Uncashed checks

- Our Area has an ongoing issue with some of checks we send to the Region not being cashed. I've raised our concerns at the previous 3 RSC meetings.
- We currently have 3 donation checks that haven't been cashed.

 - Check #2284 for \$84.11 sent 10/2/25
 - Check #2286 for \$1,024.00 sent 10/7/25
- There's also check #2296 for \$629 sent 11/13/25 for our insurance.
- When I brought this issue up at the RSC meeting this past Saturday, a member went to take a look for the missing checks. He found this check for our insurance, but the other 3 are still missing.
- The only solution brought up was, PayPal is available if the Area isn't comfortable sending checks in the mail.
