
# Jefferson City 4th of July Parade





Corvette Trivia: What year did the rally wheels make their debut on the Corvette?

While the rally wheels became a fixture on the C3 Corvettes for several years, they actually debuted on the 1967 C2 Corvette as the standard wheel. The aluminum bolt-on wheel was optional.
