Split Rail Fencing Repair

Our community has split rail fencing that's in place to delineate the division between homeowner private property and the wetlands. The COA is responsible for the upkeep of these common fences.

After an in-depth inspection of all the split rail fencing, it was determined that there are 33 posts compromised or broken requiring repair. Some fencing was damaged by falling trees and others by wear and tear over the past several years.

Recently, estimates were sought and NW Fence provided the best estimate to repair all the damage. All posts will be anchored in concrete. In addition, the 17 broken post replacements will also be coated with Copper Brown preservation stain to greatly increase their longevity. Our association insurance is covering the split rails that were damaged by trees.

Homeowners who have any such fences bordering their property will be notified when the work is scheduled to be done. If you have renters residing in your home, please pass this important information along to them.

We appreciate your patience and understanding as this work is being done.


Art is a member of the neighborhood cat watch team.


