Thanks for your interest in participating in our local Haverford EAC recycling initiative. By recycling these hard to recycle items that are not accepted in our single stream township recycling: we save tax payer dollars that would pay for waste removal and disposal, decrease potential plastic pollution on land and in water, and reduce pollution in air, land and water by decreasing our waste in landfills and incinerators.

EAC volunteers have teamed up to offer drop off locations throughout the township for select hard-to-recycle items for all Haverford township residents. Each program has a different volunteer collecting packaging to be shipped and recycled through Terracycle, store programs or other recycling programs. ***Make sure items are EMPTY, and clean and dry as possible!*** To participate please follow directions on what is accepted in each program. NOTE: EACH program is BRAND specific, unless specified by “any brand accepted”.

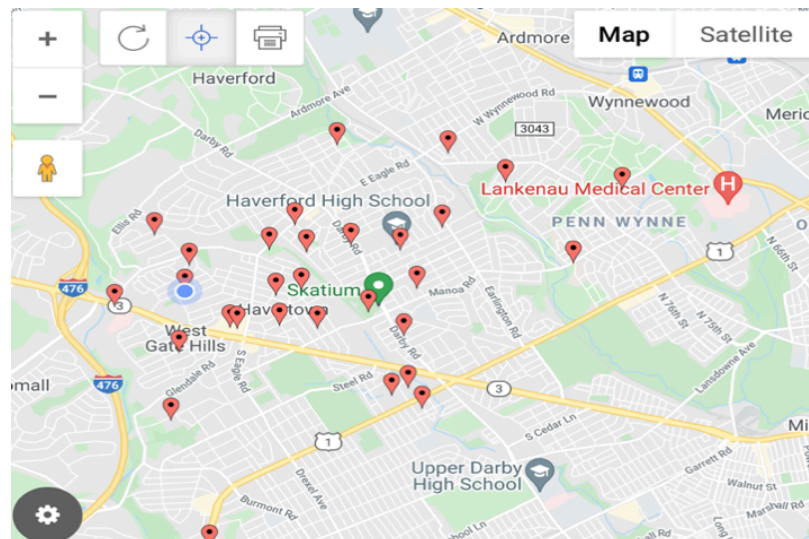

All Terracycle and Local reusing/Recycling options have been mapped out for your convenience available on MainLine [SHIFTs page](#). Please be mindful to reduce gasoline if driving to drop off items, by making less trips, while already running errands or on your way to another location.



Township's Public Recycling Bins

Please place only these programs/items in appropriate, corresponding, marked bin. Do Not leave items next to the bins!

Haverford Community Recycling Center: Hilltop Road: From West Chester Pike, take Old West Chester Pike and make a left onto Hilltop Road. Then, follow signs for the Recycling Center.

- **Single Stream Recycling bins.** There you'll find two dumpsters clearly marked: one dumpster clearly marked for both paper and cardboard; and one dumpster for glass, cans and plastics. Closed in November and December for Leaf Collection.

Small E-Waste Collection Container!

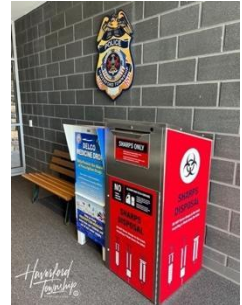
The Township is proud to offer this new service to our residents. Available 24 hours/7 days a week.

This container is for **SMALL** household electronic waste (think "no larger than a breadbox") such as small appliances, electronics, Gaming systems or anything with a cord that can fit through the chute.

- **Bread Bag Tags** - bin located near oral care and Beauty Care bins **OUTSIDE** to the right of the township doors on the upper level

Haverford Police Building: 1010 Darby Rd, Havertown

- **Medication Disposal** – expired or excess prescription and nonprescription medications can be properly disposed of in the bin located **INSIDE** the lower entrance of the township building (police side).



Fire Station: American Flag Retirement Boxes: Please place worn, torn and damaged flags in handmade wooden box to be properly disposed of.

- Brookline: 1315 Darby Rd, Havertown
- Oakmont: 23 West Benedict Ave, Havertown

***Electronics** contain hazardous materials such as arsenic, lead, and mercury, which can be harmful to our health and environment. Please do NOT throw out E-waste, air-conditioners, mini-fridges, or dehumidifiers in the trash. Freon (found in fridges, freezers, air conditioners dehumidifiers and water coolers) is a lethal toxic substance and improper disposal can deplete the ozone layer and are unsafe for the environment.

This bin accepts small electronics, electrical cords and E-waste able to be fit into the bin. No batteries. Please do not leave items on the ground if they are too bit or if the bin is full. The township will still offer bi-annual electronic recycling events per year for larger and excess items.

Media items can be dropped off 24/7 in the big green recycling bin behind the Police Building. With the building on your left, go straight back toward the Public Works garage, and turn left. The bin is on your right, just past the

gas pumps. Smoke detector container is located inside the building and available M-F 8a-4p

Delaware County sponsors four (4) Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Events each year. Our choice of a hazardous waste vendor insures that as much of the waste that can be recycled, is recycled. Examples include: motor oil is sent to a company that removes the dirt which then allows the oil to be reused; small propane tanks are drained, reusing the remaining propane; tanks are examined and those that can be reused are sent to a propane supplier in order to be refilled; those that cannot are sent to a scrap metal dealer for further recycling.

95% of what we collect is reused, upcycled, or recycled. 50% is reusable, 45% is recyclable. It is first sorted by our partners and divided into grades. The higher grades are resold to thrift stores in North America and other secondhand

Other fees include: \$10 for each microwave, \$35 for each TV under 150 lbs and monitors that use a Cathode Ray Tube (CRT), \$100 for each TV 150 lbs or more, \$50 for each dehumidifier, \$50 for each window air-conditioner, and \$50 for each mini refrigerator under 50 lbs. Residents should directly contact EZ Composting, Mother Compost, or their composting service provider of choice to participate. For those two particular collectors, residents can easily sign up on their websites. The location of the household triggers either enrollment in the incentive program or an alert that the household is eligible for it. Other composting companies are welcome to participate in the program, at this time only EZ Composting and Mother Compost service Haverford Township.


How to donate frozen meals to St. Dennis Catholic Church (2401 Saint Denis Lane, Havertown): Just turn down Saint Denis Lane and park in the lot behind the church. There's a cream colored building behind the church and the freezer is the door furthest on the right. Available 24/7 but locked; The code to get in is 9484. They have a four pack of containers with a sheet to fill out with ingredients, take as many as you'd like! Fill it with leftovers, freeze it and drop back off. The freezer number for St Dennis is 127. When you bring them back you just need to fill out the sign in sheet on the fridge with how many meals you're putting in.

The fourth item asks 'What types of donations does the fridge accept?' and lists: 'Fresh, whole fruits and vegetables', 'Non-perishable, canned foods (beans, soups, etc)', 'Milk, butter, eggs, juices', 'prepackaged foods like applesauce, yogurt, hummus, fruit cups, kids fruit squeezers', 'Bread, pastries, bagels, muffins, etc.' with a sub-bullet '(in the freezer)', 'Pre-made meals, rice, grains, etc.', and 'Personal hygiene products: hand soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, tampons, pads'. The fifth item is a 'NO:' list: 'opened, expired, or rotten foods, raw meat'. At the bottom right, it says 'Thank you! :-)'.
