

A TALE OF DRIVING THE TAIL...

In the early morning of June 13, seven LOCC Corvettes left Lebanon for what should have been an approximately 8 hour drive to Cookeville, TN for a night's rest before continuing another three hours to the infamous, Tail of the Dragon in far Eastern Tennessee. The first night's stay in Cookeville was a short night, arriving almost three hours later than anticipated following a lengthy traffic delay outside of Nashville. Nevertheless, the group arose in the morning and set off on the last three hours of their journey. The Tale is an 11 mile, two lane section of US 129, featuring 318 turns. Not for timid drivers, the Tail is quite challenging as one tries to navigate the sharp, winding road while antici-

pating meeting an oncoming vehicle at the next blind corner. While the Harley motorcycles are prevalent, the real star of the Tail is the "Metrics" bikes as one Harley rider called them. These bikes are much more nimble and can navigate the turns and hills much quicker than a four wheeled vehicle. The group of seven LOCC Corvettes did a quick tour of the Tale together, then a few drove back up and down again before heading off to the Blue Waters Lodge in Robbinsville, NC. While the Tail begins in Tennessee, it ends in North Carolina. You cross the state line towards the end of the 11 mile drive.

The Lodge was a quaint, two story cedar cabin with individual rooms and bathrooms, a main living and dining area. The accommodations were nestled perfectly in the Smokies with a serene view of Santeetlah Lake, only to be described as something from a Bob Ross painting. Serving breakfast and lunch as part of the stay, they also featured a bar-b-que by the lake on Friday evening and menu service Saturday evening. The group even spent an evening on the front porch "socializing", if you can imagine?

The Tail of the Dragon is not the only road attraction in the area, with hundreds of scenic miles to drive and enjoy a Corvette. The group enjoyed a beautiful, relaxing drive through the mountains on Saturday. Hitting the highest elevation of 5,390 feet, the group was in awe of the majestic surroundings that day.


On Sunday, five of the seven cars made the long trek home in one day while one car extended their trip by travelling to the Vanderbilt mansion, Biltmore, in Asheville North Carolina an hour and a half away. The final car travelled back to southeast Missouri to visit the Missouri National Veterans Memorial in Perryville and then travelled across the river to Chester, IL to see the home of Popeye creator, Elzie Segar. You can find statues throughout the small river town of all the Popeye characters.

As everyone knows, traveling in smaller groups can be more conducive when visiting far distances through large cities such as Nashville. Also, driving on a challenging road which happens to be extremely busy would require smaller groups. If you get a chance to plan a trip for your group, this would be a must do. While two days of driving through the mountains was perfect, a third day would be recommended to relax on the lake before a long drive home!
