
Misc:

Several LOCC members have attended Ron Fellows Performance Driving School after purchasing a new Corvette. For those that have not yet had the opportunity, it is a great learning experience. Upon purchasing a new Corvette, the new owner has one year to redeem a coupon from Chevrolet to attend the school for \$1000, or anyone can sign up and take the course for \$3,695.

Located in Pahrump, Nevada (approximately one hour from the Las Vegas airport), the course spans over two days and includes one night's lodging, breakfast and lunch for the two days. For an extra \$40, you can bring a guest who is allowed to sit through the classroom topics and experiences the thrill of the track with an experienced instructor. Participants learn more about the features of the C8 Stingray, including the driving modes and how they should be used, and other aspects of the Corvette that makes it track capable. They also experience driving on a track, an autocross course as well as shifting and braking exercises. Members, Mike Funk and Bill Stone attended the course on October 30 & 31st with Sandy in tow.

Set in the Mojave Desert and situated by the California border, the beauty of seeing a chain of midengine C8 Corvettes snake around the track curves with the purplish peaks of the Spring Mountains

in the background is an incredible experience. Drivers are also instructed on how to properly launch the C8 and participated in a competitive autocross course. The instructors were top notch, including lead instructor, former Indy Car driver, Richie Hearn.

After Mike and Bill successfully completed the course, the group returned to Las Vegas for a couple days of Vegas frivolity, including seeing the new Las Vegas Sphere and enjoying the sights and sounds of the "the city that never sleeps".
