Dear Valued Customer:

Directive 2002/95/EC, commonly referred to as Restriction of Hazardous Substances or RoHS, was adopted by the European Union in February 2003 to restrict the use of ten hazardous materials (Lead, Mercury, Cadmium, Hexavalent Chromium, Polybrominated biphenyls and Polybrominated diphenyl ether, Diisobutyl phthalate, Bis phthalate, Butyl benzyl phthalate or Dibutylphthalate) in the manufacture of various types of electronic and electrical equipment.

A new European Union RoHS Directive 2015/863EU (known as RoHS3) went into effect on July 22, 2019. The new directive makes no addition or change in the ten restricted substances and various types of electronic and electrical equipment but now also applies to medical devices.

Based on information provided to Nylok, LLC by its raw material suppliers, the materials/substances used to create Nylok® Blue and Red Nylon Patch do not contain any reportable materials listed as prohibited in the RoHS requirements, unless it is present as an unintentional trace impurity.
