



A Recipe for the Holiday

Cadbury Creme Martini

While Cadbury eggs might feel like a thing of the past, they've found new life by transforming themselves into cocktails. Why? Because candy is great and the big kids in us need an excuse to eat it!

11/2 oz. vodka or gin

- 1/4 cup milk chocolate
- 3 Tbsp. condensed milk
- Yellow and red food dye

21/2 oz crème de cacao

- 3/4 cup half-and-half
- seltzer

Ice

3/4 cup

- 1 Cadbury egg, halved lengthwise
- 1. Dip rims of martini or coupe glasses into melted chocolate.

2. Combine condensed milk with a drop of yellow food dye and a very tiny amount

of red dye. Pour mixture into bottom of prepared glasses to resemble an egg yolk.

3. In a cocktail shaker, combine half-and-half, crème de cacao, and vodka. Fill shaker with ice. Vigorously shake until outside of shaker is very frosty, about 20 seconds. Strain cocktail into prepared glasses. Top off with seltzer.

4. Gently slice a small slit in the back of each egg half and arrange on rim of glasses, using some melted chocolate or a skewer to help adhere, if needed.
