Meeting Minutes

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The monthly meeting of the Lake of the Ozarks Corvette Club was held on April 10, 2022, at H. Toad's Bar & Grill, Lake Ozark, MO. President Pete Spanos opened the meeting at 12:18 and thanked the staff of H. Toad's for the outstanding job they did getting food out quickly with so many people here. Pete next welcomed new members and asked each to stand and introduce themselves.

Welcome to new members David Fry & MJ, Roger & Sherry Brose, Arlen & Tammy Walker, Tom & Georgia Vincent and Harry & Marcia Naught. Next were general introductions of members and their cars followed by April birthdays and anniversaries.

When announcing his and Marlene's 61st anniversary on April 1st, Don Wormsley informed the club that Marlene sadly is not well and said goodbye to the club for Marlene. Our hearts and prayers go out to Don and Marlene and the Wormsley family. Don went on to comment on how the club has grown and related the story for all the newcomers of how the club began 22 years ago this month. Don named all the presidents and their terms from 2000 to present.

Car Show Update:

Sponsors: Mike Funk reported that the sponsors are unbelievable, and we will have over \$12,000, which is double what we had last year. That is sponsor money only. Mike thanked all those who have done an outstanding job recruiting sponsors.

Peggy Sturn stated we have 119 registrations now and that we are up to 10 states represented. Volunteers have been contacted with their duties. There will be reserved parking for LOCC volunteers and members attending the show in the Edgewater building across from the main entrance. Everyone needs to put their LOCC decal in the windshield of whatever vehicle they are driving in order to help the LOCC parking monitors know you are from the club. Also, LOCC members are asked to avoid arriving for the show between 9:45 to 10:15 to allow all volunteers to be at the 10a Opening Ceremony.

Don Sturn reported that he had a 27-minute interview on KRMS last week that went well. There will be one more interview before the show and they will be broadcasting remotely at the Meet & Greet on Friday. The article regarding the show that Don submitted was in the newspaper twice. He has also submitted a write-up on the Enid show.

David Lantz still has a few things coming in for the goody bags. He has received an incredible number of items. David brought in a sample goody bag for everyone to see all that is in them.

Marlin Hammond thanked everyone for all the work that has been done for the show. We have 62 sponsor plaques and 65 trophies. There are 1st, 2nd, 3rd place trophies for coupes & convertibles in each class; and Best of Show, Margaritaville, Mayor's and LO Profile trophies. A trophy for Furthest Traveled was added. It is an old-fashioned gas pump, which is appropriate with today's gas prices. Marlin should know on Monday when next year's show will be. We are shooting for April 29th, 2023.

Mike Funk further reported that Hulett's is the biggest money donor toward shirts, which will have their logo on the sleeve. LO Profile Magazine is the premier sponsor for the Meet & Greet on Friday night, providing the food stations and background music.

Pete Spanos gave a shout out to car show steering committee members for the remarkable feat of working through and putting all this together. This is the last meeting before the show. The amount of work going into making it a good event is considerable. It is all for charity, and with sponsorships more than double of last year's our donations will be considerable. The volunteers and committee members deserve a round of applause, which all there provided.

We have talked about possibly staging our Corvettes outside if there is space. Pete asked volunteers to please bring 2-way radios and chairs if working with parking or outside.

Officer reports:

Vice President, Mike Funk: Membership, with two members joining today, is 202. Mike commented that the board is part of this body and to let us know if there is something you would like done.

Newsletter Editor Sandy Funk: Sandy hopes to have the May newsletter out before the show. She will be doing a special edition newsletter for the show in May as was done last year. Sandy showed the attractive LOCC aprons they had made for selling 50-50 tickets at the show.

Webmaster Melody Spanos: Melody updated the website with all the Enid show pictures. Day trips are on there as well.

Secretary Peggy Sturn: Peggy announced we have broken the record with 93 people here and 42 Corvettes outside.

NCM Ambassador Dave Chapman: Dave thanked those who have transitioned from trial membership to full NCM membership, saying the NCM appreciates it. Dave spoke with the NCM and reported that there are no plant tours yet. Dave checked on availability for a trip there and found it is greatly reduced this year because things have opened up more down there. There are a limited number of dates during the usual time we travel. If we are going to do something we have to react pretty quickly. Dave asked for a show of hands of who would be interested in doing a trip. A good number raised their hands. The Board will be meeting about this to decide if there is going to be a trip this year. Dave will send out an email either way.

Treasurer, Marlin Hammond: Marlin reported the following for the general account:

Beginning bank balance – 03/01/22:	\$9,105.71
Deposits:	280.00
Disbursements:	613.00
Ending bank balance – 03/31/22:	\$ 8,772.71

The car show account beginning balance was \$11,504 with \$5,170 in deposits and no disbursements for an ending balance of \$16,674. We will spend quite a bit of that on shirts, koozies, trophies, plaques and banners.

About 28 people have expressed interest in the Springfield Cardinals Baseball game. It will be a 11:30a game on Tuesday, May 10; it will also be the educational kids' day. We will parade our cars around the field which the kids and players warming up love. We will have food and special Red Bird Reserved seating for which we have to have at least 30 people. The cost is \$29 per ticket which includes the game, food, and a hat. See Marlin to sign up.

If you need LOCC decals, Marlin has some with him. Also, you can order name tags, for \$15 apiece. He also has LOCC afghans for sale, business cards to take to car shows, and money clips and key fobs for those who pay their dues.

New Business:

- LCTC sent Pete their scholarship applicant info. Two were picked from the four we received (one wasn't qualified). Still waiting for Eldon's candidates. If there's no one from Eldon, we will adjust the LCTC scholarships, which will be presented on May 10 at 6pm. Pete will send something out for anyone who is interested in attending.

-Hot Summer Nights is May 13. We will have the same parking as the last two year by the Indian.

-Ellen Ensminger announced the 3rd annual Darryl Bias Memorial Cruise on Saturday, April 16, which will leave from the Versailles Sonic at 10:30am and go to the Ozark International Raceway for a tour and pace lap. Lunch is at Sunrise Cantina afterwards and then ice cream in Osage Beach.

- Ellen further reported that the Warm Springs Ranch tour will be Saturday, June 18. We have two tours of 20 people each and will all travel together. The first tour is at 10:30, the next is at 11. Ellen is looking at the Hotel Fredrick, which is an historic hotel, for lunch. It is a really neat place.

- Ed Carr will be leading a day trip to Bixby, MO on Saturday, May 14. There is still time to sign up. The group will meet at Lowes at 9:30.

- Jerry Elhmann announced the Hot Rod Party at their house on June 4th. All of LOCC and the other two car clubs are invited. Bring your own drinks and a side dish; they'll have plenty of chairs. The DJ starts at 2p, so you can show up around then.

- Sandy Funk talked about the Dogwood Parade that is April 23rd in Camdenton. If interested, send Sandy an email. We need to be at Camdenton HS before 9a. This is a no candy throwing event.

- Melody led the trip to Enid, OK for their Corvette show last weekend. It was a small group from the club, but a great time. Steve & Brenda Myers, Mike & Sandy Funk, Melody, and Jerry Elhmann all won class awards with Jerry also winning Best of Show. Sandy modeled their show shirt with a picture of the previous year's Best of Show in the logo design; it is also on the class award plaques. Jerry's car will be on the show logo next year. There were 92 total cars there. That included 32 from the local club who competed separately from the show. Melody liked the background music that played during the show and suggested we do that for ours.

-Pete reported on the Board of Directors meeting on March 27th. One agenda item was a recommendation to change the terms of board members to coincide with the car show. After discussion, it was decided to keep the current terms but the Vice President must be a member of the car show committee so there is continuity for the show. There were three separate votes regarding NCM. One, whether to continue our business membership. Ours has a 5-year term with a couple years left before it expires. The Board agreed we will wait until that time to decide if we will renew. Second was whether we will continue to feature the NCM on our website and in our newsletter. It was decided we will. Third, is whether to cancel the LOCC trip to Bowling Green this year. The vote was tabled until this meeting in order to see the level of interest for doing a trip, which Dave asked for during his report. With that knowledge, the Board will meet and vote after the meeting. Pete stated the guidelines will be updated to reflect the change to the Vice President requirement and will be published.

-Mike Funk announced that Randy Gross is involved with Hot Summer Nights, and he has asked for volunteers from the car clubs to help with monitoring traffic at the HSN events. They are the 2nd Friday of each month, May thru Oct. from 5p to 10p. If anyone is interested, contact Randy Gross.

Rudy Willingham invited everyone to do a drive around the local area after the meeting and stop at Kathy's for "deck time", snack and shots.

Mike Waite asked if anyone had done the Route 66 tour from Chicago to Los Angeles as he will be doing it in August. No one had so he will let us know how it goes.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 1:31 p.m.

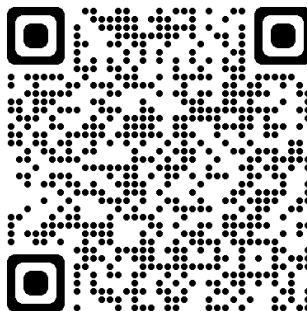

THE NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM ANNOUNCES PLANS FOR NEW EDUCATION GALLERY

The National Corvette Museum (NCM) is pleased to announce plans for a fully reimagined, 2,000-square-foot dedicated education gallery. The new space, tentatively scheduled to open in late 2022/early 2023, will allow the NCM to provide a state-of-the-art educational experience geared directly to the next generation of Corvette enthusiasts, engineers, designers, and more.



The General Motors Technical Center in Warren, Michigan will serve as the design inspiration for the National Corvette Museum's new Education Gallery. Just as the Tech Center has served as a beacon of inspiration, so too will this new gallery space.

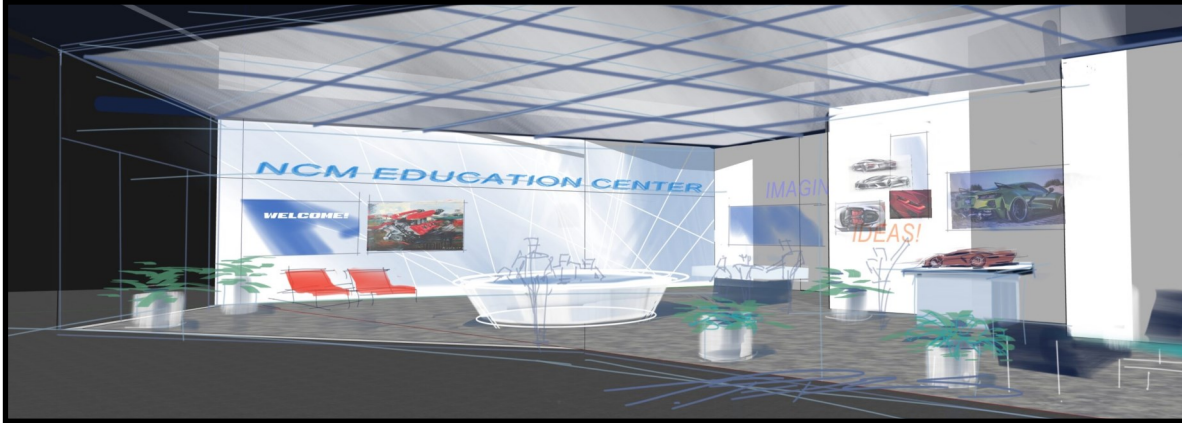
Plans are being created by Sewell and Sewell Architects, and the gallery is being constructed by Scott, Murphy & Daniel. Tapped to assist in the design of the space is Tom Peters, former Director of Exterior Design for the GM Performance Car Studio and 2019 Corvette Hall of Fame Inductee. The General Motors Technical Center is the inspiration for the overall design theme of the updated gallery.

According to Deb Howard, Museum Educator, "The new education gallery will be designed for both children and adults to enjoy, featuring artifacts and interactive technology celebrating the unique story of Corvette. The new space will not only serve guests visiting from out of town with youth-centric content for families to enjoy, but it will also serve as a space to engage our local community schools with standards-based STREAM education, learning opportunities, and new educational programming."



This exciting project is made possible by the generosity of donors Tim and Melanie McMichael of Gypsum, Colorado. According to Tim, "It has always been our dream to be a part of an educational experience that could spark a fire or be the catalyst for a child to see that it is possible for them to do or be anything in the world – from an astronaut, to a doctor, to a car designer." Melanie continued, "A children's education gallery will provide a different lens for children to view how a car works and possibly change the way they think and, even further, instill in them a passion that will push them to do something amazing with their lives."

Sharon Brawner, President and CEO of the National Corvette Museum, echoed the sentiments of the McMichael's. "Whether we are teaching our youngest visitors on a student field trip or welcoming motor-coaches full of tourists from states away, the goal of the National Corvette Museum is to inspire our guests and leave them wanting to know more. This new gallery will educate, engage, and entertain our guests, and we thank Tim and Melanie McMichael for their generosity in helping us realize this vision."

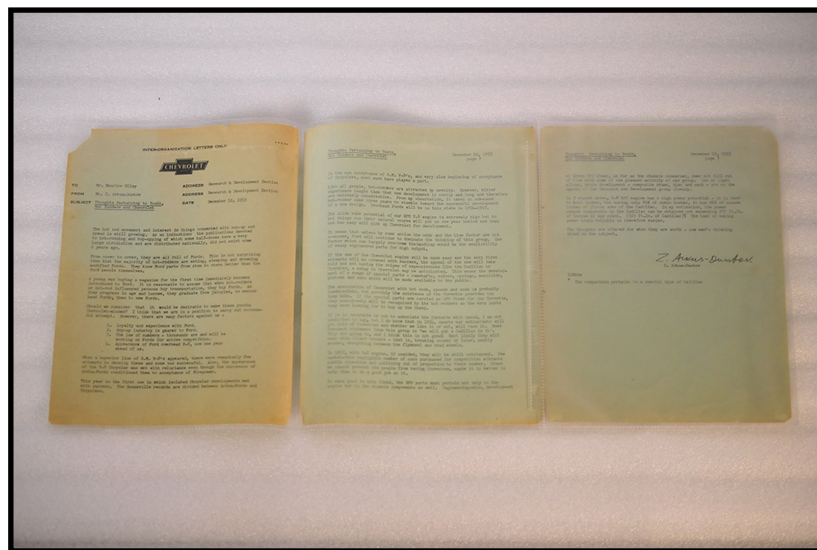
THE TURNING POINT

This three-page internal memo, written by Russian-born engineer/race car driver Zora Arkus-Duntov, marked a turning point in the history of Corvette and performance vehicles at General Motors.

Zora had already made a name for himself racing and developing cars with Allard, Porsche, and Daimler-Benz. He had also come up with the overhead valve conversions for the Ford V8 engines, dramatically increasing horsepower. When he saw the Corvette debuted at the 1953 Motorama, he was impressed with the way the car looked but quickly realized that the Corvette lacked the performance that sports car enthusiasts expected. He wrote to Ed Cole, then Chief Engineer for Chevrolet, about ways the Corvette could be improved. Zora was hired shortly after that as an Assistant Staff Engineer for Chevrolet.

Being a race car driver himself, Zora could see that Ford was building a reputation among those who were looking for higher performance, with no real answer from General Motors. He saw Corvette as a vehicle for changing that.

He wrote this impassioned letter titled, "Thoughts Pertaining to Youth, Hot Rodders and Chevrolet" to Ed Cole and Maurice Olley, the head of R&D Engineering. In it, Zora makes the case that Corvette should get the performance upgrades it needed to compete with Ford and win over racers and "hot rodders."

His persistence would lead to the V8 going into Corvette in 1955, and ultimately the small block Chevrolet V8 engine would become the most universally accepted racing engine in the world.

The original letter was later presented to Herb Fishel by Zora, in recognition of the work Herb was doing as the Executive Director of GM Racing. Herb would then donate this historic document to the National Corvette Museum on September 4, 2015, saying, "This is the most important document in the history of Chevrolet Performance, and it belongs in the Corvette Museum."

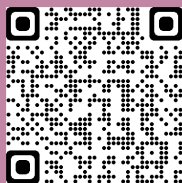

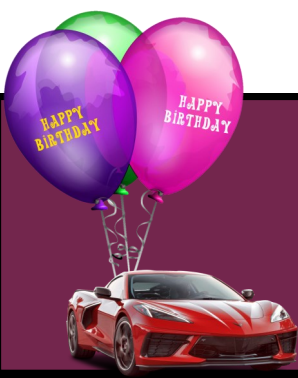
