melody must remain prominent. (Suggestions: Double the bass in the left hand, expand the right hand to include the tenor note, use broken chord accompaniment, eighth note patterns, etc.).

Lead Sheets:

- a. Use a standard lead sheet of your choice.
- b. Two verses are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- c. Prepare an appropriate introduction of a least two measures.
- d. Choose selections with easier key signatures, simple rhythms, and minimal moving parts.
- e. Students **MUST** play or sing the melody.

Technique: Plagal cadence in root position and inversions, hands separate (see example below). Two octave scales, hands separate. Two octave arpeggios, hands separate.

Note: *On cadences only, piano style is optional (left hand plays only the root).*



Level 7: Choose from one of the following categories:

- a. Two selections from a hymnal.
- b. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a lead sheet.
- c. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a sacred solo literature book.

Traditional:

- a. Use a standard hymnal of your choice.
- b. Two verses of each hymn are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- c. Prepare an appropriate introduction of at least two measures.
- d. Pedal is required.
- e. Choose hymns that are more challenging harmonically, rhythmically or technically.
- f. **OPTIONAL:** The second verse may be played in an improvisational style. The melody must remain prominent. (Suggestions: Double the bass in the left hand, expand the right hand to include the tenor note, use broken chord accompaniment, eighth note patterns, etc.). Remember that this is an accompaniment to congregational singing.

Lead Sheets:

- a. Use a standard lead sheet of your choice.
- b. Two verses of each selection are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- c. Prepare an appropriate introduction of at least two measures.
- d. Pedal is required.
- e. Choose hymns with more advanced key signatures and more advanced rhythms.
- f. Students **MUST** play or sing the melody.
- g. Students **MUST** play the song two times with a different style of accompaniment each time.

Technique: Plagal cadence in root position and inversions, hands together with pedal (see example at Level 6). Two octave scales, hands together. Two octave arpeggios, hands separate or together.

Note: *On cadences only, piano style is optional (left hand plays only the root).*

Level 8: Choose from one of the following categories:

- a. Two selections from a hymnal.
- b. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a lead sheet.
- c. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a sacred solo literature book.

Traditional:

- a. Use a standard hymnal of your choice.
- b. Two verses of each hymn are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.
- c. Prepare an appropriate introduction of at least two measures.
- d. Pedal is required.
- e. Choose hymns with more advanced key signatures and more advanced rhythms.
- f. **REQUIRED:** The second verse **MUST** be played in an improvisational style. The melody must remain prominent. (Suggestions: Double the bass in the left hand, expand the right hand to include the tenor note, use broken chord accompaniment, eighth note patterns, etc.). Remember that this is an accompaniment to congregational singing.

Lead Sheets:

- a. Use a standard lead sheet of your choice.
- b. Two verses of each selection are required, phrasing with words and punctuation.

- c. Prepare an appropriate introduction of at least two measures.
- d. Pedal is required.
- e. Choose hymns with more advanced key signatures and more advanced rhythms.
- f. Students MUST play or sing the melody.
- g. Students MUST play the song two times with a different style of accompaniment each time.

Technique: Plagal cadence in root position and inversions, hands together with pedal (see example at Level 6). Two octave scales, hands together. Two octave arpeggios, hands together.

Note: *On cadences only, piano style is optional (left hand plays only the root)*

Levels 9-12: Traditional:

- 1. Choose from one of the categories below plus one from number “2”:

 - a. Two selections from a hymnal.
 - b. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a lead sheet.
 - c. One selection from a hymnal and one selection from a sacred solo literature book.

- 2. One of the following options is required:

 - a. Transpose one hymn.
 - b. Prepare a published arrangement for an offertory or a prelude.
 - c. Sight-read one hymn.
 - d. Modulate from one hymn to the next.

Lead Sheets:

- a. Students must play the piece two times using different harmonization at least two times throughout and with a different style of accompaniment each time.
- b. The original piece as written must use at least four or more different chords.
- c. The student should use a varied presentation of the chord (broken, Alberti bass, register changes, rhythmic patterns).
- d. One of the following options is required:

 - i. Transpose one hymn.
 - ii. Prepare a published arrangement for an offertory or a prelude.
 - iii. Sight read one hymn.
 - iv. Modulate from one hymn to the next.

Technique: Plagal cadence in root position and inversions, hands together with pedal (see Example at Level 6) for prepared selections as listed in letter “a” in either the “Traditional” or “Lead Sheets” section above. Two octave scales, hands together. Two octave arpeggios, hands together.

STUDENT RECITAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. Student recitals are held two times during the year at three locations. These recitals are for students of all instruments, including voice.
2. Teachers may enter students at the location of their choice.
3. Any teacher may submit up to four program selections for each date. A teacher may, however, add two students as alternates in case there is enough room in the time frame of the recital.
4. No substitutions and no additions in students within one week prior to the recital. In addition, teachers will be limited to no more than 15 minutes of playing time for all of his/her students.
5. Each student plays one piece. No changes in repertoire within one week prior to the recital.
6. The same piece may not be performed twice by different students within the same recital. The first teacher submitting the piece will be accepted.

STUDENT RECITAL GUIDELINES

1. Students should bow and smile before and after each performance
2. Students should walk in a dignified manner when approaching and leaving the piano
3. Chewing gum will not be allowed
4. Students should not practice at the hall before the performance
5. Performers should remain for the entire recital and not leave after their performance
6. The suggested code for the recital is dresses or skirts for girls, dress slacks and dress shirts for boys. Everyone must wear appropriate shoes for pedaling.

PLAY-A-THON INSTRUCTIONS

The TMTF Play-A-Thon, which was started in 2006, is a fun-filled event where students help raise funds for our three scholarship programs by playing at a local mall. This event is loosely based on a very successful event held each year by the Lehigh Valley Chapter of the Pennsylvania Music Teachers Association. The goal in implementing this fund-raiser is to support our scholarship programs and to expand our community support and outreach. Cash prizes will be awarded to the students who raise the most money in pledges. Each student who participates will also receive a small award at the event for playing. **This event takes place in Greenbrier Mall in front of the Piano Showcase, who will be providing the pianos for us.**

PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

1. Participating teachers will receive a designated time slot on one of the three performance days for their students to play.
2. Students can play seasonal pieces, hymns, classical, duets, etc. as approved by their teacher. All instrumentalists and vocalists, from beginner to advanced, old and young, are invited to share their love of music by performing.
3. Students may perform on other instruments besides piano, and the teacher may play and help raise funds for the event by securing pledges (more below).
4. There is no requirement for pieces to be memorized. Students must perform from original music if their performance isn't memorized.

COPYING CLAUSE

1. Students are not permitted to play from photocopied music, per US federal copyright law (Title 17 of the US code). Penalties range from \$750 to 30,000 or more.
2. Digital music downloaded and printed from the internet is permitted with proof of purchase.
3. When using out-of-print or an unpublished manuscript, the student must present written permission from the publisher or copyright holder to copy the music.
4. When using legally downloaded public domain music, the student must provide written proof of free public domain status.

PLEDGES

1. To be eligible to perform, students must secure pledges from friends, family, and neighbors.
2. The minimum total pledge money to be collected **by each student is \$20, with a minimum of \$5 per each pledge.**
3. These minimums apply to each student performing, not how many pieces the student performs.
4. Teachers are asked to encourage students to raise more pledges than the minimum requirement. This is the only means of raising operating money for this event and securing money for our three scholarship programs.
5. The TMTF Receipt Form may be used for Play-A-Thon donors who request a written receipt for tax purposes.
6. Three students will be given a monetary award for bringing in the highest amount of pledge money. First place will be awarded \$100, second place will be awarded \$75 and third place will be awarded \$50.
7. The teacher must have the pledges from their students to the chairperson by **January 31st, 2027** to be considered for a monetary award. Otherwise, all pledge money should be turned in to the chairman by **March 1st, 2027** to participate in the David Carr Glover Scholarship Auditions, the Glen Mayberry Scholarship Auditions, or to receive money from the Louise Garrow Memorial Fund for District Auditions winners.

Tidewater Music Teachers Forum Twentieth Annual Play-A-Thon Teacher Guidelines

1. Student Registration Letter

- Make one copy per student and distribute.
- Have the parents clip and return the filled in bottom section to you before **November 13th, 2026**.
- Use these completed forms to fill in your **“Studio Schedule and Pledge Validation Form”**.

2. Teacher Registration Sheet

- This should be completed after the students have pledged to participate with the slips from the **“Student Registration Letter”**.
- The **“Teacher Registration Form”** should be sent to the chairman, Lynn Kleisler, and your time block and day will be assigned and returned to you. The registration deadline is **November 13th, 2026**.

3. Studio Schedule and Pledge Validation Form

- This form is provided to help you keep track of the students who have registered to perform from your studio. It will also be used at the Play-A-Thon to log the students’ pledges.
- Fill in your name, day and time your studio will be performing.
- List each participant’s name and the amount of time they will play. If a student is unable to perform during your scheduled time, you may call other participating teachers and ask if your student may play during their time.
- Once you have all of your students listed, **make an extra copy of this form. Bring one copy with you to the Play-A-Thon.** It will be your log sheet for your students’ pledges.
- Keep the other copy at your studio and use it to track the students who have returned their pledges to you.
- When all pledges are collected, the form should be filled out and sent to the chairman along with the pledge checks.

4. The Pledge Sheet

- You will need to make a copy for each one of your students and give to them **two months** prior to the event to ensure there is time for the students to collect pledges.
- Complete each form with the student’s and teacher’s name. When your registration sheet has been returned to you, fill in the day and time of your studio performance on the student’s Pledge Sheet.
- Have the students complete their form as they collect pledges.
- Students are to bring the **“Pledge Sheets”** to the mall and present them to their teacher. They will be recorded, validated and returned to the student there. **Please instruct your students to not bring any money to the mall.**
- Do not send these forms to the chairman.

5. Parent Information Letter

- This has been provided for you to either give to your parents or to serve as a guideline for a letter you may want to create yourself.

6. Letter to Secure Pledges

- A letter has been included to help students when trying to secure pledges. This could either be used or serve as a template for a letter you may want to create for your students.

7. The Money

- After the Play-A-Thon, collect the pledge sheets and the funds from your students. Be sure to record them on your **“Studio Schedule and Pledge Validation Form”**. A TMTF Receipt Form has been included in this book for donors who want a receipt as we are a tax exempt organization.
- Please note: The pledge sheets **should not be sent** to the chairman.
- The checks should be made **payable to TMTF** from the donors.
- Deposit all the cash funds into your account and write one check payable to TMTF for the cash collected. **Please send a copy of your “Studio Pledge and Validation Form” and the check(s) to the chairman, Lynn Kleisler no later than March 1. Cash cannot be accepted. For students to be eligible for one of the TMTF monetary awards, the chairman must receive the pledge money by January 31st .**
- Please **do not send the Pledge Sheets from the students to the chairman**. Only the **“Studio Schedule and Pledge Validation Form”** should accompany the pledge money.

8. Some Suggestions and Reminders

- Create your own cover letter to give to your parents expressing your personal support for the fundraiser and the importance of this event for the continued endurance of the TMTF scholarship programs and events. Please let parents know that pledges made are tax deductible as we are a nonprofit organization.
- It is important and imperative to give your students the pledge sheet prior to the event so that they have time to collect pledges before the Play-A-Thon, not the day of the event. Two months are suggested so that they will have time to collect more than the minimum. There are many expenses that have to be paid for this event.
- **Students may not use copied music at the event as is the case in any other event we sponsor. It is unlawful per Chapter 5 of the U.S. Copyright Law. Businesses, organizations and persons found guilty of music copyright infringement can be fined from \$750 to \$30,000 per work. Remember, we are a professional organization.**
- Remind your students that to be eligible to win one of the grand prizes, they need to collect their pledges and turn them into you before the due date of **January 31, 2027**. This will enable you to send the pledge money to the chairman by the deadline date. The winner’s pledge total must at least be equal to the prize money to be awarded. Each student who performs will receive a small token award at the event. Pledges can still be received after the due date, but must be turned in by **March 1st** for a teacher’s studio to participate in the **D. C. Glover and Glen Mayberry Scholarship Auditions**. This is also a requirement for a **District Audition Winner** to receive money from the Louise Garrow Memorial Scholarship fund. This money is awarded to our first place winners to help cover some of the costs of competing at the VMTA State Conference.

Tidewater Music Teachers Forum – Twenty-First Annual Play-A-Thon Parent Information Letter

The TMTF Play-A-Thon is a fund-raiser used to support the three Tidewater Music Teachers Forum Scholarship Funds. Traditionally, scholarships have been provided to students in need of aid for their music studies or those pursuing a music degree in college.

This is the twenty-first year for our Play-A-Thon. Our goal in implementing this fund raiser is to support our scholarship programs, to expand our community support, and to provide another opportunity for students to perform in a fun environment.

The Play-A-Thon will be held at Greenbrier Mall on December 4th, 5th, and 6th. All students are invited, instrumentalists and vocalists, from beginners to advanced, old and young, to share their love of music by performing classical, seasonal, hymns or popular music. Ensemble playing is also encouraged. Each teacher will be given a time frame on either Friday, Saturday or Sunday in which his/her students will play. Please remember that participants should dress appropriately for performance with sensible shoes for pedaling and/or for singing.

To be eligible for participation, students are asked to secure pledges from family, friends and neighbors and list them on the attached pledge sheet. After students perform at the mall, they are asked to collect their pledges and return the proceeds later to their teacher. To help cover TMTF's operating cost for this event, **we are requiring a minimum pledge of \$5 for each person pledging and ask that each student get at least four pledges or a minimum total of \$20.** This is the only means of raising important operating funds. Please encourage your donors to be generous. Your teacher can give you a copy of a letter to use to help secure pledges.

Each student will receive a "thank you" prize at the event. Keep in mind that there will also be monetary prizes awarded to the top three students who collect the most money. The first place award is \$100, second place \$75, and third place \$50. To be eligible for these awards, your teacher will have to send the pledge money to the chairman by January 31st.

Students may begin collecting pledges as soon as they have an official pledge sheet, which is available from their teacher. **Each student needs to bring his or her pledge sheet with him to the mall to be validated and recorded. Please do not bring any money to the mall. Instead, return the collected pledges to your teacher at a later lesson.** Thank you so much for helping to make the TMTF Play-A-Thon a success!!

REGISTRATION

- Mail the Registration Application with a check to Susan Atkins before the deadline.
- Please make one check, payable to TMTF, for all your students' registration fees, and mail this along with the application to Susan Atkins.
- Students can only take one test per year.
- Students who previously failed a test may go on to the next level, provided the private teacher tests and approves the student to proceed.
- Students may skip levels at the discretion of their teacher. The knowledge required for the theory tests is cumulative, and tests may include questions based on materials from previous levels.
- The updated VMTA Theory Test Syllabus can be found on the VMTA Website along with the updated Sample Tests, Keys and Audio Files for Levels P-12. Please contact Susan Atkins if you need help finding these resources or printing them/downloading mp3 files.

TESTING PROCEDURES

- On the day of the exam, students must bring two pencils and their *Student Pick-up Authorization Form*.
- Each student must have a *Student Pick-up Form*. Do not combine siblings on one form.
- The exam takes place in the cafeteria at the Webb Center. Please arrive early and wait in the lounge across from the cafeteria. About 15 minutes before the test begins, students will be called by level to enter the cafeteria and sit at their assigned table. Then, the students will hand their release form to the teacher monitor at their table.
- Registered students that are absent from the exam will receive their tests later with no credit given.
- Certificates of participation are given to students passing the test. Additional seals and blue ribbons are given for *Superior* (95-100), seals and red ribbons for *Excellent* (88-94), seals and green ribbons for *Very Good* (81-87), and seals for *Good* (75-80). Certificates only are given for *Passing* (70-74), and below 70 is *Not Passed*.

SKILLS TEST INSTRUCTIONS

1. The Skills Tests emphasize technical development. These tests cover twelve levels of scales, chords, cadences and arpeggios to be performed at specific metronome markings. All material for the test must be memorized.
2. The Skills Test Syllabus is available and should be consulted by the teacher to determine each student's level. A paper copy may be ordered from the State Chairperson for \$10, or may be downloaded for free from the VMTA website: (<https://vmta-music.org/member-area/>)
3. Students may enter the program at any level. They may take two levels a year up to Level 8, and may skip levels at the teacher's discretion, providing the test being skipped was not failed previously.
4. Registration forms are accepted both by-mail and electronically. The postmark date is the same as the deadline, listed on the cover page for this event. Send the completed application to the chairperson.
5. Registration fees should be paid in one check from the teacher to the local chairperson. The check should be payable to "TMTF".
6. No changes to the schedule will be made after scheduling is complete, and there are no make-up dates.

LEVELS OF PROGRESS INSTRUCTIONS

Levels of Progress is a non-competitive opportunity for students of all levels to receive a performance evaluation on two contrasting pieces. Students may enter in piano, voice, organ, strings, guitar, or ensembles. Each student receives an evaluation sheet and a certificate of achievement. Judges are local teachers and members of TMTF.

Levels of Progress is also TMTF's major fundraising event for the year, so please encourage and prepare your students to participate! This allows us to continue to provide quality presenters for our meetings and additional opportunities for our teachers and students.

EVENT REQUIREMENTS

1. **PERFORMANCE:** Students will prepare two contrasting pieces to perform for a judge, who will provide encouraging and detailed feedback. All playing levels are accepted. The "playing level" required on the registration form is to be determined by the teacher. Memorization is optional for both pieces, but highly encouraged!
2. **TECHNIQUE:** Students performing solo must present technical skills in the key of each piece performed. Typically, this will be scales (number of octaves determined by teacher) and cadences. Beginning students may play what they are able to, such as pentachords (five-finger scales), scales, tetrachords, or triads. Prepared technique should be listed on the back of the evaluation sheet. Technique is not required for ensembles.

REGISTRATION

1. **REGISTRATION FORM:** The current registration form, found in this booklet, must be used. Please do not reuse forms from previous years. If you wish to send your students to more than one location or date, a separate form must be used for each location and date. Be sure to indicate any student scheduling needs on the form (e.g. "only available after 11AM", siblings that should receive adjacent performance times, etc.)
2. **REGISTRATION FEE:** Please collect all fees in advance and send the registration forms with one personal check to the Levels of Progress Chairperson. Make checks payable to TMTF. Payments are also accepted over Venmo to the TMTF account (@TMTF1964)
3. **SUBMISSION:** Submissions of registration forms and payments are accepted by mail or virtually. All mail should be sent to the Event Chair (see above for address); virtual forms may be emailed to the Event Chair and payments sent via Venmo. Please observe the postmark deadline on the cover page for this event.
4. **INSTRUMENT:** Be sure to indicate the instrument (piano, voice, etc.) for each student. For ensembles, please indicate whether it is a duet, duo (requiring two pianos), a quartet, or is involving other instruments besides piano. Ensembles should be listed as ONE entry.
5. **STUDENT NEEDS:** If you have a student with special needs or requires other accommodations, please indicate this on the registration form. The judge will be informed.
6. **TEACHER RESPONSIBILITY:** All teachers are expected to judge or assist with this event if they enter students. Please indicate on the registration form which location you (the teacher) prefer to work or judge. Unless there are extenuating circumstances, please request to judge at a DIFFERENT location than your students.

***If you are unable to fulfill your judging assignment, you must find your own replacement who is able to judge at your same level. A non-TMTF teacher may be allowed to serve as a substitute judge, but must be approved by the Levels of Progress Chairperson. Contact the LOP Chairperson and the Area Coordinator of the judging location to inform them of your absence and replacement's name.

EVENT PROCEDURES

1. **SCHEDULING:** Before the event, you will receive your student's performance schedule for each location, along with detailed teacher instructions. Every effort will be made to create a schedule to accommodate everyone, however, **there will be no changes in the schedule after they are delivered to teachers.**
2. **MAKE-UP EXAMS:** If a student cannot audition at his/her scheduled time, it is the teacher's responsibility to schedule a make-up audition with another qualified teacher. You must notify the Event Chair of the make-up exam no later than March 30th, following the event.
3. **EVALUATION SHEET:** You will also be provided this year's evaluation sheet. If you have non-piano students or ensembles entered, be sure that they are given the corresponding evaluation sheet. Evaluation sheets must be filled in by the teacher with all performance information on the front of the document and prepared technique listed on the back. Be sure to include your teacher code! (see below)
4. **TEACHER CODE:** Take note of your unique teacher code, which can be found on your student's schedule. You will have a different code for each day and location that your students perform. **You must write your teacher code on each student's evaluation sheet to ensure that it is returned to the correct teacher!**
5. **STUDENT MATERIALS:** Students must bring the following to their performance time:
 - a. Evaluation sheet with all information filled in.
 - b. All **original** music with every measure numbered.
 - c. Photocopies are only permitted if the student is not playing from memory, in which case, the student performs with the original, and the judge references the copy. The photocopies will be destroyed following the event.

COPYING CLAUSE

1. Students are not permitted to play from photocopied music. This rule is made by MTNA in the interest of professional ethics.
 2. Digital music downloaded and printed from the internet is permitted with proof of purchase.
 3. When using out-of-print or an unpublished manuscript, the student must present written permission from the publisher or copyright holder to copy the music.
 4. When using legally downloaded public domain music, the student must provide written proof of free public domain status.
6. **FOLLOWING THE EVENT:** You will receive your students evaluation forms, completed with judges comments, via mail following the event. Please celebrate your students' accomplishments and deliver the provided certificates! If your students were absent from the event, the Event Chair will be in contact to confirm make-up exams.

DAVID CARR GLOVER SCHOLARSHIP INSTRUCTIONS

In October 1988, TMTF established a piano scholarship in memory of its founder, David Carr Glover. The Forum voted to offer an opportunity for students in school grades five through eight to apply for financial assistance with their music education. This scholarship is intended for students who exhibit financial and/or motivational needs to help with their music education. **The award can be used for a music camp, purchase of music, tickets to concerts, opportunities for special study, lessons, etc.**

Money for the Piano Scholarship Fund comes from memorial donations, special gifts, a free will offering taken at the TMTF Student Recitals and money raised from the TMTF Play-A-Thon. Amounts of the awards are determined yearly by the income in the account and the number of students participating. Students are awarded according to their performance at the Auditions and their stated intended use of the award.

ELIGIBILITY

- The student must be enrolled in grades five through eight at the time of the auditions.
- **PLEASE NOTE: A teacher's studio participation is required in the Play-A-Thon for the same school year in order to enroll students. The teacher must also be a member in good standing of TMTF.**
- Students who receive the top award in their school grade are **not** eligible to compete the following year.
- If a student is of a caliber to play in the Eastern District Auditions, they are **not** an **average student** and will **not** be considered eligible.

PERFORMANCE

- Students will perform for 2 judges selected by the committee.
- Two memorized solo piano pieces of contrasting styles are required, **one of which must be by David Carr Glover, with every measure numbered.**
- Scales and cadences ARE NOT required.
- **Please note: Each student must bring a hard copy of their own music they are performing that day or they will be disqualified. No Photocopied music is allowed. They may not share their book with another student the day of the audition as it holds up the scheduled running on time and causes confusion.**
- Changes in repertoire will not be permitted after **March 18th**, and then only by written notice received by email, or the student will be disqualified.

APPLICATION

- **The current year's application** must be used and are only accepted by mail. Submissions are not accepted by email.
- Please make sure that the "Student's Intended Use of Funds" and the "Teacher Recommendation" are separate sheets of paper and not copied on the back of the application form.
- **Two typed judging sheets** are required for each student's application. The only information that should be included on the judging sheets are the student's school grade, title of pieces and composers.
- The two sheets of application should be **stapled together**, and then **paper clipped** to the judging sheets for each student. The judging sheets **SHOULD NOT be stapled** in any way.
- The application and judging sheets should **not be folded**. Place them in an 8 ½ x 11 envelope that is sturdy enough to be mailed.
- Depending on the number of participants, teachers may be asked to limit the number of students per school grade. Teachers should note on the application the level of performance, the length of playing time, and if siblings are participating. **Be sure to notate siblings on the application form with a post-it** so that they will be scheduled in the same time frame. This is essential for scheduling.
- Teachers will be notified of their students' scheduled times via mail.

HONORS RECITALS AUDITIONS INSTRUCTIONS

The Tidewater Music Teachers Forum Honors Auditions and Honors Recitals are performance opportunities for students who strive for excellence and who have a desire to compete. All teachers are encouraged to have their students participate. Honors Recitals Auditions are for students in Levels 4 through 12 and include categories of piano, piano ensemble, voice and instruments. In the Honors Recitals Auditions students are grouped according to repertoire level, not age, school grade or length of study. Any instrument, including voice, must have at least 3 entries to participate.

Each performance receives a numerical score averaged from the scores of two judges. From these scores in each level, a percentage will qualify to perform in the Honors Recitals. This percentage may vary each year depending upon the total number of entrants in the auditions. From the two audition pieces, judges will select the piece to be performed in the Honors Recitals. A certificate will be awarded to each student who performs in the Honors Recitals.

AUDITION QUALIFICATIONS

- Students should perform two contrasting pieces for a panel of judges. They will receive comments from each judge, and their score will determine whether they are qualified for the Honors Recital.
 - *Note: Piano solo entries are required to perform from memory. Ensembles may perform with their music. Vocalists must provide their own accompanist.*
- Students participating in the Honors Recital Auditions must have completed Levels of Progress in the same year.
- Playing Levels 4 and up are required to audition. Levels are determined solely by the difficulty of the repertoire being performed, not by age, school grade, or length of study. Factors to consider are the student's ability to meet the technical requirements, interpretive details, and tempo demands of the piece. A helpful source for level determination is *The Pianist's Guide to Standard Teaching and Performance Literature* by Jane McGrath.
- There is also a leveling guide, written by TMTF teachers, included in this book. Please use these leveling sources. Repertoire level must be within one level of these guides. If a piece is not listed, check the technical and interpretive requirements of the student's piece and find a comparable level with repertoire that is listed.
- Both pieces being performed must be of equal difficulty in order to maintain equality within a level. In case of differing opinions, the Honors Recitals Auditions Committee will make final decisions.
 - *Note: Each movement of a Sonata or Sonatina will be considered as one piece.*
 - *Note: Solo and duet levels may not be more than one level apart for a student entering both categories.*
 - *Note: Ensemble partners must be within two levels of each other.*
- Repertoire for solo categories must be from standard recital or performance literature originally written for the performing instrument. Simplifications, arrangements of orchestral literature, and teaching pieces from method books are not acceptable. A student may not repeat pieces used in a previous Honors Recitals Audition. If necessary, the Honors Recitals Chairperson may change a student's level in order to maintain a consistent standard within the level. The teacher will be notified if this occurs.

AUDITION REGISTRATION

- The deadline on the cover sheet is the postmark deadline.
- Submit one check for your students' registration fees, made out to TMTF, to the Auditions Chairperson along with your application.
- Complete 1 (one) computer generated or typed judging sheet for each student. For neatness and uniformity, please copy judging sheets that have typed and pasted information. When mailing, do not fold judging sheets. Please send them flat.
- Judging sheets for ensembles and instruments other than piano are available on the TMTF website.
- Scheduling requests must be included with the registration sheet. Requests include needed time frame or a need to coordinate sibling times. **DO NOT REQUEST A PARTICULAR DAY.** Assignment of levels to Saturday or Sunday can only be determined after registrations are received. Specific levels will be on one day only. You will be informed of the day for each level as soon as possible in April.
- Time limits for both pieces combined have been established for each level as follows:
 - Levels 4 and 5: Limit 5 minutes playing time
 - Levels 6 and 7: Limit 7 minutes playing time
 - Levels 8 and 9: Limit 10 minutes playing time
 - Levels 10, 11, and 12: Limit 12 minutes playing time
- **Changes in repertoire are permitted up until two weeks before the audition date. Send 1 new flat (not folded) grading sheet to the Auditions Chairperson at least two weeks (postmarked) in advance.**

AUDITION PROCEDURES

- **Students must perform the same pieces as listed on their judging sheets in order to be considered for the Honors Recitals.**
- Students must bring one copy of their music, with each measure numbered, to the auditions.
- **LEGALLY DOWNLOADED COPIES OR PHOTOCOPIES ONLY IF A "COMPETITION RELEASE FORM" IS COMPLETED AND ATTACHED TO THE REGISTRATION FORM.**
- **A "Proof of Purchase" of a downloaded copy or a publisher's "permission to copy" must be attached to the copy being used on the day of the auditions. The student should show the music and proof/permission to the Auditions Chairperson on the day of the Auditions. Students with illegal photocopies or transcript copies will not be considered for the Honors Recitals.**
- A student may not play if there is no music to give to the judges. This rule applies to ALL categories.
- After the auditions, students and teachers will be notified if the performer qualifies for the Honors Recital.

DRESS CODE

- Dress for the Honors Recitals Auditions should show respect for the occasion. Casual attire is not acceptable. Do not lose a point due to inappropriate dress!
 - Girls: Knee-length dresses, skirts or dress pants and dress blouses, dress shoes. No jeans, mini-skirts or immodest tops. Dress shoes must be appropriate for pedaling with a back or strap to support the heel and firm soles to support the foot. No boots.
 - Boys: Dress pants, dress shirt and tie, dress shoes. No jeans, athletic/cargo pants, boots, or athletic/fabric shoes. Coats are optional.

DETERMINING REPERTOIRE LEVELS FOR TMTF HONORS RECITALS AUDITIONS

Repertoire levels for the TMTF Honors Recitals Auditions are determined by **difficulty of repertoire** (technical and tempo demands as well as needed artistic and interpretive skills), **not by age or school grade**. Due to teacher inquiries and in order to achieve more equal repertoire selection within levels, a selected list of levels for frequently performed pieces is printed below. The list compares two sources: a survey of various TMTF teachers and Jane McGrath's *Pianists' Guide to Standard Teaching and Performance Literature* (Alfred, 1995). If a particular piece is not listed, a teacher should compare its level of difficulty with a piece on the list which is comparable in technical, tempo and interpretive requirements to determine the level. Performance pieces should be within one level of either of the sources below. All Beethoven, Haydn, and Mozart sonata movements should be Level 7 or Above.

The LOUISE GARROW MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND was established in 1975 through the generosity of her nephew who wished to perpetuate the musical influence of this charter member of the Tidewater Music Teachers Forum. The establishment of the award continues the ideas of Louise Garrow, a dedicated teacher and prolific composer of piano teaching materials.

From 1975 to 1985, \$300.00 of the interest accrued on the \$5,000 in the Garrow Fund was awarded annually at the MTNA National Convention to the Music Teachers National Association High School Piano Auditions winner. From 1986 to 2011, the Tidewater Music Teachers Forum awarded the Louise Garrow Memorial Scholarship to the Virginia winner of the MTNA Senior Piano Competition. Beginning in 2012, TMTF voted to award money from the Louise Garrow Scholarship to the Eastern District competition winners and/or alternates who are also students of TMTF members to help them with their competition expenses.

Guidelines for Educational Uses of Music

The following guidelines were developed and approved in April 1976 by the Music Publishers' Association of the United States, Inc., the National Music Publishers' Association, Inc., the Music Teachers National Association, the Music Educators National Conference, the National Association of Schools of Music, and the Ad Hoc Committee on Copyright Law Revision.

The purpose of the following guidelines is to state the minimum and not the maximum standards of educational fair use under Section 107 of HT 2223. The parties agree that the conditions determining the extent of permissible copying for educational purposes may change in the future; that certain types of copying permitted under these guidelines may not be permissible in the future, and conversely that in the future other types of copying not permitted under these guidelines may be permissible under revised guidelines.

Moreover, the following statement of guidelines is not intended to limit the types of copying permitted under the standards of fair use under judicial decision and which are stated in Section 107 of the Copyright Revision Bill. There may be instances in which copying which does not fall within the guidelines stated below may nonetheless be permitted under the criteria of fair use.

TMTF Constitution and By-Laws

(Adopted January 1, 2001)

Article I – NAME

The name of this organization shall be Tidewater Music Teachers Forum (the "Forum"), a Virginia unincorporated voluntary trade association. The Forum is and shall be affiliated with Music Teachers National Association, Inc. ("MTNA"), an Ohio charitable, nonprofit corporation, organized in accordance with Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Article II – OBJECT

- A. The purpose of the Forum is to organize and assemble music teachers throughout the chapter area and to:
 - 1. Share related problems and current trends in music education,
 - 2. Establish music teaching ethics and standards, and
 - 3. Cooperate with state and national associations with which this Forum is affiliated.
- B. The forum is organized exclusively for charitable, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
- C. No part of the Forum's net earning shall insure to the benefit of, or be distributable to the Forum's members, trustees, officers, or other private persons. However, the Forum shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in this Article.
- D. No substantial part of the activities of the Forum shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Forum shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to, any candidate for public office.
- E. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Constitution, the Forum shall refrain from engaging in any activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
- F. In the event of the dissolution of the Forum and after payment of all outstanding debts, any funds remaining in the treasury shall be contributed to another 501(c)(3) nonprofit, charitable organization recognized as such by the IRS and located within southeastern Virginia, the mission and purpose of which are substantially similar to those of the Forum. If no such organization exists, then the remaining funds shall be contributed to MTNA.

Article III - MEMBERS

- A. Membership in the Forum is open to any music teacher who is or was involved in music education and who:
 - 1. Successfully applies for and maintains his or her membership in the Virginia Music Teachers Association ("VMTA"),
 - 2. Agrees to abide by the Forum's Constitution and Bylaws as may be amended from time to time,
 - 3. Pays all local dues to the Forum as established by the Executive Board from time to time, and not later than August 1 of each year, and
 - 4. Pledges to support the work and activities of the Forum and the promotion of music education.
- B. Membership classifications are as follows:
 - 1. Active membership shall be open to individuals who meet the criteria of Article III (A). Active members shall be entitled to participate in all Forum activities and programs, to vote, hold office, and receive the Forum newsletter *Stafflines*.
 - 2. Student membership shall be open to all full-time college students currently involved in music study who meet the criteria of Article III (A). Student members may enter students in local events if the student member is teaching in addition to his or her full-time studies. Student members shall not have the right to vote, hold office, apply for national certification, or enter students into MTNA competitions.
- C. At no time will the membership criteria or classifications set forth in this Constitution conflict with those set forth in the bylaws of the MTNA. Acceptance into membership of the Forum will be granted without regard to the race, gender, ethnic background, age or religion of the applicant.
- D. Membership dues will be established by the Executive Board of the Forum from time to time and at least annually. Each member must pay dues in order to remain in good standing.
- E. A member may resign his or her membership by giving written notice to any elected officer.
- F. The Executive Board (by a two-thirds vote) may terminate a member's membership for failure to comply with the Forum's Constitution and Bylaws after the Executive Board gives the member ten (10) days written notice of the reason for expulsion and offers the member an opportunity to be present and address the Executive Board at such meeting. Membership will automatically be terminated for any member who fails to pay his or her local dues by August 1 of any year (payment must be postmarked by August 1).

- G. Any active member in good standing may, upon written request, review any of the Forum's official business and accounting records that are required to be maintained by state or federal government agencies, MTNA, or VMTA. The Executive Committee shall provide access to such records at such place and times as are reasonable. The Executive Board may create additional policies and procedures to implement this section which will be binding on the active member making such inquiry
- H. All members may permit their music students to attend the Forum meetings.

Article IV – OFFICERS

- A. Elected Officers of the Forum will include a President, President-Elect, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, and Associate Treasurer.
- B. Appointed Officers of the Forum will include a Corresponding Secretary, Historian, and Parliamentarian. The President shall appoint the Appointed Officers immediately after the President is elected.
- C. All Officers and candidates for office must be active members in good standing of the Forum, the VMTA, and the MTNA.
- D. The duties, responsibilities and authority of each Officer are described in the Forum's Officers Handbook and may be amended from time to time by the Executive Board. Each Officer pledges to carry out his or her duties to the best of his or her ability.
- E. All Officers will serve for two-year terms. The President and President-Elect may not be reelected to their respective offices. All other Officers may serve for up to two consecutive terms.
- F. Elections of Officers shall be conducted as follows:
 - 1. The nominating committee shall nominate candidates for each of the five elected offices (together with the two candidates for at-large membership on the Executive Board) no later than the end of January in the election year.
 - 2. The slate of candidates (which will be voted on as a block by the Forum membership) shall be announced at the February meeting and published in the March edition of Stafflines.
 - 3. The Forum membership shall vote on the slate of candidates as a block during the March business meeting.
 - 4. Officers shall be installed at the May business meeting.
- G. An Officer may resign from office by delivering a letter of resignation to the President. Any Officer may be removed from office by a two-thirds vote of the Executive Board for any reason after providing the Officer with ten (10) days written notice in advance of such meeting. The President may fill vacancies in any appointed office.

The President may fill vacancies in any elected office with the approval of the Executive Committee.

Article V - EXECUTIVE BOARD AND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- A. The Executive Board will consist of the Elected Officers, the Immediate Past President, the Appointed Officers, and two members elected to represent the organization at large.
- B. The Executive Board shall determine policies of the Forum by actively pursuing the purposes of the Forum within the limits of the Constitution and Bylaws. It shall have discretion in the disbursement of all funds of the Forum.
- C. The Executive Board will meet at least four times annually and at such other times as determined by the Board.
- D. The Executive Board may transact business in one of two ways:
 - 1. In a meeting that has a quorum consisting of one-third of the members of the Executive Board present and voting, at least one of whom is the President or President-Elect. A majority vote of a duly established quorum will be sufficient to approve resolutions presented to the Executive Board.
 - 2. By unanimous consent of all the members of the Executive Board. The unanimous consent must sufficiently describe the proposed business in writing and be approved by each member of the Executive Board in writing, in which case the business may be transacted without calling the Executive Board to an actual meeting. The written resolution may be transmitted by mail, fax, or email. Written consent of Executive Board members may be communicated by mail, fax or email.
- E. The Executive Committee shall consist of the Elected Officers and the Immediate Past President.
- F. The Executive Committee shall meet as required by the President to administer, interpret, and implement the policies of the Executive Board. The Executive Committee shall be empowered to make emergency decisions on behalf of the Executive Board whenever the President determines that it is impossible or impracticable for the Executive Board to deal with the emergency in a timely manner.
- G. The Executive Committee may transact business in one of two ways:
 - 1. In a meeting that has a quorum consisting of at least three members of the Executive Committee present and voting. A majority vote of a duly established quorum will be sufficient to approve resolutions presented to the Executive Committee.
 - 2. \By unanimous consent of all the members of the Executive Committee. The unanimous consent must sufficiently describe the proposed business in writing and be approved by each member of the Executive Committee in writing or by appropriately documented voice vote, in which case the business may be transacted without calling the Executive Committee to meeting. The written resolution may be transmitted by mail, fax, or email. Consent of Executive Committee members may be in writing communicated by mail, fax, or email. Consent of Executive Committee members may also be given verbally to the President provided that the President documents the date, time, and circumstances for such verbal approval. The President shall strive to obtain written consents instead of verbal approval whenever possible.
- H. The President shall notify members of the Executive Board and Executive committee of all Board and Committee meetings at least three days before such meeting. Notice may be given by letter, fax, or email. For the Executive Committee, notice may also be given by telephone notification.

Article VI - COMMITTEES AND AREA COORDINATORS

- A. The Forum shall have three standing committees: Membership, Program, and Finance.
- B. The Membership Committee shall consist of a committee chair and Area Coordinators (all of whom shall be appointed by the President) and shall be responsible for keeping membership and attendance records and communicating with the Forum membership. The Membership Committee shall also perform those duties described in the Forum's Yearbook (which may be amended from time to time by the Executive Board) and as may otherwise be directed by the President.
- C. The Program Committee shall consist of the President-Elect (who will serve as committee chair) and one other person to be appointed by the President. The Program Committee shall plan programs for the year, make arrangements for all meetings, and present the programs at the meetings. The Program Committee shall present its plans to the President for final endorsement.
- D. The Finance committee shall consist of the Treasurer, the Associate Treasurer, the President and the President-Elect. The Finance Committee shall be responsible for preparing and presenting the Forum's proposed annual budget to the Executive Board. If approved by the Executive Board, the Finance Committee shall submit the budget for vote by the active members at the May business meeting each year.
- E. In addition to the three standing committees, the President shall activate a nominating committee at least ninety days before the scheduled election of officers. The nominating committee shall be appointed by the President and shall include no fewer than three Past-Presidents.
- F. The Executive Board may establish one or more ad hoc committees and set forth the committee's duties, responsibilities, and authorities as may be required from time to time. The President shall appoint chairs and committee members for all such ad hoc committees.

Article VII - MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS

- A. Regular meetings of the Forum membership shall be held monthly, September through May, except December. The Executive Board shall determine the dates and times of all such meetings, being guided by the general desires of the Forum membership.
- B. Special meetings of the Forum may be called by the President upon request of a majority of the members of the Executive Committee.
- C. In order to conduct business at any membership meeting, a quorum consisting of no less than one-third of the active members in good standing must be present and voting. Business can be approved by a majority vote of a duly constituted quorum. If a quorum is not present, extend the voting by email or written response, with a deadline, until a quorum is met.

Article VIII - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Robert's Rules of Order Revised shall be the final authority in all questions of procedure and parliamentary law not covered by the Constitution and Bylaws. The Parliamentarian shall have the final say in the interpretation and application of these rules.

Article IX - FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year is the same as the MTNA and VMTA fiscal year: July 1 to June 30.

Article X - AMENDMENTS

- A. This Constitution and Bylaws may be amended at any meeting of the Forum by majority vote of a duly established quorum of active members, the proposed amendment having been submitted to the members at least thirty (30) days prior to the voting.
- B. All amendments must be consistent with Article II of this Constitution and Bylaws and a copy of the same must be reported to the Executive Director of MTNA before approval.

Article XI - INDEMNIFICATION

- A. The Forum shall indemnify, pursuant to this Article, any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, arbitrative or investigative (other than an action by or in the right of the Forum) by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a director, officer, employee or agent of the forum (the "indemnification candidate"), against expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by such indemnification candidate in connection with such action, suit or proceeding if he or she acted in good faith and in the manner he or she reasonably believed was in the best interests of the Forum, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful. However, no indemnification shall be made in respect of any claim, as to which the indemnification candidate has been adjudged liable for willful misconduct or a knowing violation of the criminal law in the performance of his or her duty to the Forum.
- B. The Executive Board may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a director, officer, employee or agent of the Forum against any liability asserted against him or her and incurred by him or her in any such capacity or arising out of his or her status as such, provided that the Executive Board specifically finds that the costs and terms of such insurance are fair and reasonable and obtaining such insurance is in the best interest of the Forum. Notwithstanding anything in this Article to the contrary, the Executive Board may indemnify any person affiliated with the Forum to the greatest extent permitted by law, provided that the Executive Board specifically finds that such indemnification is in the best interest of the Forum.
