Thanks for your interest in participating in our local Haverford EAC recycling initiative. By recycling these hard to recycle items that are not accepted in our single stream township recycling: we save tax payer dollars that would pay for waste removal and disposal, decrease potential plastic pollution on land and in water, and reduce pollution in air, land and water by decreasing our waste in landfills and incinerators.

EAC volunteers have teamed up to offer drop off locations throughout the township for select hard-to-recycle items for all Haverford township residents. Each program has a different volunteer collecting packaging to be shipped and recycled through Terracycle. ***Make sure items are EMPTY, and clean and dry as possible!*** To participate please follow directions on what is accepted in each program. NOTE: EACH program is BRAND specific, unless specified by “any brand accepted”. Product packaging will be shipped and properly recycled through Terracycle. Thanks for keeping these items out of our trash streams, local landfills and incinerators.

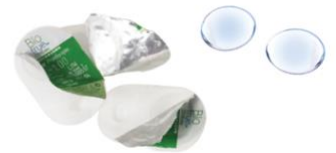

Non-compliant items interfere with the recycling process and can pose a safety hazard to our warehouse operations team. Keep knives separate and secured (sheathed if possible). Use the original box to hold the knives if available.

Best practices for recycling

You don't need to clean the packaging before sending it to TerraCycle, but please remove as much of the remaining product as possible (i.e. large crumbs). UPS will not accept dripping packages, so make sure your items are dry.

Fabreze (No plastic bottles- please recycle in township pick up)

What you can recycle

All brands of air freshener cartridges, plugs, trigger heads, and plastic and film packaging



NOTE: In order to make the recycling process as effective as possible, we do not accept plastic bottles, as these can be recycled through most municipal programs.

Fabric Care Packaging (brands Tide, Gain, Downy & Dreft only)

What you can recycle

All non-recyclable fabric care products and packaging from brands Tide, Gain, Downy & Dreft, including plastic components (dispensing cup, bag, nozzle, nozzle clip), and plastic packaging wrap, flexible plastic bags, rigid plastic tubs and lids, and Tide To Go pen

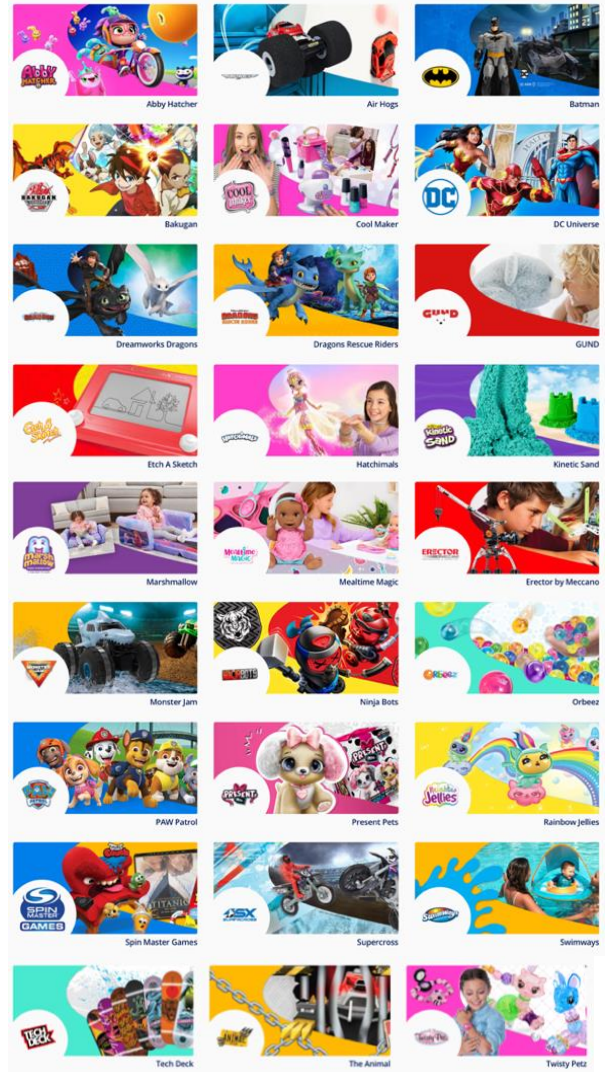

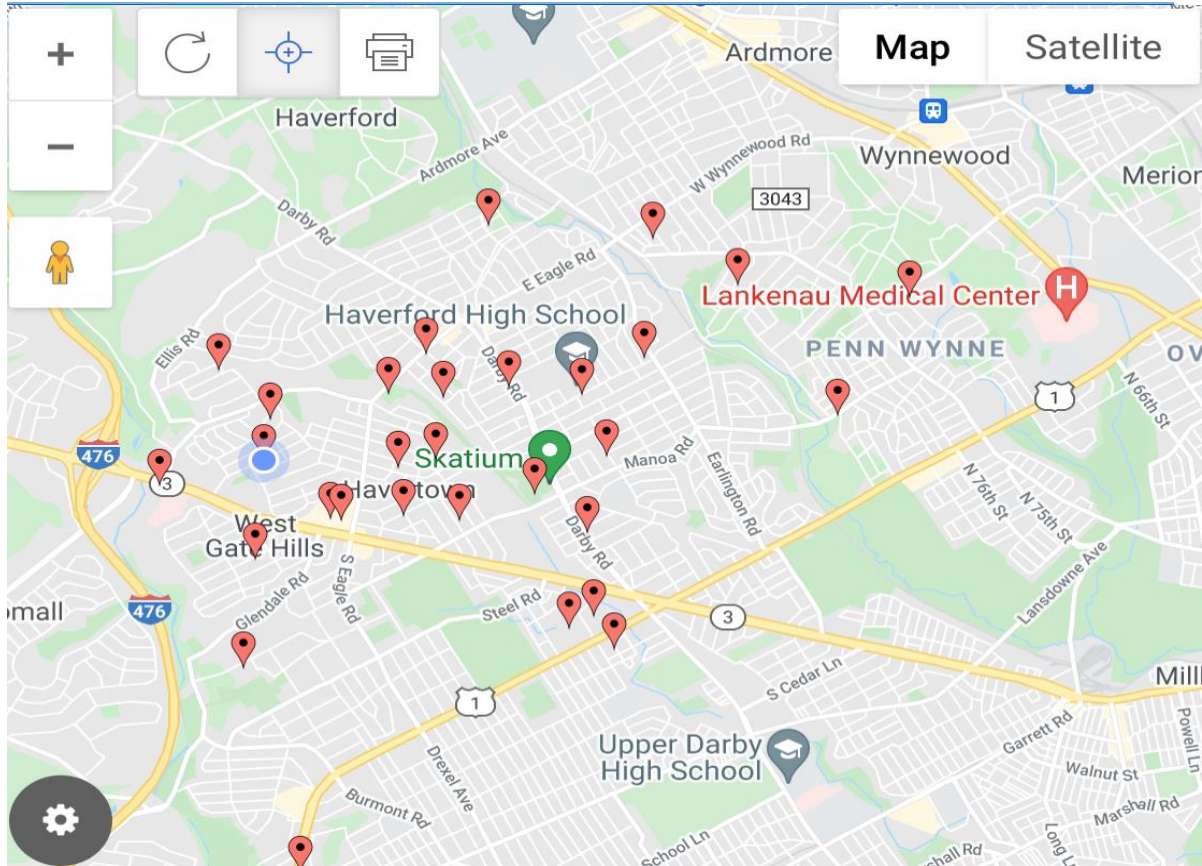

Remove as much nonmetal (plastic) as possible. The bin is on your right, just past the gas pumps. Smoke detector container is located inside the building and available M-F 8a-4p.

Local Recycling Programs

Haverford Township E-Waste Bins

- **Township building: 1014 Darby Road, Havertown – located in lower parking lot between the WaWa and Police station**
- **CREC: 9000 Parkview Drive, Havertown- located at the far corner of the parking lot**

Electronics contain hazardous materials such as arsenic, lead, and mercury, which can be harmful to our health and environment. Please do NOT throw out E-waste, air-conditioners, mini-fridges, or dehumidifiers in the trash. Freon (found in fridges, freezers, air conditioners dehumidifiers and water coolers) is a lethal toxic substance and improper disposal can deplete the ozone layer and are unsafe for the environment.

This bin accepts small electronics, electrical cords and E-waste able to be fit into the bin. No batteries. Please do not leave items on the ground if they are too bit or if the bin is full. The township will still offer bi-annual electronic recycling events per year for larger and excess items.



Small E-Waste
Collection Container!

The Township is proud to offer this new service to our residents. Available 24 hours/7 days a week.

This container is for SMALL household electronic waste (think “no larger than a breadbox”) such as small appliances, electronics, Gaming systems or anything with a cord that can fit through the chute.



- **Beauty Care Recycling – located OUTSIDE upper level of Township building** see accepted items above under personal and beauty care
- **Terracycle’s Oral Care Recycling – located OUTSIDE upper level of Township building** see accepted items above under colgate oral care
- **Medicine Disposal – located in lower floor INSIDE Police level of Township building** Safely dispose of medicine

Hazardous Waste Drop off through Delaware County

Delaware County sponsors four (4) Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Events each year. Our choice of a hazardous waste vendor insures that as much of the waste that can be recycled, is recycled. Examples include: motor oil is sent to a company that removes the dirt which then allows the oil to be reused; small propane tanks are drained, reusing the remaining propane; tanks are examined and those that can be reused are sent to a propane supplier in order to be refilled; those that cannot are sent to a scrap metal dealer for further recycling.

Pieces that can't be ground down and reused in molding help generate power in our facilities. When we make too many bricks of one kind, we donate them through our LEGO Foundation to charities all over the world!

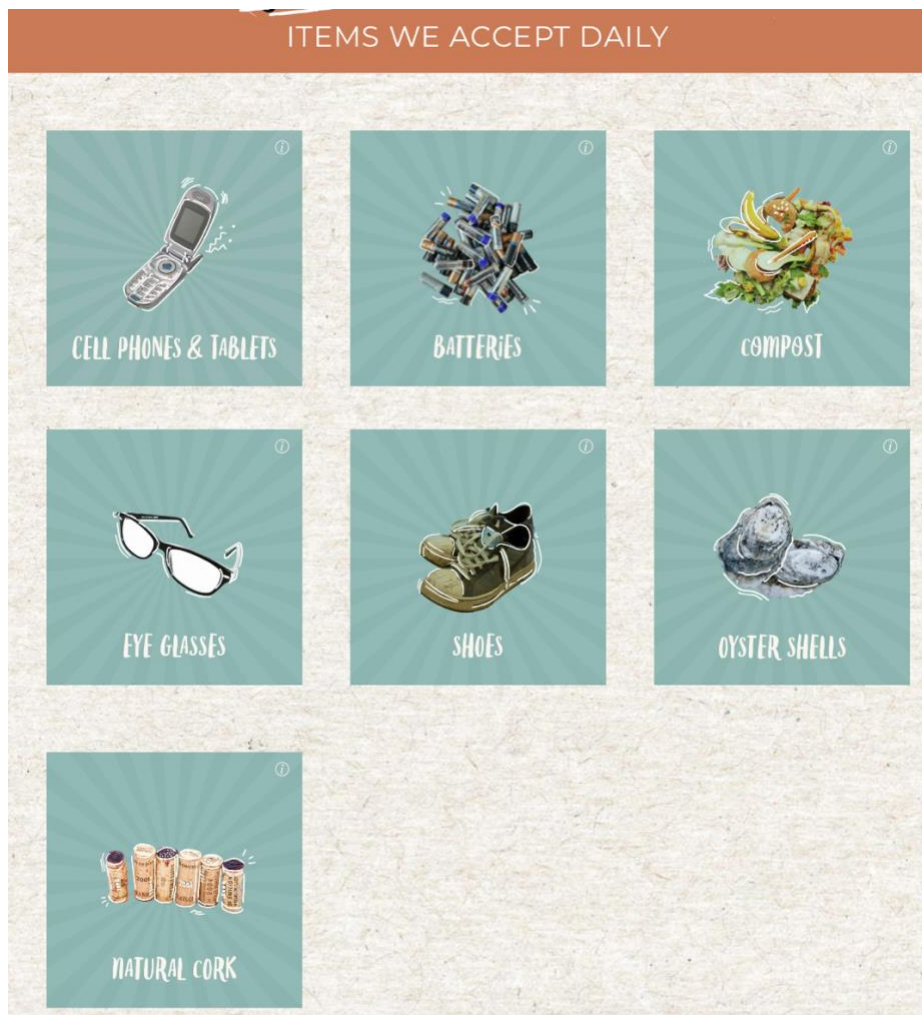

Currently this program is free for Lower Merion, Radnor and Montgomery county residents. Haverford Township has a \$15 convenience fee for door step pick up. Other fees include: \$10 for each microwave, \$35 for each TV under 150 lbs and monitors that use a Cathode Ray Tube (CRT), \$100 for each TV 150 lbs or more, \$50 for each dehumidifier, \$50 for each window air-conditioner, and \$50 for each mini refrigerator under 50 lbs. How to donate frozen meals to St. Dennis Catholic Church (2401 Saint Denis Lane, Havertown): Just turn down Saint Denis Lane and park in the lot behind the church. There's a cream colored building behind the church and the freezer is the door furthest on the right. Available 24/7 but locked; The code to get in is 9484. They have a four pack of containers with a sheet to fill out with ingredients, take as many as you'd like! Fill it with leftovers, freeze it and drop back off. The freezer number for St Dennis is 127. When you bring them back you just need to fill out the sign in sheet on the fridge with how many meals you're putting in. (Another location at St. Paul's Lutheran Church: 415 E. Athens Ave, Ardmore)
