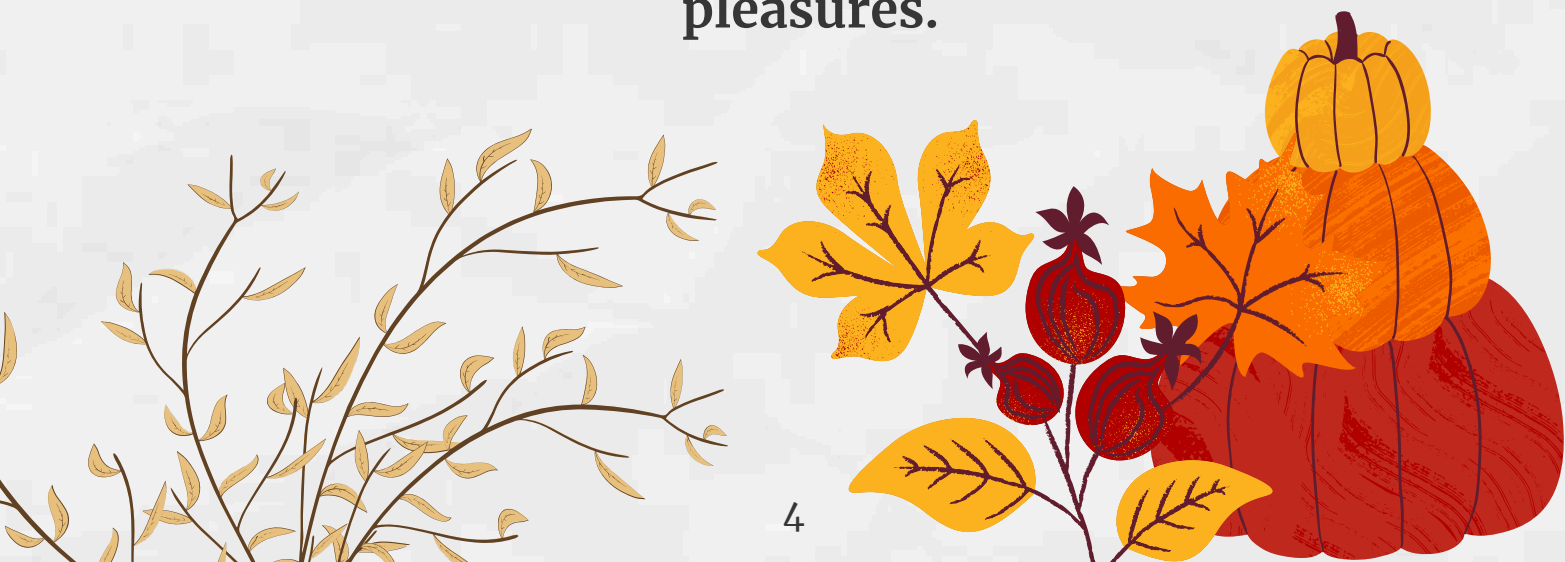
# Poetry week

# Parents' days and Scientific fair



On Thursday the 24th, a significant event took place in our lyceum. In particular, parents' meetings for grades 5-11 were held, and students had the opportunity to present their projects to parents in English at the Scientific fair.



5th grade students prepared a project on growing crystals of citric acid, halite and copper sulfate.

Students of the 6th grade presented a papier-mâché volcano and demonstrated its eruption by combining chemical compounds.



The students of the 8th grade chose an equally interesting project, where the effect of distilled water on cells was empirically proven (for the experiment, they made a Traube cell), and the students also demonstrated two circles of blood circulation and the movement of blood in the human body on a physical diagram.

# Parents' days and Scientific fair



In the 7th grade, there was a very interesting experiment with the creation of alchemical gold and the use of invisible ink.



Students of the 10th and 11th grades united for the presentation of a joint project: the effect of legal drugs on human blood. Using the example of egg white mixed with water, which imitates human blood plasma, the students showed the effect of tobacco, alcohol, coffee, tea, and energy drinks on the condition of the blood (thickening).



Students of the 9th grade proved the antioxidant properties of vitamin C using the example of various substances containing vitamin C (freshly squeezed orange juice, store-bought juice, kiwi, ampoules of vitamin C, etc.).



# Halloween

Halloween is the scariest holiday, which is celebrated on October 31st, people dress up, decorate their houses and collect sweets.

Our school did not bypass this holiday, when we came to school we were met by different scary and beautiful decorations, all the students dressed up as their favorite characters from video games, films and cartoons.

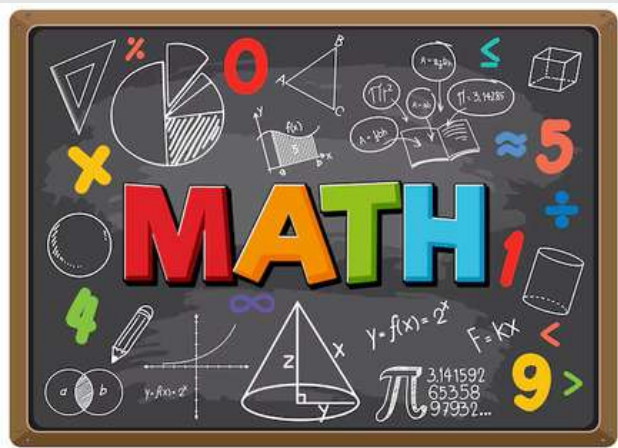

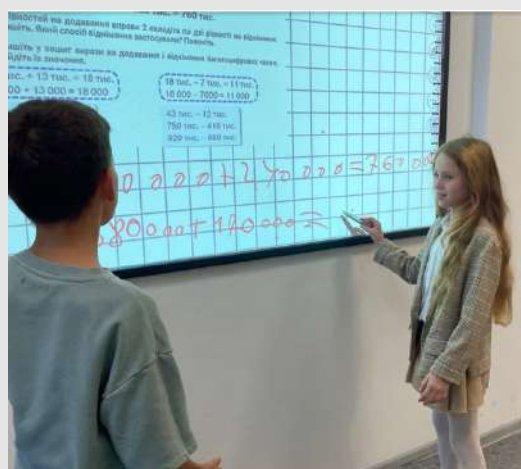
