You work and play hard with your project horse.

For your own awareness, we would like you to keep track of the time that you put in working with your project horse. At the end of the year, when you turn in your hours, if you spent 150 or more hours with your project horse, you will receive a plaque and an engraved disk, with the hours you spent with your horse, to add to your plaque.

If you do not achieve 150 hours that is okay.

Just keep track and turn in your hours, as all members will be recognized

Hours logged must be from the current 4-H calendar year.

October 1st - September 30th.

Logged hours are due to the Horse Association by October 7th of the current year.

Activities you can track towards your hours:

Ground work- manners, trailering, etc

Pleasure- riding/trail riding

Training- riding/showmanship/driving

Showing- riding/showmanship/driving

Grooming- daily and/or show preparation

Cleaning stalls

Maintaining- building your horses environment (barn, fencing, field)

Feeding, loading hay or grain- veterinarian/farrier health care.
