Recruiting & Staffing--

Phoenix Police Assistants (PAs), have been added to the civilian side in response, to help with taking calls for service.

Police Assistants do not wear guns. They respond to take reports, accident reports, and burglaries. This provides the victim with the paperwork needed for their insurance company a lot faster. Now the regular Police Officers are responding to Priority 1 & Priority 2 calls for service. Police Assistants are based out of Ahwatukee, working between the Pecos substation and the South Mountain Precinct.

We have full academy classes and we still want to maintain standards.
