

Celebrating the 99th anniversary of Black History Month

Honoring Carter G. Woodson: The Father of Black History





Carter G. Woodson, born on December 19, 1875, in New Canton, Virginia, is widely recognized as the "Father of Black History". His dedication to preserving and promoting African American history has left an undeniable mark on our understanding of the past.

In 1926, Woodson initiated Negro History Week, which later evolved into Black History Month. He chose the second week of February to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass, two figures who played significant roles in African American history. Woodson's goal was to encourage the study and celebration of the achievements and contributions of African Americans, which were often overlooked or misrepresented in mainstream history.

Despite facing numerous obstacles, Woodson earned his bachelor's degree from Berea College in 1903, a second bachelor's and a master's degree from the University of Chicago in 1908, and a Ph.D. from Harvard University in 1912, becoming the second African American to earn a doctorate from Harvard.

In 1915, Woodson co-founded the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH) to promote the scientific study of Black life and history. This organization played a crucial role in advancing the field of African American studies.

In 1916, Woodson launched "The Journal of Negro History, a scholarly publication, to provide a platform for research and discussion on African American history. The journal remains an important resource for historians and scholars. He would also publish, "The Mis-Education of the Negro" in 1933. This influential book critiqued the education system's failure to properly educate African Americans and highlighted the importance of self-reliance and cultural pride.

Carter G. Woodson's legacy continues to inspire and educate generations. His tireless efforts to document and celebrate African American history have ensured that the 4 contributions of Black Americans are recognized and remembered.
