Thanks for your interest in participating in our local Haverford EAC recycling initiative. By recycling these hard to recycle items that are not accepted in our single stream township recycling: we save tax payer dollars that would pay for waste removal and disposal, decrease potential plastic pollution on land and in water, and reduce pollution in air, land and water by decreasing our waste in landfills and incinerators.

EAC volunteers have teamed up to offer drop off locations throughout the township for select hard-to-recycle items for all Haverford township residents. Each program has a different volunteer collecting packaging to be shipped and recycled through Terracycle, store programs or other recycling programs. ***Make sure items are EMPTY, and clean and dry as possible!*** To participate please follow directions on what is accepted in each program. NOTE: EACH program is BRAND specific, unless specified by "any brand accepted".

Thanks for keeping these items out of our trash streams, local landfills and incinerators.

Best practices for recycling

You don't need to clean the packaging before sending it to TerraCycle, but please remove as much of the remaining product as possible (i.e. large crumbs). UPS will not accept dripping packages, so make sure your items are dry.

Fabreze (No plastic bottles- please recycle in township pick up)

What you can recycle

All brands of air freshener cartridges, plugs, trigger heads, and plastic and film packaging



NOTE: In order to make the recycling process as effective as possible, we do not accept plastic bottles, as these can be recycled through most municipal programs.

Fabric Care Packaging (brands Tide, Gain, Downy & Dreft only)

What you can recycle

All non-recyclable fabric care products and packaging from brands Tide, Gain, Downy & Dreft, including plastic components (dispensing cup, bag, nozzle, nozzle clip), and plastic packaging wrap, flexible plastic bags, rigid plastic tubs and lids, and Tide To Go pen

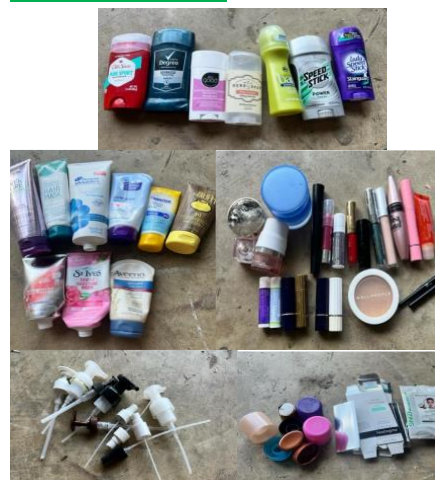

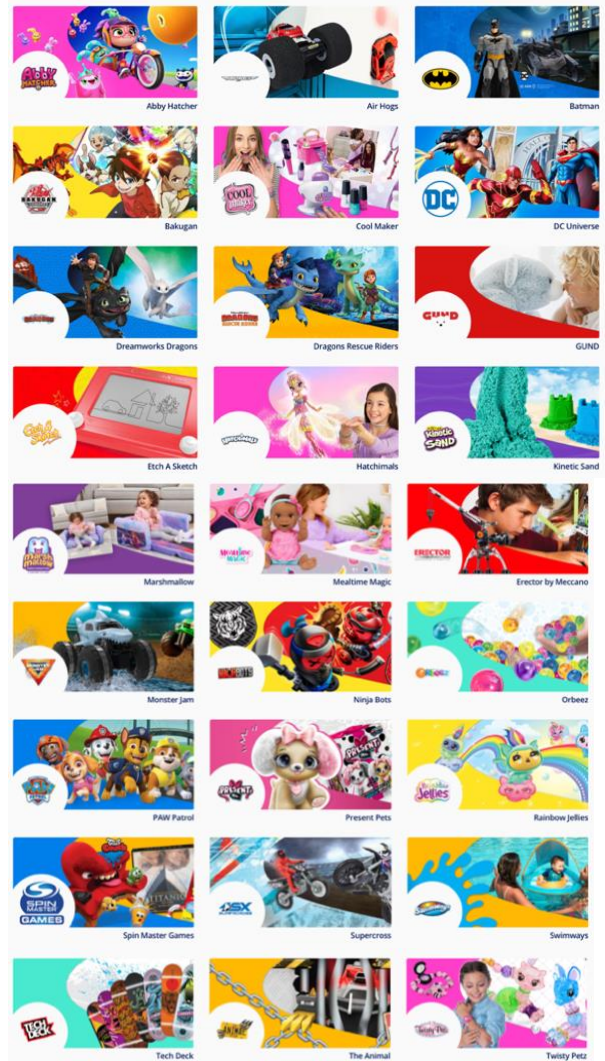

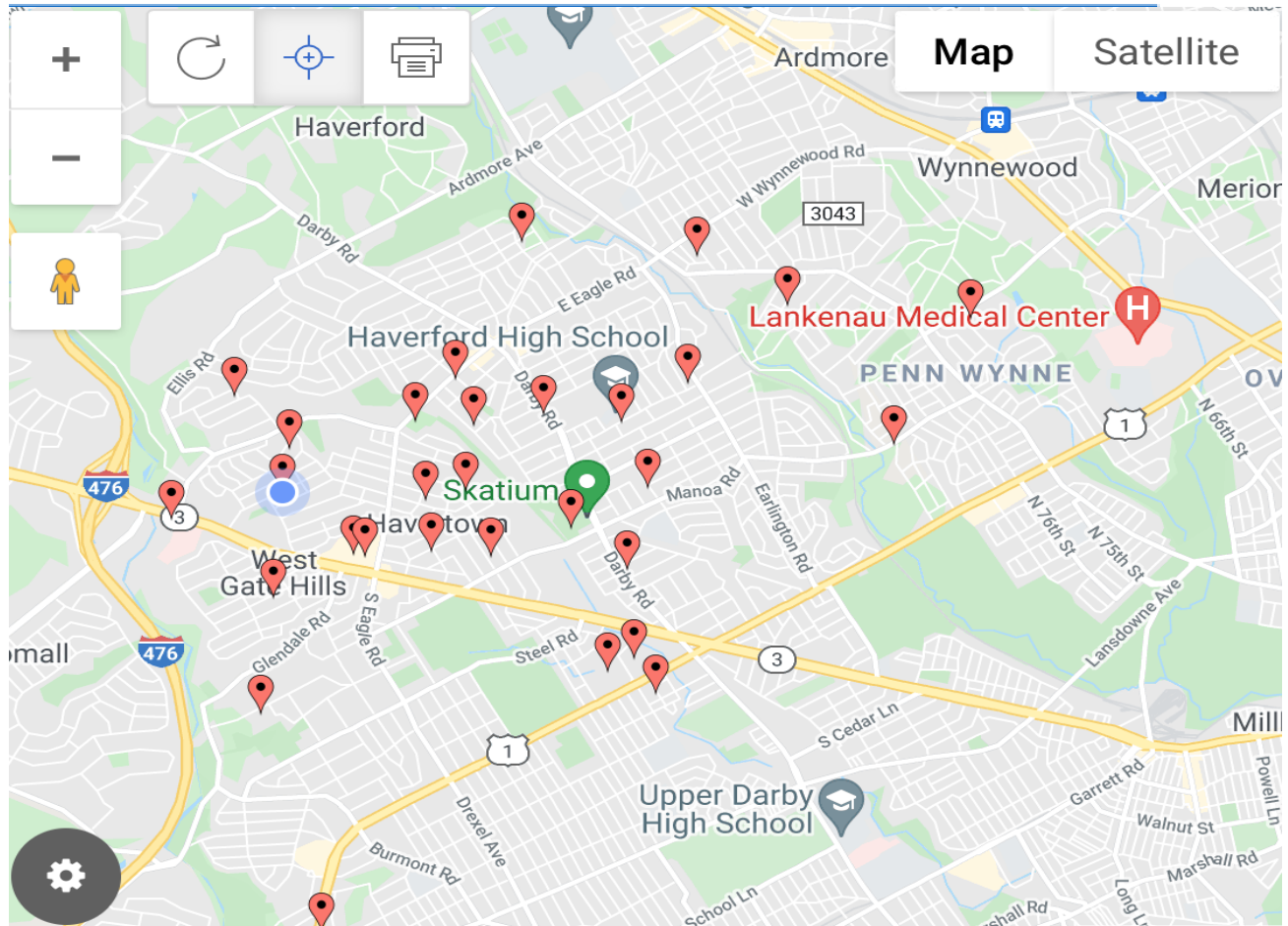

Township's Public Recycling Bins

Please place only these programs/items in appropriate, corresponding, marked bin. Do Not leave items next to the bins!

Haverford Community Recycling Center: Hilltop Road: From West Chester Pike, take Old West Chester Pike and make a left onto Hilltop Road. Then, follow signs for the Recycling Center.

- **Single Stream Recycling bins.** There you'll find two dumpsters clearly marked: one dumpster clearly marked for both paper and cardboard; and one dumpster for glass, cans and plastics.

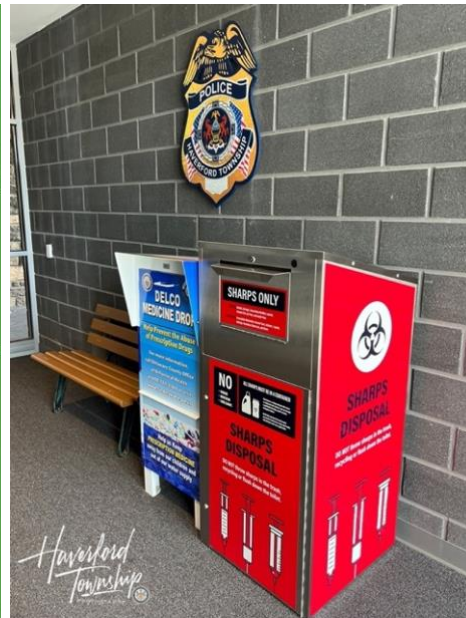
- **E-Waste Bin (1)*** – bin located **OUTSIDE**, at end of parking lot near baseball field

Haverford Township Building : 1014 Darby Rd Havertown

- **E-Waste Bins (2)*** - bin located **OUTSIDE** the building, lower parking lot between WaWa and Township building
- **Oral Care ONLY (Any Brand Accepted) and packaging** – bin located **OUTSIDE** to the right of the township doors on the upper level
- **Beauty Care ONLY (Any Brand Accepted) items** – bins located **OUTSIDE** to the right of the township doors on the upper level
- **Bread Bag Tags** – bin located near oral care and Beauty Care bins **OUTSIDE** to the right of the township doors on the upper level
- **PRC's Traveling Glass Bin** – Check the [Haverford Township webpage](#) for upcoming events. Bin located **OUTSIDE** the building, lower parking lot between WaWa and the Township building

Haverford Police Building : 1014 Darby Rd Havertown

- **Medication Disposal** - expired or excess prescription and nonprescription medications can be properly disposed of in the bin located **INSIDE** the lower entrance of the township building (police side).



***Electronics** contain hazardous materials such as arsenic, lead, and mercury, which can be harmful to our health and environment. Please do NOT throw out E-waste, air-conditioners, mini-fridges, or dehumidifiers in the trash. Freon (found in fridges, freezers, air conditioners dehumidifiers and water coolers) is a lethal toxic substance and improper disposal can deplete the ozone layer and are unsafe for the environment.

This bin accepts small electronics, electrical cords and E-waste able to be fit into the bin. No batteries. Please do not leave items on the ground if they are too bit or if the bin is full. The township will still offer bi-annual electronic recycling events per year for larger and excess items.

Hazardous Waste Drop off through Delaware County

Delaware County sponsors four (4) Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Events each year. Our choice of a hazardous waste vendor insures that as much of the waste that can be recycled, is recycled. Examples include: motor oil is sent to a company that removes the dirt which then allows the oil to be reused; small propane tanks are drained, reusing the remaining propane; tanks are examined and those that can be reused are sent to a propane supplier in order to be refilled; those that cannot are sent to a scrap metal dealer for further recycling.

95% of what we collect is reused, upcycled, or recycled. 50% is reusable, 45% is recyclable. It is first sorted by our partners and divided into grades. The higher grades are resold to thrift stores in North America and other secondhand markets around the world. The lower grades get turned into rags for industrial use or things like stuffing and insulation. Clothing reuse is a big deal. It reduces the enormous environmental burden of the second most polluting industry in the world. Schedule a [home pick up](#), you must have 3 or more bags or Drop off bins are available at:

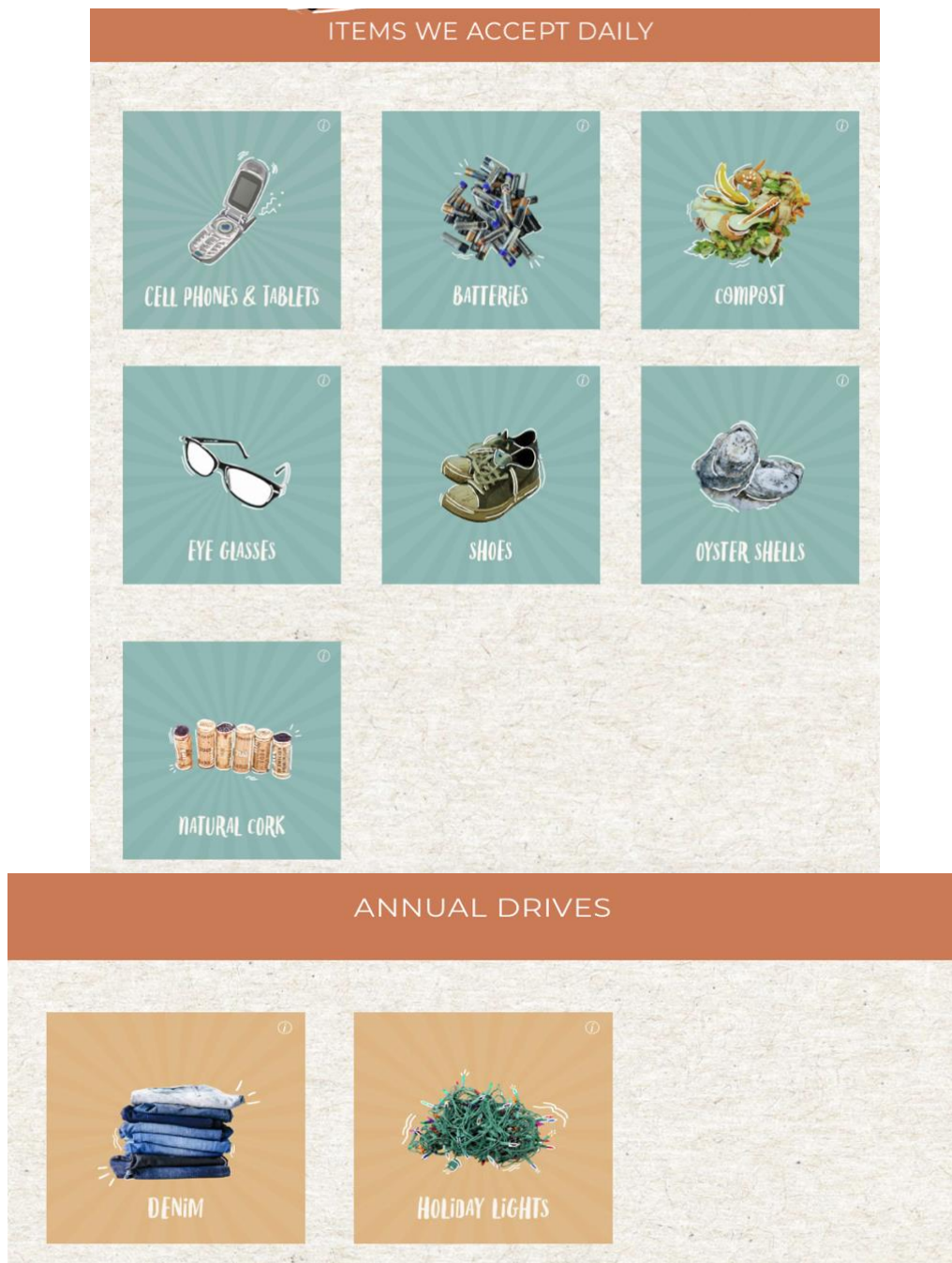

If you have clothing and electronics you no longer need, we'll come pick it up right from your doorstep, and then recycle it for you. Whether your item gets resold as-is or gets recycled for parts, our goal is to return value to unwanted items and ensure that the products of tomorrow are born from recycled material. Currently this program is free for Lower Merion, Radnor and Montgomery county residents. Haverford Township has a \$15 convenience fee for door step pick up. Other fees include: \$10 for each microwave, \$35 for each TV under 150 lbs and monitors that use a Cathode Ray Tube (CRT), \$100 for each TV 150 lbs or more, \$50 for each dehumidifier, \$50 for each window air-conditioner, and \$50 for each mini refrigerator under 50 lbs. Retrievr has a buy back program where you can earn rewards for specific clothes, phones and electronics in good condition. They have a four pack of containers with a sheet to fill out with ingredients, take as many as you'd like! Fill it with leftovers, freeze it and drop back off.

The freezer number for St Dennis is 127. When you bring them back you just need to fill out the sign in sheet on the fridge with how many meals you’re putting in.
