November was another busy month in Ottawa, as Conservatives held this government accountable for their failures. I recently spoke with a constituent whose farm heating bill will increase by \$700 once the carbon tax maxes out. Time and time again, this Prime Minister has claimed that his senators are independent, and he has no control over what they do. We all know that is an abject lie. It's time he drops the charade and tells his senators to support C-234.

On the 30th, I gave a statement in the House of Commons on the recent claim by the Canadian Human Rights Commission that Christmas is “systemic religious discrimination”. How absurd. 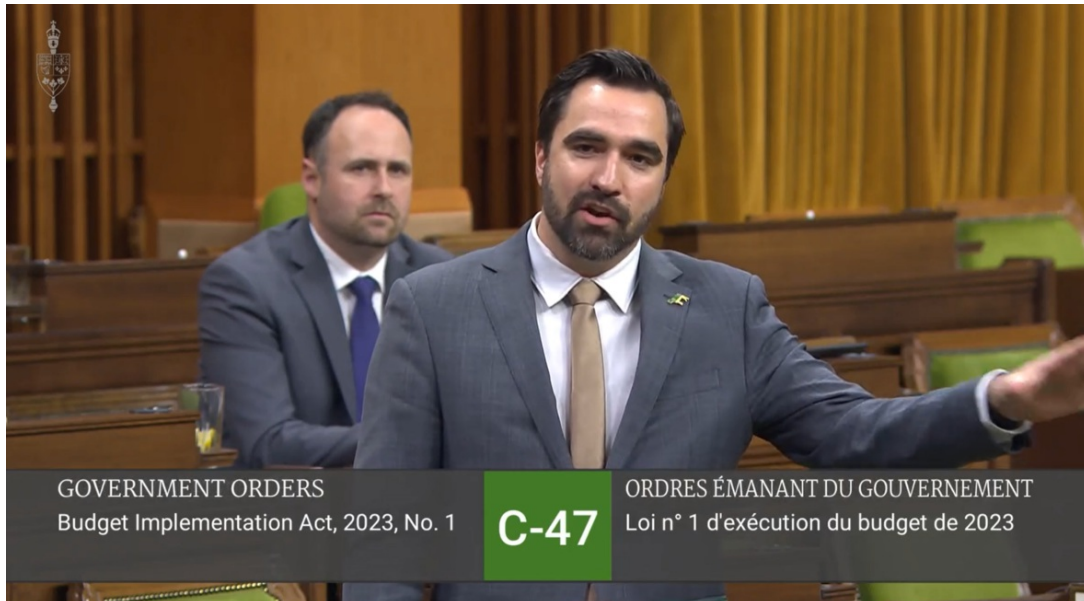
New Suicide helpline:

On November 30th, the Government launched 988, the national suicide prevention hotline. Available 24 hours per day, 365 days per year, Canadians struggling with suicidal thoughts no longer have to search for a 10-digit phone number. With just three taps of the keypad – 988 – Canadians that need help can reach someone to talk to. Nearly 10 Canadians per day die by suicide – a statistic that I very much hope will change in the coming future with this hotline. Thank you to my colleague Todd Doherty, Member of Parliament for Cariboo-Prince George, for presenting this in his Private Member's Bill

Fiscal responsibility?

Last week, this government tabled their Fall economic statement, which included more taxes, more debt, and no fiscal responsibility in sight. Over the next six years, it's projected that it will cost every Canadian man, woman, and child over eight thousand dollars to cover the interest on the debt. Now, the Liberals want to keep adding to the debt, and they say that it will take until 2029

for them to balance the budget. Thanks to their reckless debt, the average Canadian now makes over 20,000 dollars less than the average American; under the Conservatives, Canadian workers made more than their American counterparts. Unfortunately, with their continued wasteful spending, the discrepancy just keeps growing. Only a Conservative government will balance the budget and end this unending spiral of taxes and debt.
