# President Spanos' Monthly Report




#### Members,

NCM Ambassador, Dave Chapman: Dave suggested, with the holidays coming up, that a museum membership or other NCM merchandise would make a nice gift for LOCC members. He reported that the new NCM administration is geared towards preserving the museum past, present and future and is going in new directions. They are wanting to ensure the members' dues and donations are being used wisely. The store has been updated and remodeled and they are bringing in new items. Dave went on to list the benefits of becoming an NCM member, including a 10% discount, a great magazine subscription, lapel pins and discounted entry to other car museums around the country. Regarding plant tours, the Z06 is in production and a few are trickling out but it is a slow process due to supply issues. Tours are happening and they have tours booked up into Jan. Dave asked Don Sturn to talk about the tour he and Peggy recently took.

Don gave plant production numbers for C8s the past three years. Production for 2022 saw a 28% drop because of constraints. With there being no tours for the past five years, it was exciting to be able to go in. Don and Peggy invited Ellen along and did one of the first tours. You aren't able to take any purses, phones, cameras, anything into the plant. The tour guides are new and ours had only done 3 before ours. The tours will improve as they get more experience. The tour was 90 minutes and involved about 1.5 miles of walking because the \$450 million paint plant – the star of the tour – was on the opposite end of the plant. It includes 3 floors and 800,000 sq. ft. with 19 vertical lifts, 51 robots and 240 employees. The tour allowed a sample view of the new technology thru a window where the huge robot "arms" can be seen applying the various colors. The assembly line portion is pretty much the same but the guides have transmitters and everyone gets a receiver with ear buds so you can hear better. We hoped to see the water blast testing area but that is no longer shown. Those who have been on the annual tours before will see the changes but, especially if you have never toured the plant, it is incredible. If you have any questions, ask Don.

Club Communications, Ron Wehmeyer: Ron reminded everyone that whenever he passes on an email for someone requiring a response, you need to be sure to send your response to their email address and not simply hit "Reply" - which goes only to Ron rather than to the person who needs your information.

Ron went on to say that while he and Kathy were in St. Lucia, they got married. (Congratulations!) Also, while there, he received an email from Pete requesting he buy gift cards for him, which Ron did once he returned to the US. After not getting replies from Pete re delivery of the cards, Ron called him and learned the email request was bogus. 


#### **LEBANON CHRISTMAS PARADE**



## Chevy Outlines the Next Three Monthly Order Cycles for Stingray and Z06

Chevrolet sent their dealers an email on Monday outlining the next three months of <u>ordering for the Stingray and Z06 models</u>. If you hoping for a more normalized ordering process for America's newest sportscar, we are sorry to bring you this disappointing news.

Before we get to that, we are currently in the middle of the second order cycle for the Z06. Last Thursday, Chevy sent out new Z06 allocations to dealers, and typically that would be followed up on this Thursday with dealers submitting orders. However, because of the Thanksgiving holiday, we are most likely looking at next Thursday for the latest constraints to drop and dealers submitting orders.

When those constraints come in next Thursday (Nov. 30th), we believe that the High Wing Aero Package will have extremely low quantities nationwide to order, and then dealers can start to match up those orders to customers. Many of these first Z06 orders are so heavily optioned that some dealers during the first Order Cycle in August had to go way down their lists to fill those Standard Aero Z06 allocations, and that will probably be the case again next week. If you think you are low on your dealers list and would accept a non-Z07 build, you should be waving your hands high and yelling "Pick Me!"

Now back to this week's dealer communication from Chevrolet. The memo lays out the ordering dates for the next three months, but nowhere does it specify Z06, so once again, dealers assume that the Z06 ordering will happen anytime a month has a second DOSP planned. FYI, DOSP stands for Dealer Order Submission Process.

For December 2022, there is only one DOSP planned. Dealers will receive their allocations (or Consensus) on December 8th and then the Constraints and Ordering will come on December 15th.

For January 2023, there again is only one DOSP planned with the Consensus coming on January 12th and Constraints and Ordering will open on January 19th.

Finally, in February 2023, there are two DOSP cycles planned, and we believe Chevy will follow the previous trends of holding the Stingray DOSP first, and then the 2nd being the Z06 cycle. The first DOSP will begin on February 2nd, and orders will start on February 9th. The second DOSP begins on February 16th, and orders will happen on February 23rd.

For the current Z06 order cycle we are in now, these orders show the targeted production build dates starting in January 2023. With the next Z06 order cycle closing in late February, those orders may see a targeted production date beginning in April. Again, that could be subject to change based on strength of the supply chain and other factors known and unknown.

The obvious next question is, will Chevrolet take another pause for a month or two on Z06 ordering after February's DOSP, or will we be able to get to a monthly order cycle for the new car? Only time will tell.
