SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Lake of the Ozarks Corvette Club held their November meeting at Lake Valley Golf & Country Club on November 14, 2021. President Ellen Ensminger opened the meeting at 12:56 and welcomed everyone. Peggy Sturn introduced her sister Alexis who was visiting. New members at their first meeting, Ed and Lourde Tostenrud; and later during introductions Gary Findlay and MaryAnn Johnson, were welcomed. November birthdays and anniversaries were acknowledged, and the microphone was passed around the room for introductions of members and their cars. In recognition of Veterans Day, Ellen asked all veterans to stand and after a round of applause, thanked them for their service.

Officer reports:

Vice President, Pete Spanos: Membership has passed the 200-mark with 209 members. There must have been a membership drive in November as we added at least 12 new members. Per the LOCC Guidelines, Pete introduced the new board and officers for 2022. They are: President: Pete Spanos; Vice President: Mike Funk; Secretary: Peggy Sturn; Treasurer: Marlin Hammond; NCM Ambassador: Dave Chapman; Newsletter Editor: Sandy Funk; Webmaster: Melody Spanos; PR: Don Sturn; Club Communications: Ron Wehmeyer. Pete thanked the board for all their hard work and for agreeing to stay on for next year. Ellen commented that this is a hard-working board, who are committed and love the club; everyone should show their appreciation.

Secretary Peggy Sturn: This is one of our biggest meetings with 73 people and 30 Corvettes.

Treasurer, Marlin Hammond:

The car show account started with a balance of \$3,345.28, with deposits of \$770 and disbursements of \$46.19 for an ending balance of \$4,069.27. A healthy balance due to registrations and sponsor monies coming in, but there will be expenditures coming up.

Dues for 2022 need to be paid at this time. They are \$45. Can pay together with Christmas party payment. The cost is \$47.17 per person; \$94.34 per couple, which Marlin needs to get as soon as possible. Margaritaville needs a headcount by Nov. 19.

Marlin has 6 LOCC afghans left at \$35. If you need name tags, the cost went up, they will be \$17.50. Got another order of gray shirts that are \$15 each. Will be getting more orange shirts that the volunteer workers will be wearing at the show. Marlin has lapel pins, window decals, business cards. Has one club patch left, but can get more; they're \$5. Marlin has ordered 300 show shirts that are Cornflower Blue.

A side-line event for next year is on May 10 when the Springfield Cardinals will have a day game that we can attend. It's the only one on the schedule and Marlin thinks they scheduled it just for us.

NCM Ambassador Dave Chapman: Dave reported that the NCM will be present again at the car show next year. They were very pleased and impressed with the show this year and are planning a much bigger and better participation next year. Dave is in the beginning stages for planning the Bowling Green trip for next year. Hopefully, by then the COVID restrictions in Kentucky will be more relaxed and we will have access to more dining facilities. Working on getting track time. New Business:

- The Veterans Parade was on November 6. Not a long parade but LOCC had a good showing of 15 cars. Ellen's rider was Winston dressed in camo in honor of canine veterans.
- Rudy reported on the LOCC Christmas party on Dec. 4th at Margaritaville Lake Resort. There will be contests, games, picture taking, socializing and door prizes. At 6:30, Joe Farrell, who is well-known in the area, will provide entertainment. If you want to participate in the gift exchange, bring a \$20 gift per person. After the exchange, there will be a drawing from the participants for a gift basket. The after party will be in the Presidential Suite. The entertainment committee included Rudy, Kathy, Parker, Marybelle and Ellen. Ellen stated that the Cocktail Hour is at 5:00; Dinner starts at 6:00, which will be a buffet. The \$47.17 includes gratuity and tax and entertainment. Ellen invited everyone to the Presidential Suite for the after party. It is BYOB and bring a snack. Corvettes in Paradise 2022:

- Registrations: Peggy reported that we have 65 cars registered representing six states. Marlin added to let anyone know who is interested in registering to get it in soon if they want to be inside with the first 100 entries.
- Trophies / Shirts: Marlin stated we will be giving away 57 trophies for the show and looks like we're on track to have 100 sponsorships for next year; this year's was around 50. Awards, trophies, and the shirts are our biggest cost. Marlin has ordered 300 show shirts. They're the same fabric and will have the same logo as the orange shirts, but with the show year indicated. If you know what you'd like, let Marlin know what size, S thru 3X, and he will put aside for you. They are \$15 for members and people registering for the show who pre-order. We have 60 shirts ordered by show registrants right now. Will be selling them at the show for \$20.

Sponsorships: Mike Funk thanked Marlin for the fantastic job designing the sponsor plaques and passed around two sample plaques for everyone to see. Sponsorship drive is going extremely well. Mike has already handed in \$2,600 in sponsorship money. If you know of a restaurant or business not on the list, let Mike know.

If everyone does just a little bit, it will be easier and more successful. When approaching sponsors, explain to them that the money is going back to the local charities. Mike has flyers with the sponsorship form attached; grab a couple if you know of any potential sponsors. A new list will be going out with additions; please look it over as there have been changes. If there isn't a member name behind a sponsor, jump in and contact them but let Mike know so there is no duplication of effort. The minimum amount is \$100 for a sponsor plaque with their name on it. Have had some give more. Sponsors are encouraged to attend the show to choose and present their plaques to their favorite Corvette. If unable to attend, LOCC members will select and present. Trophy sponsors have all been spoken for, but it is \$300 to cover cost of trophies for a class. David Lantz is in charge of the goodie bags and has already contacted about 20 organizations to make commitments for goody bag items. We also want to support the sponsors throughout the year, which we have done with happy hours and gatherings. Ellen suggested we let potential sponsors know that the LOCC has 209 members who will support their businesses.

The 50-50 drawing for \$91 went to Sandy Funk...to a chorus of groans since this was two in a row for the lucky Funks! Congrats!




1979 Engineering Development Corvette Unveiled

At the National Corvette Museum's 27th Anniversary Event, Derek E. Moore, Director of Collections and Curator, joined Zach Bredfield, Preservation Intern, to discuss "Rebuilding the 1979 Engineering Development Corvette." Bredfield was the 2021 Summer Preservation Intern from McPherson College, located in Kansas. Bredfield is currently pursuing a Bachelor of Science degree in Automotive Restoration with an emphasis in History. Zach, influenced by his grandfather's passion for cars, has been a Corvette fan since he was a child.

During his internship, one of the many projects he was assigned to was working on the 1979 Engineering Development Corvette. When Zach arrived at the Museum back in May, the body and frame were separated, but the cracked front fender had already been repaired. Some of the tasks Bredfield performed himself were mating the body to the chassis, fully installing all interior components, touching up the paint, wet sanding, and polishing the entire car.

The collections team set out to preserve the 1979 Corvette and not necessarily restore it. The team guided Bredfield in the preservation process, and Bredfield quickly learned that it is a different process from the restoration. This allowed him to develop stronger mechanical skills. On the last day of Bredfield internship, they were able to install a new engine. The engine used was as close as possible to the original, but they were able to use many original parts that were periodically appropriate.




Zach working on the 1979 Development Engineering Corvette.

During Bredfield's preservation internship, he was exposed to many different opportunities. He was able to attend the Cincinnati Concours, deliver a car to Washing D.C., and attend the Keeneland Concours. He also spent time learning how to revive cars, perform car show prep, shutdown procedures, and Museum level conservation. Bredfield found it to be extremely educational and fun to be exposed to a new level of work that he had never been exposed to prior. Bredfield is now able to be a voice at his college about museums and preservation methods because of his time spent at the NCM. The preserved 1979 Corvette was unveiled during the presentation to show Zach and the team's beautiful work!

CORVETTE RACING NEWS



Chevrolet and Corvette Racing claimed all three full-season GT Le Mans titles of the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship. This year, Chevrolet claimed its 14th Manufacturers title in GT racing. Antonio Garcia and Jordan Taylor went back-to-back as Drivers champions while the No. 3 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C8.R repeated as Team title-winners. Chevrolet and Corvette Racing won 7 times in the IMSA Championship and claimed a pole position in each GTLM race heading into Petit Le Mans. No. 4 Corvette C8.R teammates Tommy Milner and Nick Tandy finished second in GTLM points with the start of today's race. Milner and Tandy were also contributors in the Manufacturers Championship with three victories and two pole positions.

Corvette Racing will return to IMSA in January for the season-opening Rolex 24 At Daytona in the new GTD PRO category. That effort will go along with a single-car entry in the FIA World Endurance Championship.
