Ballroom Dress Code Policy

The SBR Social Dance Club Ballroom Dress Code Policy (Dress Code) is intended to enhance a comfortable and fun social environment for all Club event participants.

Dress code definitions vary depending on the source. These definitions are for the Club only and may not be consistent with other sources. Note the Dress Code is highly recommended attire, however, you will not be asked to leave a Club event if you do not adhere to the Dress Code.

Participants are always welcome to dress up more than is recommended by this Dress Code.

Smart Casual

Sometimes referred to as “dressy” casual it is essentially the same as business casual for both men and women except no jeans or T-shirts.

For Men: slacks or khakis, dress shirt, open-collar or polo shirt, optional tie, or seasonal sport coat; coats can be removed for dancing

For Women: slacks, dress or skirt, blouse, knit shirt or sweater

Shoes: Leather or suede soles with non-marking heels recommended. Do not wear sneakers or other shoes with rubber or spongy soles. They can stick to the floor during turns and spins and may cause ankle and knee injuries.

Semi-Formal or Casual Elegant

A little more “dressy” than smart casual.

For women: evening gown or cocktail dress (e.g., “little black dress”), pantsuits, or dressy separates

For men: business suit or sport coat/blazer and slacks, dress shirt, tie; coats can be removed for dancing

Shoes: Leather or suede soles with non-marking heels recommended. Do not wear sneakers or other shoes with rubber or spongy soles. They can stick to the floor during turns and spins and cause ankle and knee injuries.
