

Constitution of The Atomic Mommy Foundation

Preamble

We, the members of The Atomic Mommy Foundation, united by a common purpose to empower aspiring entrepreneurs and support underprivileged parents, establish this Constitution to guide our mission, governance, and operations. This Constitution serves as the foundational document of the Foundation, ensuring transparency, integrity, and accountability in all our endeavors.

Article I: Name

The name of the organization shall be The Atomic Mommy Foundation (hereinafter referred to as the "Foundation").

Article II: Purpose

The purpose of the Foundation is to empower aspiring entrepreneurs and support underprivileged parents by providing scholarships, grants, and resources to help them achieve economic self-sufficiency, innovation, and entrepreneurial success.

Article III: Membership

Section 1: Eligibility

Membership is open to individuals committed to advancing the mission of the Foundation. Members must meet the criteria outlined in the Foundation's bylaws.

Section 2: Rights and Responsibilities

Members have the right to participate in Foundation activities, vote on specific matters, and attend events as per their membership tier. Members are responsible for upholding the values and mission of the Foundation.

Article IV: Governance

Section 1: Board of Directors

The Foundation shall be governed by a Board of Directors. The composition, roles, and election processes of the Board are detailed in the bylaws.

Section 2: Officers

The Officers of the Foundation shall include a CEO, CFO, and other non-voting positions as necessary. Their duties and election processes are outlined in the bylaws.

Section 3: Authority

The Board of Directors holds the ultimate decision-making authority. The President has special decision-making powers under specific circumstances as outlined in the bylaws.

Article V: Meetings

Section 1: General Meetings

General meetings of the Foundation shall be held at least annually to discuss progress, set goals, and address any major issues.

Section 2: Board Meetings

The Board of Directors shall meet bi-weekly, with proper notice given to all members.

Article VI: Finances

Section 1: Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Foundation shall begin on January 1 and end on December 31.

Section 2: Financial Oversight

The financial affairs of the Foundation shall be overseen by the CFO and subject to annual, quarterly, and monthly reviews by the Board.

Article VII: Amendments

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Directors during a regular or special meeting, provided notice of the amendment has been given at least 30 days in advance.

Article VIII: Dissolution

In the event of dissolution, the Foundation's remaining assets shall be used to settle all debts and obligations. Any net proceeds from games of chance shall be allocated as per the guidelines established in the bylaws.

Article IX: Code of Conduct


