

Emergency Substitute Plans

Time is so limited when you are a teacher, but if you take the time to organize your emergency substitute plans it will benefit you all year long!

Since I have been a teacher (a couple of decades or so), there has been a stigma about teachers taking a sick day or personal day; I even bought into this and went to school sick many times! I put off a surgery until the school break, and when I left a school district, had to be paid out thousands of dollars due to unused days. We need to change this mindset! Maybe if I would have taken those days, I might still be at that district, or would have been in better health, but in the end it was my choice—and I regret it!

If you are sick, stay home. If an appointment or emergency comes up, take the day. They are your days, and are given to you for a reason. Teacher burnout is so prevalent, the number of teachers in the classroom is depleting every year. Teachers work hard, and are oftentimes not paid what they are worth, you are worth it. Take care of yourself!

Creating emergency sub plans is a form of self care. Create plans that are always there and ready. No more coming into school at 5:30 in the morning to make copies; no more coming to school sick. Create a comprehensive plan for substitutes, log your absence and go to bed!
