### Car Show Update:

Pete read the list of goodie bag sponsors and their donations, which included Ameren, Lake Printing, NCM, and O'Reilly's in Eldon to name a few. If anyone has any other businesses they can reach out to for goodie bag donations, ask for 150 items.


