Everything you need to know about the event

The Norwegian Lundehund Association of America, Inc.'s (NLAA) National Specialty is May 26 at the Interstate Center in Bloomington, Illinois.

The club's Board and event chair encourage everyone to attend the specialty as well as the planned events leading up to the big day.

There's something for everyone, whether it be showing dogs, enjoying the company of Lundehund owners and enthusiasts, and/or participating in a judge's education seminar.

The Specialty is part of an American Kennel Club (AKC) Memorial Day weekend conformation show May 23–26. The "Heart of Illinois Cluster Dog Shows" event is co-hosted by the Illinois Valley Kennel Club of Peoria, Inc. and the Corn Belt Kennel Club. NLAA has secured reserved kennel space for all four days.

With enough dogs and bitches entered, there is a high likelihood majors for AKC Champion and Grand Champion titles may be earned. Lundie veterans over 6 years old as well as puppies under 1 year of age also have the chance to win Specialty trophies.

Enter 1, 2, 3, or all 4 days of the conformation show at <u>onofrio.com</u> before the closing date of noon CDT Wednesday, May 7.

Don't have a show dog but want to join in on the all-things-Lundie fun? Check out the following itinerary as well as local things to see and do.

Eastland Suites Hotel and Conference Center

The <u>Eastland Suites Hotel and Conference Center</u> is NLAA's headquarters during its 2025 Specialty. Located in Bloomington, Illinois, this Wyndham hotel is 6 miles from the Interstate Center and a few minutes away from the Central Illinois Regional Airport.

A limited number of the hotel's dog-friendly king studio suites are offered at a discounted rate for NLAA Specialty participants. NLAA's happy hour icebreaker and its member meeting are both conveniently held at the Eastland.



Eastland Suites Hotel and Conference Center is located at 1801 Eastland Drive, Bloomington, IL 61704. Hotel amenities include landscaped gardens, an outdoor fire pit, gas grill, indoor pool, and drinks and food at The Deep End Tap. There's also plenty of green space for dog walks.

Friday, May 23: Show + NLAA Happy Hour Icebreaker



Judges are educated on the breed standard to better understand and evaluate the Lundehund's unique features, such as assessing rotary gate and counting extra toes. A lecture and slide deck are followed by judges examining and rating the Lundehunds who are present.

A minimum of four Lundehunds over age 6 months are needed to fulfill AKC judges education requirements. Email Stansell.cs@gmail.com by May 1 if you plan to attend. Also notify Cindy if you need handlers to assist with multiple dogs.

Lundehund owners and handlers participating in the judge's education seminar are offered complimentary snacks, sandwiches, and soft drinks courtesy of NLAA. A show lead is required for each dog.

experienced the buzz the rare breed generates among judges, exhibitors, handlers, and spectators.

NLAA's Specialty is certain to garner extra excitement with what is expected to be 2025's largest showing of Lundehunds in North America.

Sandy Bingham-Porter is the Specialty's breed judge. Rosettes and personalized trophies are presented for Best of Breed; Best of Opposite Sex; the dog and the bitch in each Select, Winners, and Reserve Winners categories; Veteran (6 years or older); and Puppy (under 1 year).

The ring concludes with the judge presenting the "Best Feet" trophy to the Lundehund with the most impressive polydactyly.

Fast CAT Invitationals

Tally Ho!

Two Norwegian Lundehunds ran in the 2024 AKC Fast CAT Invitationals October 8–12 in Wilmington, Ohio.

CH Seacliff's Dagny Deep and CH Huffin' Anja Puffin were invited to the annual event based on their Fast CAT rankings from the year prior. (AKC invites the top 5 Fast CAT dogs from each of its recognized breeds, plus 15 All-American dogs—5 each from the sport's 3 height categories.

While there were no PRs set, the Lundies had a blast, each earning their FCAT3 titles at the Invitationals.

The facts about Fast CAT

Fast Coursing Ability Test (CAT)

is a timed lure coursing sport. A "releaser" lets go of a dog on one end of a 100-yard fenced outdoor track while the "catcher" (usually the owner) waits for them on the other end. In between is the lure (a.k.a. the "bunny") the dog chases: a white plastic bag tied to a string zipping across the ground. Electric eyes clock the dog's speed as it runs the 100 yards.


Scores are calculated by a time-to-height formula and the accumulated points go toward Fast CAT titles: 150 points, BCAT; 500 points, DCAT; and 1,000 points, FCAT (the highest title). Every 500 points earned after the 1,000 is another FCAT title.

Unlike the formality of conformation and the intense precision of agility, Fast CAT is a relaxed and casual dog sport requiring little to no training. Watch, volunteer as a releaser, or run your own Lundies at the Fast CAT trial held at the Heart of Illinois Cluster Dog Shows in tandem with the conformation event.
