<u>LOCC Adventures</u> <u>Across our</u> <u>Beautiful Country!</u>

Driving south out of Kentucky's Bourbon Trail this past August, LOCC members Mark and Joellen Sperfslage, Don and Peggy Sturn, and Gary and Linda Markus readied themselves for Tennessee's famous "Tail of the Dragon" at Deals Gap. The Dragon is an 11-mile stretch of two-lane paved road, designated U.S. 129, with 318 curves. The Dragon is purportedly America's #1 spot for sport car and motorcycle enthusiasts, The Great Smoky Mountains and the Cherokee National Forests border it, with no intersecting roads or driveways to interrupt the route. Switchback turns are tight (10 & 5 mph), frequent and give all drivers an adrenaline rush.

After a spirited drive on the Dragon, the vette trio headed east on NC 28 past the forested beauty of Cheoah Lake to the serene majesty of Fontana Lake and Dam. The group checked into their lodging at Fontana Villiage Resort, set amongst the pristine beauty of the Nantahala National Forest. The resort served as base for the next three full days of exploring the area. The Blue Ridge Parkway hosted outstanding roads through the mountains, which sit a short ride from Graham County. A leisurely drive through the Great Smoky Mountains included climbing 4,000 feet leaving Cherokee which offered a unique perspective on the natural beauty of the area. The group also visited various waterfalls along the 36 miles of the Cherohala Skyway which is considered one of the most gorgeous roads in North Carolina.

Mark and Joellen then departed for their lowa home while the Sturn and Markus vettes continued east for a visit to the legendary Biltmore House & Gardens in Asheville, NC. George Vanderbilt's 250 - room chateau is a marvel of elegance and grandeur and takes visitors back to a gracious time and place in American history. It was certainly a high point in a great Corvette trip!
