"The Magic of Imagery" With Catherine Rollin

Saturday, September 20th, 2025



We are planning a wonderful day with composer and clinician, Catherine Rollin, for our opening workshop on Saturday, September 20th.

Catherine Rollin is a pianist, composer, clinician, author and teacher of prize-winning students. Her more than 400 published pedagogical compositions are recognized worldwide for their combination of musicality and "teachability." As a clinician, Catherine has given over 300 workshops and masterclasses throughout the U.S., Canada, Japan and Taiwan. Her efforts as a composer, clinician and author are an outgrowth of her work as a teacher. Finding the answers to help her students develop artistic, relaxed and confident technical skills led Catherine to insights featured in her groundbreaking series, "Pathways to Artistry." Catherine's ASCAP award winning books, "Museum Masterpieces" feature her original piano works inspired by great art masterpieces from museums around the world. Catherine wrote this series after seeing how her students' creativity was sparked by artwork imagery. She is also the co-author of the 2011 edition of the highly regarded college text, "Creative Piano Teaching." All of the many facets of Catherine's work emanate from her central passion for teaching.

She will present on the topic: "The Magic of Imagery". In this session, Catherine will explore many different forms of imagery, including song, dance storytelling and artwork imagery.

She will play a wide variety of examples from Beethoven, Chopin, Debussy, Mozart, and Rollin. Through using musical examples, she will demonstrate how to inspire our students to create beautifully using phrases, music that dances with rhythmic energy, and performances that shine with interpretive confidence.

TMTF Members will enjoy a light lunch with the clinician.

A masterclass will be held following the luncheon. We would like to have four students in levels from elementary through advanced to perform music by Catherine Rollin during the masterclass.
