



MINISTER’S MESSAGE

The Joy of the Dharma

Have you ever thought about “How did Pure Land Buddhism start?” We have 3 main sutras in Jodo Shinshu of which the Larger Sukhavativyuha Sutra is considered the main sutra. What were the circumstances surrounding the Historic Buddha Sakyamuni’s expounding or sharing of the Larger Sutra? One way to explain it would be to say it was the “Joy!” It was the “Joy of the Dharma.”

As I read the sutras and many of our Pure Land writings, one theme that keeps appearing, besides wisdom and compassion, is “Joy and Happiness.” Thus, Joy and Happiness are a big part of our Pure land Teachings and experience.

According to the Larger Sutra,

“Thus, I have heard. At one time the Buddha (Sakyamuni) was staying on Vulture Peak in Rajagrha, together with a great multitude of twelve thousand monks... There were also many Mahayana bodhisattvas accompanying the Buddha... At that time... the World Honored One (Sakyamuni Buddha) was filled with gladness and serenity... His complexion was pure. His radiant countenance was majestic. The Venerable Ananda, having perceived the Buddha’s holy intention, rose from his seat, bared his right shoulder, knelt down, put his palms together, and said to (Sakyamuni) Buddha, ‘Today, World Honored One, your senses... are filled with gladness and serenity. Your complexion is pure. Your radiant countenance is majestic, like a luminous mirror in which clear reflections pass unobstructed. Your loft features are resplendent, surpassing all words or measure. Never before have I beheld your countenance as sublime as it is now. Why does your commanding radiance, (today) shine forth with such brilliance?’

Well spoken Ananda! Your question is excellent... This question you now ask will bring immense benefit; it will enlighten the minds of all gods and human beings... Know, Ananda, that the perfect enlightenment of the Tathagata is immeasurable in its wisdom and vast in its guidance of beings to awakening... This is because the Tathagata has attained unlimited and boundless samadhi and wisdom... Ananda, listen well. I will now explain the Dharma to you.

Ananda noticed something different about Sakyamuni Buddha and asked

why. In response Sakyamuni Buddha, the Tathagata said to listen carefully to what he is about to share with the words "...listen well. I will now explain the Dharma to you" and so begins the Larger Sukhavativyuha Sutra with its beautiful descriptions of the Pure Land of Peace and Happiness established by Amida Buddha, the explanations of the 48 Vows of Bodhisattva Dharmakara/Amida Buddha and how Amida Buddha became Amida Buddha, and very importantly, how we will be able to be born in Amida Buddha's Pure land where we can attain perfect enlightenment too.

In the words of Sakyamuni Buddha, *"I have appeared in this world and expounded the teaching of the Way, seeking to save the multitude of living beings by bestowing upon them the benefit that is true and real"* (which is the Nembutsu Teaching).

To me, it is with similar reasons that earlier in his life Sakyamuni Buddha did not stay seated at the foot of the Bodhi Tree to savor the Wisdom and Joy of Enlightenment, the Dharma for only himself and after 49 days he stood up to start looking for the 5 people that he had previously studied with to share with them Dharma he had now discovered and the peace, joy, happiness, serenity and calm that he was experiencing.

Let me explain. When you are happy it shows. You don't will yourself to show your happiness as in "I will show my happiness to others." No, no, happiness doesn't work that way. It naturally shows on your face. So, I think, here at temple, we should smile and show our happiness and joy a little bit more. Sometimes I wonder about this so-called Asian Stoicism or poker face. Sometimes, we do it too much is my thought. I personally think we need to show more of those qualities of "gentle face, kind eyes, warm speech" and such. Simply put, "Smile!"

In Buddhism, it is explained that there are 3 kinds of joy. There is 1) external joy; this is joy produced by the five senses of our body that is smell, touch, sight, hearing and taste; then there is 2) internal joy; this is joy produced by our consciousness in the first, second, and third stages of meditation; and finally there is 3) the joy of dharma music known as hōrakugaku in Japanese; this is joy produced by wisdom. The joy produced by wisdom arises from love of the Buddha's virtue."

To conclude, in part, I would like to share the thoughts and experiences of Satomi Jun'ei. He says

"Whenever I read..." Illuminated by the Buddha's light, I can fathom the depth of the darkness of my heart," I think about all the people who have fallen into despair and have felt that everything in their lives was hopeless. Then I reflect on the many persons who, because of the Buddha's light, came to know that they could leave behind their despair, pick themselves up, and continue on with life. They felt true joy of the Nembutsu from the bottom of their hearts and could not help but want to share that joy with others. Thanks to those persons who could never forget the joy of being bathed in the Buddha's light, I have been able to receive the Nembutsu teaching. Further, is it not due to them that there is the Hongwanji?"

Yes, it seems beginning with Sakyamuni Buddha to Shinran Shonin and many more others, down to this day, it was because of an unending joy, the Joy of the Dharma, that these Pure Land Teachings of the Nembutsu have come down to us. As Sakyamuni Buddha said, *"Happiness never decreases by being shared."* Let us, as Jodo Shin Buddhists share the Joy of the Nembutsu with others!





PRESIDENT'S REPORT FOR THE AIEA HONGWANJI MISSION ANNUAL GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING ON FEBRUARY 28, 2026

MAJOR PROJECTS AND EVENTS IN 2025:

The following is a list of the major projects and undertakings that the AHM Board of Directors worked on in 2025.

Insurance company John Mullen & Co. reimbursed AHM for payment to repair damages to a parked car from weed-wacking operations.

The new edition of Gatha Books with the dark blue covers arrived and replaced the older red-dish-brown ones in the temple hondo pews.

Joshua Haramura completed the installation of a screen door at the Hall kitchen back door and at the Minister's office, as well as window screens for the Minister's office.

PV-lit Lotus artificial flowers were purchased to decorate the temple's front lawn on special occasions.

The 2025 Giseikai legislative assembly was held on February 7 and 8th.

The AHM Preschool enrollment was up to 99 students.

A Superbowl watch party was held in the Lotus Room on short notice.

Pickleball sessions in the community hall were initiated and continue to be held on the last Friday of each month unless preempted by another event.

AHM supported the YESS Camp with a donation of \$250.

Chad Okawa and Kana Suzuki were selected as exchange students for the Federation of BWAs coordinate with the Japan Student Exchange Program.

AHM donated \$250 for a full-page advertisement in the convention booklet to support the 68th Jr. YBA State Convention.

AHM ordered 50 each "Nembutsu Moments" books which were made available for purchase at \$7 apiece.

The AHM BWA held its spring Craft Fair and White Elephant Sale which was a huge success.

The AHM BWA appropriated funds to the Buddhist Churches of America's fire fund in support of two families of AHM's preschool students.

The AHM BWA also appropriated funds to provide new curtains and associated hardware for the stage's proscenium in the community hall.

AHM Board approved to include \$500 in its annual operating budget to support AHM Project Dana events.

AHM hosted the Oahu District Seminar #1 on June 8, 2025.

AHM added the requirement for hall renters to provide Event Insurance coverage of \$1 million as a condition to rent the community hall.

The AHM Board of Directors approved to add Flood Insurance coverage for the preschool and the community hall buildings.

AHM contributed to the 2025 Hawaii Food Bank Drive and turned over collections to the Food Bank via the Lions Club.

AHM held its annual E-Waste (and other specific waste) collection/recycling event on June 28, 2025.

The Oahu District Lay Association was disbanded because under the new reorganization, the state lay association is now an association of temples as opposed to districts of temples. If there is a need to meet as a district in preparation for a council meeting, the temple lay members will meet informally without the requirement of formal minutes being recorded. The remaining balance in the Oahu District Lay Association account will remain there until such time that it is deemed no longer necessary.

The WiFi router was replaced by Spectrum and has a new name and password.

A WiFi access point was installed in the community hall by AHM volunteers.

AHM Board of Directors approved \$2,500 to support the Pacific Buddhist Academy by purchasing a table for 10 at the PBA Lighting Our Way Banquet fundraiser.

AHM Board of Directors approved to donate \$500 to support Jikoen Hongwanji's new altar project.

The AHM BWA hosted the Oahu United BWA Annual Membership Conference.

On October 12, 2025, AHM hosted Secular Buddhism Podcaster, Noah Racheta, and live-streamed the event.

The AHM Board of Directors approved the use of the Dharma School checking account to pay for oreis on an emergency basis only in which cases the funds would be replenished from the AHM Kyodan account. The Dharma School checking account will be included in the monthly BOD meetings reports.

The Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii's Board of Directors, at the recommendation of the Personnel committee, approved to have ministers take 2 days off per workweek, so Rev. Eric Matsumoto elected to take his 2nd day off on Thursdays in addition to the Mondays he currently has as a day off.

The AHM Board of Directors approved to have AHM serve as an American Red Cross emergency facility provided that AHM can find at least 6 people to act as facilities coordinator. AHM has the right to decline use of its facilities on a case-by-case basis.

The AHM Senior YBA was dissolved and its checking account was closed with the balance turned over to the AHM Kyodan with stipulations on disbursements to its affiliates.

The Hawaii State Lay Association leadership training committee collaborated with (HANO) Hawaii Alliance of Nonprofit Organization who provided a Zoom training session on non-profit board governance best practices on Nov 1, 2025. A recording of this webinar was made available for those who could not attend.

AHM Board of Directors approved the recommendation to reduce the number of donation envelopes included with the Jiko Newsletter because very few are returned. Envelopes will be made available in pamphlet slots around the facility, in the temple hondo (main sanctuary), and upon request.

The community hall's stage flooring was replaced by Abbey Carpet & Flooring.

The cracks in the columns in the atrium area outside of the hall office were repaired by Construction R Us.

AHM BWA made and donated 40 placemats to the Lotus Adult Day Care Center.

Jnd Services, Inc. was hired to patch, prep, and repaint the front fascia of the temple building's exterior. The paint and color selected was Sherwin Williams Emerald brand Exterior Acrylic Latex SW#2838, polished mahogany in satin sheen finish.


