Mental Health In Recovery

The Eighth Tradition in NA aptly illustrates that our focus is sharing a message of recovery from addiction. Addicts who have thoughts or concerns about their mental health may want to seek professional help. Some mem-bers have experienced that professional help aids them in facing a crisis outside of their recovery in NA; others may find that long-term therapy and medications are warranted. There are many additional options available to us; we research what we think may be best and dis-cuss them with our sponsors and appropriate healthcare professionals. Our shared experience is captured well in Chapter Four of Living Clean: "When we use the tools available to us calling our sponsor and seeking the experience, strength, and hope of others, allowing our sup-port group to support us, and turning to In Times of Ill-ness and other NA literature—we are able to make decisions we can be comfortable with, and take action to do the next right thing." We are free to pursue our recovery from addiction in NA.

At the Request of the Heart of Long Island Area I have been in touch with our insurance agents to confirm that we are receiving the best deal possible for our insurance coverage.

They advised that a very limited number of Insurance Companies are even willing to write the liability coverage we need for our meetings. The Insurance Agency checked with a number of Insurer's and they have been unable to find one who is willing to write our coverage for less than we are currently paying. Please see the reply from our Insurance Agent following:

"In a few cases we have been able to write accounts with Harleysville, however their pricing is the same or higher than Philadelphia Insurance."

In addition, due to the fact that we have had our policy for quite some time and have a very low claim rate we are afforded a much lower premium, per group, than other Regions. Please find a direct statement from our Insurance Agency:

"If you break down the cost per each group, it is less expensive than what they charge for Northern California Regional. There the groups are charged around \$25-\$30."

I have attached a memo I distributed to all RCM's in July 2020 advising the Area's about what was planned for the 2020/2021 Insurance.

I trust the concerns raised by the HOLI Area have been answered in this memo.

July 2020 Memo to RCM's:

TO: All RCM's

From: GNYRSO BOD

July 7, 2020

RE: Insurance coverage 2020-2021

Due to the current conditions caused by the Coronavirus (Covid-19) we will be using the same Meeting count from 2019 -2020 as the basis for the 2020-2021 Insurance Policy.

There have been a number of questions from groups and Area's as to why we continue to pay the insurance costs when so many meetings are not meeting physically. Should we not pay the premium on the current policy it will be cancelled and leave all meetings without liability coverage. Many have also asked why, when we return to normal, can't we just apply for a new policy? While this could be done our current policy is very favorably priced for the coverage received. The current annual cost per group is \$ 18.60, which equates to under \$.40 per week. It would not be possible to receive this rate on a new policy, as all insurance rates on new policies will increase dramatically due to the current environment.

Our insurance broker has advised us that there is no coverage for Covis-19. In addition they have also advised us that meetings held in the open are covered (parks, athletic fields, etc.). These meetings require an insurance certificate so please apply to the GNYRSO for one. Please note that if there are any types of sports they are not covered. The policy is intended to cover meetings only. You will also need to check the CDC guidelines in order to know what is required by each city and state.

Many of our venues also require that the insurance certificate be renewed each year. Please check with your meeting place and if required apply to the GNYRSO for a new certificate. There is a form on our WEB site that can be completed and sent to RSO@newyorkna.org or Insurance@newyorkna.org.
