8th & 9th Precinct Summer Gun Initiative

On September 25, 2024, U.S. Attorney Dawn Ison and One Detroit were at Heilmann Recreation Center to present crime reports and statistics for the 8th and 9th precincts. The data showed a 21% reduction in homicides and a 24% reduction in non-fatal shootings from Memorial Day to Labor Day. A chart highlighted the drop in incidents from 107 in 2022 to 68 in 2024. Attorney Ison, alongside the Detroit Police Department and community leaders, activate the annual summer gun initiative from Memorial Day through Labor Day to combat gun violence in 8th and 9th precinct. Despite the progress, Attorney Ison voiced her dissatisfaction, saying, "Even with last year's record low violence, it's still not enough." Nevertheless, the initiatives are making a positive impact, and with continued effort, they can achieve the results Attorney Ison is aiming for.

Getting Better Results

Attorney Ison likely aims for further reductions in gun violence and overall crime rates. How can we achieve this? Greater participation in crime prevention programs from community is essential for a more significant and lasting impact. Strengthening partnerships between the police and community leaders is also crucial. Building trust and a sense of safety within communities through our Neighborhood Police Officers (NPOs) is vital. While initiatives can be created, it is the accountability and involvement of community members that ensures a sustainable, long-term reduction in crime.
