### 1989 was the year of the first phone text message

It was also the year that the Corvette adopted the six-speed manual transmission. The transmission was a collaboration between the German firm ZF and Chevrolet. Its computer-aided gear selection (CAGS) helped the Corvette meet EPA standard for fuel economy by electronically disabling intermediate gears under certain driving conditions.

In previous years, the Corvette had been available in three different suspension trims, but in 1989, introduced RPO FX3 Selective Ride and Handling, which, when optioned with the Z51 Performance Handling package, allowed the Corvette owner to choose one of three suspension presets to customize his ride.

The '89 Corvette was the first Corvette produced in fourteen years which was available with a removable hardtop. The '89 convertible, in base form, sold for \$36,785. Out of the 26,412 Corvettes sold in 1989, 9,749 were convertibles. 1,573 buyers optioned for \$1,995 hardtop option.

## **1989 Corvette Specifications**

The ZF 6-speed manual transmission was introduced along with a state-of-the-art FX3 adjustable suspension option which permitted shock valving changes via a rotary dial mounted on the interior console between the seats. Corvette Challenge race cars totalled 60 while 69 Callaway twin-turbos were produced.

FIBERGLASS FACT: The ZR-1 was originally announced as a 1989 option, but actual production would have to wait until 1990 due to insufficient supply of engines.

## **UNIQUE C4 (1983-1996) TIDBITS:**

- In 1987 you could buy a Corvette without an engine installed by the factory.
- A total of 16 exterior colors were available for both 1982 and 1987 Corvettes, the highest number of exterior color choices offered in Corvette history.
- With the CB craze dwindling, the last year a CB radio was offered as a Corvette option was 1985. Only 16 Corvettes were so equipped. while never offered to the public. A total of 43 1983 model Corvettes were built. There were so many quality problems with them it was decided to halt production until they could be corrected. By the time the problems were corrected, it was so late into the model year that the car was brought out as a 1984 model and was run for a year and a half. The only verifiable 1983 Corvette still known to exist is on display in the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

- The 1984 Corvette had the steepest windshield rake angle of any previous American production automobile at 64 degrees.
- 1991 was the 10th anniversary of Corvette production at the Bowling Green, KY plant.
- The 1996 Grand Sport is readily identified by its striking Admiral Blue and Arctic White stripe paint scheme. What many do not know, however, is that the pinstriping on either side of the large white center stripe, actually a two-color decal, both blue and white. This was done to en sure a perfectly straight line.

### TIBITS TO THINK ABOUT CONCRETE, ASPHALT & RACE TRACK:

Asphalt is cheaper than concrete to install but concrete lasts longer. Maintenance is a different story. Racing puts a lot of stress on the surface so; they use concrete for longevity.

Concrete is stronger, so - asphalt has to be thicker to get the same rigidty. Asphalt does have an advantage; its flexibility allows it to expand and contract during temperature changes with less cracking. Concrete is more durable - - lasting 10-15 years longer than asphalt.

Changing temperature determines how hot the tires get. Let's say the track is 45 degrees vs. 90 degrees, that right there will make an increase change in the tire grip. Bitumen (the binder in asphalt) is a oil product. When temperatures rise, oils in the asphalt get hotter and that makes the track very slippery. Portland cement is pulverized rock, and is not slippery – except when it's wet.

Concrete track surface doesn't change over the course of a race nearly as much as an asphalt track. Mark Martin pointed out "... when you lose grip on a concrete surface, you feel like you just got cut loose from a rope. It's amazing. It's like losing half of your grip, rather than about 20 or 30 percent that you lose on asphalt".
