- 1. In accordance with AR 345-105, the following report is submitted covering the operations of the 748th Tank Battalion in support of the 89th Infantry Division and the 65th Infantry Division from 1 April 1945 to 30 April 1945:
 - 2. Chronological history of events:
- a. 1 April 1945: 748th Tank Bn. (-) attached to 89th Inf. Div. in Reserve at Springen, Germany.

Company "B" (17 DD's, 7 CDL's) departed Schimshin, Germany 0700A, arrived Springen, Germany 1730A. Crossed Rhine River at St. Goar.

Company "C" CDL Flatoon illuminated bridgesite at St. Goar, Germany.
Company "A" CDL Platoon illuminated bridgesite at Bad Salzig, Germany.
Company "D" CDL Flatoon illuminated bridgesite at Mainz, Germany.

b. 2 April 1945: 748th Tank Bn. (-) continued maintenance in Springen, Germany.

Company "C", "A", and "D" CDL Platoons continued to illuminate respective bridgesites.

c. 3 April 1945: 748th Tank Bn.(-) departed Springen, Gormany 1250B enroute to assembly area vic. Allmershausen (63656). Enroute at close of period. Company "C", "A", and "D" CDL llateons continued to provide illumination at Rhine River.

d. 4 April 1945: 748th Tank En. (-) closed into Allmorshausen at 07000. Distance traveled 120 miles. Regan maintenance program. Still in 88th Division reserve.

, CDL Platoons continued with illumination of Rhine bridges.

e. 5-6 April 1945: 748th Tank Dn. (-) continued maintenance of equipment. On 6 April, Bn. was relieved from attachment to 89th Division and attached to 85th Infantry Div. Here placed in Div. Reserve and remained in Allmershausen. Received orders to convert DD tanks to fighter tanks and to reorganize three medium companies and one light company.

CDL Tlatoens continued with illumination of Rhine bridges.

f. 7 April 1945: 748th Tank Bn.(-) still in Reserve at Allmerhausen. Company "B" departed Allmershuasen 1300B enroute to Breffurt, arrived at Engen-

homsen 19500. Placed in D/S of 261st In2. Hegt.
Three CDL Plateons continued with their mission of illumination.

¿. 8 April 1945: 748th Tenk En. (-) remained in Allmershausen in resource.

Company """ relieved from D/2 261th Inf. and attached to 261st. Remained in Wendenhausen (758878) in Regtl. reserve.

Company "A" CDL Flatoon arrived in Allmershausen after turning CDL's into Granance. Company "D" and "O" CDL Tis. continued illumination.

H. 9 April 1945: 748th Tank Bn. (-) remained in Div. Reserve in All-morhausen.

Company "D" departed Mendonhausen 1500D, arrived derstungen, Germany 1800D. Relieved from attachment to 261st Inf.

Company "C" and "D" CDL Pls. departed from St. Goar and Mainz to rejoin Datalion.

i. 10-April 1945: 748th Tank Bn.(-) departed Allmershausen 1200B, cleared derstungen, Germany 1500B. Distance 21 miles. Remained in Gerstungen in Div. Reserve.

Company "C" and "D" CDL Flatoons arrived in Gerstungen from St. Goar and Mainz.

j. 12-13 April 1945: 748th Tank Bn.(-) departed Gerstungen 1200B, closed into Leina, Germany at 1700B on the 12th. Remained in Leina on 13th performing maintenance and rehabilitation.

k. 14-16 April 1945: Bn. departed Leina (037600) 140800E, cleared into Haarhausen, Germany (211551) by 141130B. Started training program on 15th. On 16th received orders to turn in all CDL equipment to Ordnance, to reorganize Battalion, and submit names of surplus personnel.

1. 17-18 April 1945: En. departed Haarhausen 171800B, closed into Dorfleins, Germany (231528) 181830B. Still in Div. Reserve.

m. 19 April 1945: Bn. departed Dorfleins 191300B, cleared into Osternohe, Germany at 192330B.

n. 20 April 1945: Bn. (less 1 Pl. Co. "B") departed Osternohe 1200B, closed into Hagenhausen, Germany 201730B.

2d Pl. Co. "B" departed Osternohe 1130B for Kirchensetten Bach, Germany to support 3d Bn., 260th Inf. Were not involved in any action. Company "D" (less 2d Pl.) departed Hagenhausen, Germany, cleared into Dienschwein, Germany 1900B. Company attached to 260th Inf. Regt.


Company "D" plus 3 assault guns and 3 mortars departed Hagenhausen 2015B, arrived Schrotsdorf, Germany 2345B., Company (+) to support 261st Inf. Begt. in protecting left flank of Division. Tanks were to be used as a mobile reserve.

Company "C" remained in Division Reserve in Hagenhausen.

o. 21 April 1945: 748th(less Cos."A", "B", and "D"(+), remained in Division Reserve in Hagenhausen.

Company "A" in D/S 259th Inf. 3d Fl. with the stanks attacked Newmarkt at 0530B in support of two platoons and one with 3d pl infantive last they advanced do the street lead tank

was knocked out by emplaced AT gun. Other tank, while moving to position to fire on AT gun, was knocked out from the rear by SP gun. The third tank continued to advance with infantry eliminating snipers as called for by the infantry. At 1000 infantry moved back and proceeded to make their way around left flank of town. Tank could not follow through dense woods but gave supporting fire. Estimated enemy killed - 10.

lst Platoon was held in reserve initially. At 0710B lst Pl. moved into town supporting Co. K. Tanks destroyed two snipers and one house containing machine gun nest. Lead tank was fired upon several times by an SP gun and due to blocked streets was not able to move forward until SP gun could be eliminated. Infantry bazooka teams tried several times to advance to position to destroy SP gun, but were driven back by automatic fire. Infantry commander decided to consolidate positions and allowed tanks to withdraw under cover of darkness. This they did under fire of 88mm on the road out of town. Estimated enemy killed by tanks - 7.

Total casualties in company: 3 KIA, 1 SWA, 2 LWA, 1 MIA. Two medium

tanks destroyed (one burned).

Company "B" in D/S 260th Inf. 3d Fl. attached to 2d Bn., moved from Dienschwein 0800B, arrived Thautmanshafen 0845B. Not involved in any action. 1st Pl. attached to 3d Br., departed Dienschwein 1230B, arrived Lauterhofen, Germany 1315B. Not involved in any action. 2d Fl. in Regt. Reserve maintained vehicles.


Company "D" (plus prov. Pl.) in D/S 261st Inf. 3d Pl. attached to 1st Bn. cleared Schrotsdorf 1045B, arrived Kainsback. 2d Pl. attached 2nd Bn. cleared Schrotsdorf 1045B, arrived Firchensittenbach 1140B. Moved to Kae-dorf at 1200B.

p. 22 April 1945: Company "A" in D/S of 259th Inf. 2nd Fl. released from 3d Bn., attached to 1st Bn.; 1st Fl. released from 3d Bn., attached to 2d Bn. The 1st Fl., with Inf. and TDs, made gains against slight resistance, clearing approx. 17 villages vic. T770830, including Dietkirchen, Escherishohhen, Amyemhoffen, Lampertshoffen, Felchemhoffen, and Lippertshofen. The 2d Fl. went into 1st Bn. sector and took up positions for indirect fire. At 1700B, 2d Fl. fired 31 rounds 76mm at a battery of three 88mm guns. Observation difficult due to haze. Enemy battery ceased to fire and were assumed to be knocked out at 1740B.

Company "B" in D/3 of 200th Inf. continued pushing towards Corps objective in 260th zone. 3d ll. (4 tanks) on right with 2d Bn., 1st Pl. (4 tanks) and 2d Fl.(3 tanks) on left with 3d Fn. 3d Fl. followed two companies on line in their advance in direct support of these companies. 2d Bn. advanced from Trautmannshofen to Kirchwinn. 1st and 2d platoons supported 3d Bn. by eliminating automatic weapons fire. 1st Fl. destroyed Brunn by supporting fire, completely burned Faltershoffen, assisted in eliminating automatic weapons fire in woods (8393), eliminated automatic weapons, destroyed 8 buildings, killed 3 cavalrymen and three horses in Eastl (8695). 2d Fl. was in support and not committed to action.

Company "D" in D/S of 261st 1st F1., AG section and Hortar section remained in Lett. receive. Co.(+) departed Schrotsdorf 1530B arrived Oberclsbach 1830P. 23 II. departed Heederf OCCCD with 2d Dn. enroute to Engelsburg, Germany. 3d F1. attached 1st Dn. noved to Alsfeld arriving at 1330B.

748 th(-) renained in Magenhausen in Div. Res.



4. 25 April 1045: 778 th (-) inner bod Tolenhousen 1807D. College "o" cleared bridge loading out of town then it collapsed. All other roads were intraspable by wheel vehicles, so Company "O" Haintenance Pl. built a Class 20 bridge. It. cleared bridge at 1700D, cleared into Medical, p. 1997 ont, at 2130D.

Company "I" in J/6 of 250th Inf. At 00008 2d Fl. supporting Co. 2, lot In. advanced on Lahr. (740005). The attack was to jump of from Helena at 07005 and there was no time for ground recommaisance. On reaching a worded hill 800 yds. H or Lahr, the pl. was forced to halt to explore a mearly impassable trail. It was decided to take the trail because blazing a trail through the woods would bring fire on the infantry. One tank dropped out due to broken track caused by running on blown bogies under direct orders of Inf. commander. Tanks put MG and III fire on Lahr from defilade positions. Town was taken in three minutes. Two tanks required tracks and then proceeded with the infantry.

Company "B" in D/S of 200th Inf. Co. rear was enroute to Hohenfils, Germany. Ist platoon was located at Hohenfils. 2d platoon was located at Harhett and 3d platoon located at Hatla. All platoons pursued enemy to Division Red Phase line. Resistance was nil.

Company "C" left Hagenhausen, (cromny et 1200B to go to Distlikechen. Thile enroute were attached to 261st Inf. Regt. and proceeded to Berg, Commany, arrivel there at 1330P and were ordered on to Newmarkt. Company supported 5d Pm. and were given mission of clearing Highway 8 and to take and hold Brappenhofen. Moined 3d Dm. 4 miles southeast of Newmarkt and transported some infuntry on tanks. Encountered harrassing fire from small errs in vic. Seubersdorf at 1930B. Two tanks hired on enemy gun positions and destroyed six houses. Ordered at 2005B to return to Batzhausen and take up defensive positions for the night.


Company "D" in D/S of 261st Inf. Co.(-) departed Oberalsback 1630 arrived Herbertshaffen 2215B. Assault Sun section and Mortar section relieved from attachment and returned to Bn. control. Company relieved from attachment to 261st Inf. Regt. 2d Pl. attached to 259th; movel to Felchenhafen 1030B. 3d Fl. attached to 260th Inf. Regt. Moved from Alsfeld 0700B, arrived Eggensbach 0830B, continued on to Hohenfeld.


r. 24 April 1945: 748th Tank En.(-) departed Dietkichen 0600B, cleared into vic. Velburg 0800B. Assault Gun Flatoon attached to "B" company at 1100B. Bn.(-) departed vic. Velburg 1500B, cleared into Laaber, Germany at 1730B.

Company "A" in D/2 of 259th Inf. At 0700B the company moved from vic. Pelchewhoffen (758835) to new location vic. Beratzhausen (971633). The 1st Pl. was attached to 2nd Bn. and advanced vic. Laaber (029601) against light resistance. No casualties, but only one tank arrived at Laaber due to mechanical failures and poor terrain.

Company "D" continued to advance with 260th Inf. No resistance.

Company "C" marched from Batzhausen at 0645B transporting A Company 261st. Rission to clear road to Hemau, Germany. Reached Hemau after roadblock was destroyed by artillery. Received orders to proceed to Deurling, Germany. Column halted at Bittmannsdorf and ordered to proceed SE with mission of seizing RR bridge across Danube River at Toikam. Marched south from Hohenschambach with tanks and infantry as lead element. Destroyed one road block by IE fire,





but were slowed down by five successive abatis of 30 to 40 large trees each, two of which were bypassed and the others crushed by the tanks. Indeed had to Haugenried and arrived there at 1915B. During this march 20 energy were killed by tank fire.

Company "D" departed Herbertshafen 0610", arrived Velburg 07103. 2d Pl. departed Felchenhafen 1015, arrived Straubling 1530B, attached to 250th Inf. 3d Fl. departed Hafenhafen 0500B. Acted as point for RCT, reached regt. objective, Vieuhamsen 1600B.

s. 25 April 1945: 748th Tank En.(-) remained in Laaber in Div. reserve. Performed maintenance and rehabilitation.

.Company "A" was released from D/D of 259th and returned to Bn. control in Laber. Began reorganizing company.

Company "B" marched from Hohenfels to Mitterndorf, arriving 2125B. No enemy encountered on march. Company was to move to an assembly area at 0600B, the following day to cross treadway bridge over Danube in support of 260th Inf. Rcn. was made of routes to bridgesite and Pl. leaders observed opposite bank of Danube from CPs.

Company "C" remained with 281st in Maugenried awaiting completion of bridge across Danube.

Company "D" (-) remained in Velburg and established an AJF for the Pattalion. 2d Fl. remained with Company "A" in Leaber. 3d Fl. remained with Co. "B" attached to 260th Inf. Regt.

t. 26 April 1945: 748th Tank Dn.(-) remained in Laaber in Div. reserve. Company "B" moved from Nitterndorf to marshalling area in preparation for crossing Danube on bridge at 0600B on the 27th.

Company "C" ordered to move from Raugenried to vicinity of Kapfelberg and to await completion of bridge and then to support 261st in an assault with the mission of capturing Regensberg, Cermany. Orders changed to cross at Sundelshausen. Crossed bridge at 2200B and bivouaced for the night on the fer bank of Danube.


Company "D"continued to maintain Pn. ASI in Velburg. 2d and 3d Platoons attached to Company "A" in Leaber and in Division reserve.

u. 27 April 1945: 748th Tank Dn.(-) departed Laaber, Germany 0530b, crossed Danube River on treadway bridge at Gundelbausen, and cleared into Crasslfing (U152489) at 1445B. Still in Division reserve.

Company "A" arrivel at Grasslfing at 18300 and were insoliately put in D/S support of 259th Inf. Rept. Foved to area of 250th in Lengfeld at 16000. 1st F1. attached to Co. C., 2d Dn., and moved to area vis. (113420) at 18000. 2d P1. (light tanks) attached to Co. B, and moved to vic. (137446) at 18100.

Company "B" moved from murshalling area and crossed Danube at 0800%. Assembled on far bank of river. Moved to Charadorf to attack town of Abbach in support of Infantry. Form surrendered just before the attack started. Traffic ja: prevented tanks from rejoining 200th and at 14007 were relieved from L/D of 230th and returned to Dn. at Crosslfing, arriving 15002.

Company "C" joined 261st Inf. regt. vic. bridge at Gundelhausen at 0800R. Foved forward passing through Abbender? and Abbach and helted beyond 'Abbach to receive orders from Regt. and to load infantry on tanks. Histoin was to spearhe at assemble of 261st Inf. on Div. right flamt and to drive into Regens-



borg from the south parallel to main railway line to Munich. March was uneventful, marked only by willing surrender of isolated groups of enemy. Learned at 12001 that surrender negotiations for the city had already commenced, with the 71st Inf. attacking from the east. Ordered by Inf. commander to disregard AT artillery and to proceed into eith with utmost speed without regard to normal tactical precautions. This was accomplished over strong protest and city was entered at 13150. Tank company moved to Traibling, in Regt. reserve.

Company "D" (less 2 lls.) continued to maintain Bn. ASP in Velburg and to take care of surplus personnel of the Bn.

v. 28 April 1945: 740th Tank Bn.(-) remained in Div. reserve in Crassling.

Company "A" in D/S of 259th Inf. 2d Fl. supporting 2d Bn. moved from Oberkager (117426) to follow infantry and to take positions to fire on high ground vic. Saal (081416). Orders changed to select positions to fire on Untersaal. Town surrendered before any firing took place. 460 men were taken prisoner by company commander of "A" while making road ren. Unit moved into Untersaal for the night. 2d Pl. (light) withdrawn from support of Co. E and moved to protect Regt. right flank about 1 mile S of Saal. Loved to Schlassberg at the completion of mission. 3d Pl. (light) departed Lengfeld 1030B, arrived Feising 1100B. In reserve.

Company "B" in Division reserve in Grasslfing. Reorganized company into two platoons. Assault Gum pl. returned to Headquarters Co.

Company "C" remained in Traubling in Regtl. reserve of 261st. Company "D" departed Velberg 1600D enroute to Grasslfing.

w. 29 April 1945: 748th Tank Bn. (-) remained in Division reserve in Grasslfing.

Company "A" in D/S 259th Inf. 1st Pl. moved from Untersaal to Affecking and Hohenpfahl vic. (047422) meeting no resistance. While in Hohenpfahl assisted in taking approximately 800 PWs.

Company "C" remained in Traubling in Regt. reserve.

Company "D"(-) cleared into Grassberg (1 mi. !E Grasslfing) at 02303, in Division reserve.

x. 30 April 1945: 748th Tank Bn.(-) still in Div. reserve in Grasslfing. Company "A" (plus 2 pls. "D" Co.) relieved from D/S of 259th Inf.

Departed Lengfeld (126445) 1400B and cleared into Grassberg (158503) at 1530B.


Company "C" relieved from D/S 261st Inf. Remained in Traubling performing maintenance.

SUBJECT: After Action Report.

TO : Commanding General, VIII Corps, APO 308, U.S. Army.

1. In accordance with AR 345-105 the following report is submitted covering the operations of elements of 748th Tank Battalion in support of the 65th Infantry Division, 5th Infantry Division, 87th Infantry Division, 89th Infantry Division, and 26th Infantry Division from 1 March '45 to 31 March '45.

2. Chronological history of events:

a. 1-15 March 45: 748th Tank Battalion in Hagondange, France (VU864732 (training with DD tanks and CDL tanks. Practice river crossings being made at site one mile south of Ukange, France in conjunction with 1301 Eng. Regt.

b. 16 March 45: Co. "C", AG Pl. attached, departed Hagondange, France 0710A, arrived Teterchen, France (VQ145710) at 1030A. Attached to 65th Inf. Div.. Officers made ron. in Baarlautern-Roden in preparation for pending action. Co. "C" (-) departed Teterchen, France 2000A, arrived Saarlautern, Germany at 2230A. Bivouaced there for the night.

c. 17 March 45: 1st, 2nd Platoons Co. "C" attached to 259th Inf. Regt.; 3rd Pl. and AG Pl. (6-105's) attached to 260th Inf. Regt. Ron. made by platoon leaders of sectors to be fought in. Crews maintained vehicles.

d. 18 March 45: 1st Pl. Co. "C", departed Saarlautern, Germany 0230A, arrived assembly area at Saarlautern-Roden at 0300A. Jumped off at 0600A to support 2nd Bn., 259th Inf. Regt. in assault on pillboxes to East of town. Tanks fired on pillboxes and protected flank of Bn. by firing to SW. Assisted infantry in taking several boxes and advanced to an anti-tank ditch approximately 500 yards from LD. Here Inf. dug in, awaiting the advance of the Co. on their left. Tanks returned to attack position, assisted in picking up wounded infantry and tank crews on the way back. At 1430A lieut. Itslotta, Fl. Lir., accompanied by another tank, went forward carrying amunition for the infantry company in the AT ditch. This tank was hit by an 85MM and burnel. Tank Codr. of another tank was wounded when he dismounted trying to rescue went from burning tank. One other tank attempted to rescue Pl. Ldr's

2nd Pl. Co. "C", jumped off at 0600A to support left company of 2nd In. 259th Inf. Tanks preceded infantry to pillboxes, firing into openings and had house "Buttoned Up". Had difficulty in getting Inf. to good to the pillboxes even after two tanks were at the rear door of

finally got the infantry up, but they had no charges to blow the buses.

tank hit by bazooka/near pillbox, since squad assigned to protect tank had
disappeared. On tank hit mine advancing to pillboxes. On tank fell in shell
hole. Two remaining tanks advanced up and down the pillbox line and up to
anti-tank ditch until all ammunition was fired, then they returned to Co. CP
for resupply of ammunition. Inf. failed to take boxes and withdraw.

3rd Pl., Co. "C" departed Saarlautern 0510A, arrived Saarlautern-Roden at 0600A. Pl. was attached to 2nd Bn., 260th Inf.. Tanks were kept in reserve all day. Returned to Saarlautern at 2000A. No action.

Roden 0515A. Waited in assembly area until 0600A. Were attached to and Bn., 260th Inf. to assist in clearing enemy from the several blocks they still held in NE section on the town. Is Section moved to support right company. An infentry guide leading the tanks stepped over a "daisy-chain" of US AT mines in a street declared clear by the Inf. and directed the lead tank onto the mines. Both tracks were blown. Other two tanks continued, after street was cleared, and supported Inf. by firing on houses, pillbares. End. Section supported left company by firing on houses, pillbares. End. Seven PM's were captured when tank tried out his flamethrower on a known strongpoint. Enemy killed - 15, Enemy captured - 7, One MG destroyed. Losses for Company: One Officer, 4 EM missing; 1 Officer 9 EM wounded; 1 tank destroyed; 4 tanks disabled.

e. 19 March 45: 1st, 3rd Platoons attached to 259th Inf. Regt. AG Platoon attached to 260th Inf. Regt. / 2nd Pl. was inoperative.

AG Platoon departed Saarlautern 0800A, arrived Saarlautern-Roden 0815A. Heavy fog caused tanks to remain in Bn. reserve all day. Ememy withdrew during the previous night and during the fog, so town was taken. At 1700A, AG Pl. attached to 261st Inf. Regt. Tanks returned to Saarlautern to await orders from new Regt. Enemy captured - 1.

lst and 3rd Platoons, Co. "C" attached lst Bn., 259th Inf. Regt. remained in reserve at Saarlautern. At 1230A both Pls. departed Saarlautern, arrived Saarlautern-Roden 1300A. Departed Saarlautern-Roden 1330A meved, east, crossed AT ditch filled in by 748th Tank-dozer, and arrived on highway to Saarwellengen. Moved on to high ground SE of Saarwellengen. No enemy was contacted. Both platoons returned to Saarlautern at 1900A.

f. 20 March 45: 1st and 3rd Platoons, Co. "C" attached to 259th Inf. departed Saarlautern 0830A, arrived Saarwellengen, Germany 1130A. Remained in west side of town in Regt. reserve. No enemy contacted.

AG Platoon departed Saarlautern 0800A arrived Saarwellengen, Germany 1100A. Went into position east side of town in Regt: reserve of 261st Inf.. No contact with the enemy.


