Thank you all very much for joining us, we truly appreciate your membership! We are a very active Post, and if you have the time, we have the activities, just let us know what you are interested in and we'll get you hooked up with the right person or start something new.

Membership

Larry tells me that we have 213 new/renewed out of 254 from last year which puts us at 84% for retention, which is good, but our growth goal is 267 which puts us at 80% of goal. If you do not have a membership card with 2021 on it please contact the Adjutant and renew. If you think you renewed but don't have a 2021 card contact the Adjutant and let's find out what happened and get it fixed. Look at it this way, the membership year has started and 16% of our membership is late with their dues. If you are able to pay, why pay late when we have been sending out reminders since JULY!! These 60 – 90-minute classes are meant to give you access to information you need to be a more effective Legionnaire for your Post and Community. Activities for the greater good conducted outside of the Post are of importance to us as well. Have you thought of being a volunteer at the VA? You would think that with this many Posts around KC we would have a hundred volunteers in the system... we have 8 known volunteers. That does not show us in that good of a light when we say we care for Veterans, but only 8 of us give our time on a regular basis. Maybe you don't because you volunteer with Scouting, food

pantry, meals or wheels, or any other charitable organization. That's great! Thank you for your time, and please let us know how many hours you regularly put in and at what. Those things are reported to Congress by National once a year to show that Legionnaires are the type of people who deserve the Charter they awarded us. Every year we must prove ourselves worthy of their trust and what you tell us is important. I will call for that in April, estimated through May 31st.

Coming up quicker than you might realize are Post elections and Committee assignments for next year. Candidates must be announced or nominated at the April Membership Meeting with elections at the May meeting. That can come really quick this year as we deal with other things. You will need to pick a Commander for sure, and other replacements if people have to be shifted around. Think about how you want to contribute next year and let it be known.

If you currently hold a position of responsibility and can't or won't do it next year start asking members who you think would do a good job to take your place now, don't wait until April.

All of the duties done by the Media & Communications Committee will also need to be covered. I had thought I would be able to retain this position but things have changed and the Post will need your help!

Chair – Coordinate all aspects of Committee with the Executive Committee and others to assist in Post functions and events

Internet Administrator – Check and distribute emails, maintain records of all log-in information for all web-based activities, assist all members of Committee as needed

Newsletter Editor – Publish and Post quarterly newsletter

Public Relations – Attend events and be the face and voice of the Post if the Commander is unavailable, Submit press releases and stories to the media and publications, external and internal

Photographer – Take pictures of Post events to share with PR for press releases and Historian for yearbooks

Webmaster – Maintain website, post/remove Member Owned Businesses, Member Time Capsule pictures, Newsletters, Yearbooks etc.

Social Media Manager – Post & Share to Facebook and Instagram information that benefits Veterans and Legionnaires alike on at least a weekly schedule, preferably bi-weekly

Ideally, each position has its own person, but they can be doubled up. I have been doing all of these tasks, so 2 or 3 can do it easily.
