Welcome & Introductions – Jenni Gruenisen

Special Guest - Maggie Miller, 1st grade teacher and "Lighthouse" coordinator (Leader in Me)

- "Big rocks" to work on this year family engagement
- Scheduled 11/28 student/parent scavenger hunt in the school from 5:30-6:30
- Our goal is to work in alignment with each other to create a strong Beaver Creek community where all student and parents feel like they belong
- Ideas for the future share specific events with teacher engagement (restaurant nights/family engagement nights)

Principal's Report – Mr. Toot

- Certified count date was on October 2. At that time, we had 564 students enrolled at BC, compared to 578 enrolled a year ago on certified count date.
- We have had three assemblies so far this year, and two of these have been student led. All students
 wore their Lead.Learn.Welcome shirts on Friday, and we will ask the students to wear these on field trip
 days and for other special event days.
- Fall literacy and math screenings have been completed, and the results will be coming home in student backpacks later this month. These include FAST literacy screeners for all grade levels. aMath for first through third graders. MAP math for fourth and fifth graders. Teachers have time reviewing their classroom and grade level data and planning the next instructional steps.
- Fifth grade band has started in the past few weeks and over 70 students are giving band a try this year.
- We are looking forward to our fall fitness, run and walk day on Friday, October 27. This is the culminating event for the fall fundraiser, and families of students are welcome to participate.
- The potential playground enhancements will be discussed at a Johnston Board of Education physical environment committee meeting next week. This is standard practice with facility improvements and upgrades.
- Parent teacher conferences are taking place on November 7th and 9th. Thursday, November 9 will be a three-hour early dismissal day to allow for conferences, and there will not be any school on Friday, November 10.
- Beaver Creek has a family engagement action team meeting this year, discussing ways to better engage all families of BC students. This group is planning a Beaver Creek scavenger hunt on Tuesday, November 28, from 5:30-6:30. Planning is beginning, and this action team might be reaching out to the PTO for some support for this event.
- Leader in Me lessons continue in all classrooms and students are learning more about the 7 Habits. We will be having an outdoor assembly on Friday afternoon to celebrate the first eight weeks of lessons, and will also distribute the Lead, Learn, Welcome T-shirts to students.
- We need substitute teachers and associates at Beaver Creek and at all schools.
