Dear Parents and Guardians:

The East Valley High School Charter specifically identifies at risk populations as targeted populations for their school. At origination, EVHS was located in area with a high concentration of low-income, minority population. This includes several low income apartment complexes, low income housing, and large unincorporated areas of far-east Mesa.

The Charter also acknowledges that all students, regardless of at-risk circumstances, deserve a content rich education. EVHS offers classes such as fine art, dancing, instrumental classes, and performing arts opportunities in drama and musical performance. Most of EVHS students have never had an opportunity to participate in enrichment classes such as these. Leaders of the school have also learned that students will attend school more often when they have classes, outside of course requirements, that offer a non-academic way to be successful – and enjoy the process. These classes are academic-based and include art and music history and content knowledge specific to the art.

The Charter also states that individual student's needs will be identified and addressed for each student through needs-based interventions and then monitored with benchmark and formative assessments.

As stated in the school Charter, it is the founders' belief that each student is capable of success. It is the goal of all the staff and EVHS to help each student each his or her highest potential so that they may have a solid foundation on which to build for their future.
