

## Looking In The Rear View Mirror

- The concept of the club traveling to the National Museum was discussed and committed to the spring of 2004. The club also decided to have a "Brick Fund" to raise money to purchase a brick that would be on display at NCM.
- At the June 2003 meeting, the first LOCC shirts were available to purchase. The cost was \$31 but \$2 went towards the "Brick Fund". At this time the membership was now up to 35 members! Additional fundraiser opportunities were held to raise money for the brick fund. As of September 2003, the Brick Fund was \$947.
- At the November 2003 meeting, nametags became available.
- In December 2003, it was announced that Krista and Darin Shackleford had a new C5 white convertible with the expensive and very rare magnesium wheel option.
- On April 29<sup>th</sup> through May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2004, the club took it's first trip to the National Corvette Museum. A total of 20 cars and 40 people signed up for the spring trip to the birthplace of the Corvette. In November, 2004, \$890 was paid for a brick and a NCM Membership. 1. Combine vodka, liqueur, orange juice, lemon juice and sugar and shake ously.


