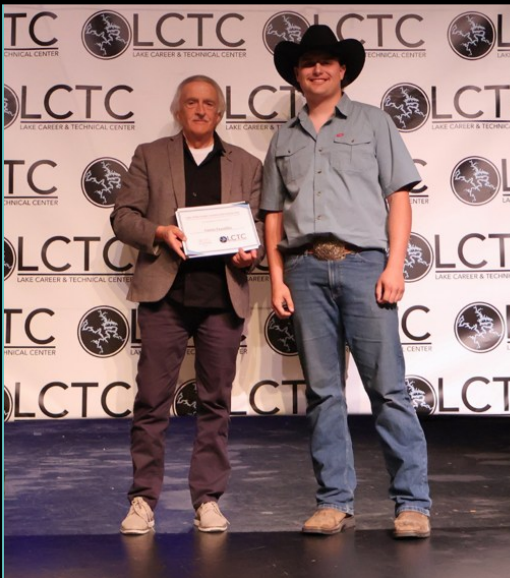

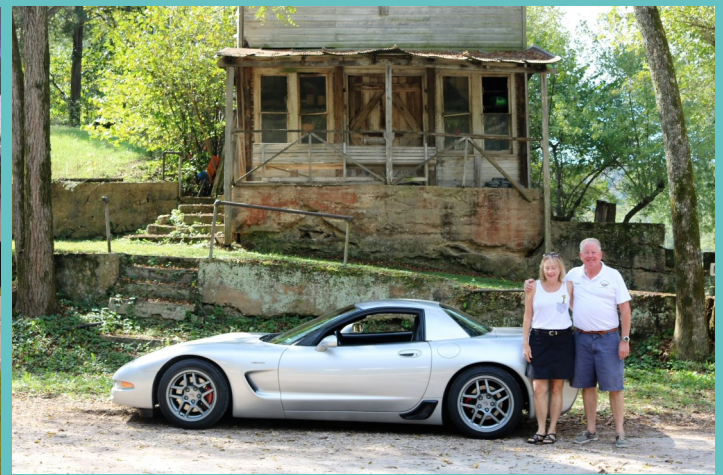
How I Came to Own My 2002 Z06

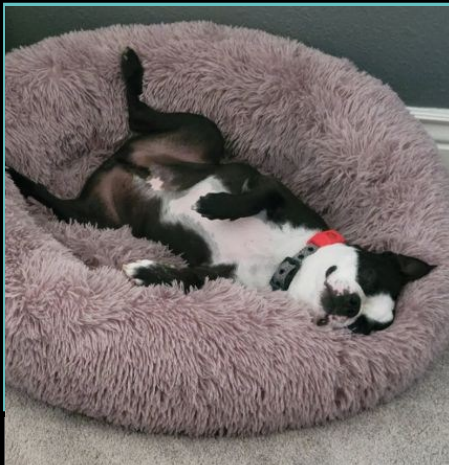
