In fact, **a recent poll** indicates that Conservatives are now at a 7-point lead over the Liberals! I would be remiss not to mention the huge win we've had this month for freedom. By October 1st, the ArriveCan App, border vaccine requirements, quarantine measures, and federal mask mandates will no longer be mandatory. This win is a direct result of the relentless pressure you as citizens have placed on elected officials. I want to thank all of you for your courage, and for taking your civic responsibility seriously. I've heard from so many of you over the past months on the gross overstep of government especially as it relates to their pandemic response measures, and I stood with you. And while we certainly celebrate this success, there are still questions that need to be asked, and answers had. The government must and will be held accountable for their overreach.

Let farmers do their job:

As we approach Thanksgiving, I want to especially thank our farmers for their hard work in feeding Canadian families and the world. This task is especially important at a time when there are real concerns about a global food shortage. And yet, the Liberal Government seems determined to stand in their way. From a relentless carbon tax to a severe target for reducing fertilizer emissions, they are punishing farmers. With rising food costs, it's clear that this hurts everyone. As one of Saskatchewan's producers said last week, "We need to feed the world," and the government should let them do their job. I assure you that I'm going to keep fighting for the Southwest in Ottawa—just as I did **in this statement** in the House of Commons:

I recently came across an **article in the Global and Mail** by Charles Burton, which I found concerning. According to Safeguard Defenders, the Chinese Public Security Bureau has “established more than 50 overseas police service centres in cities around the world – including three publicly documented ones in Toronto, home to Canada’s largest Chinese diaspora.” These bureaus are packaged as support centres to help with basic needs such as drivers’ licence renewals, but reports show that Chinese police are also persuading alleged criminals to return to China and face the courts there. As Charles Burton states, “This represents a gross violation of Canada’s national sovereignty, international law and the norms of diplomacy. China is extending the grip of its

Orwellian police state into this country, with seemingly no worry about being confronted by our own national security agencies.” All this, while the Liberal Government turns a blind eye.

I'm growing concerned about China's increasing infiltration into our democratic state, but would also be interested in knowing what your thoughts are. Feel free to let me know by replying to this email.
