

Let's Stay Active...

Our team at Building D4 Community has been diligently working to secure funding for the renovation of the Mapleridge community house, which will host our services and events throughout the year. Earlier this year, Janet Quinn generously donated the house to us. On June 20th, 2024, we launched a GoFundMe campaign with a goal of raising \$20,000. So far, we have collected \$4,135 from 27 donors. With the arrival of the cold season, we are compelled to halt most of our activities due to the lack of a proper headquarters. We have extended our fundraising goal to continue our efforts to reach the necessary amount for the renovation, aiming to emerge stronger in 2025. In the meantime, we encourage the community to utilize the Stoudamire Wellness Hub, which offers free transportation to and from the hub for residents in the following zip codes: 48025, 48207, 48213, 48214, 48215, and 48224.
