WHAT HAPPENED

Our **Jul 4 Poppy Sales** at Walmart was a success. We left early and still raised about \$1400 for our Veterans and service members in need.

Three Delegates were sent to **Department Convention** in Jefferson City at the Capitol Plaza Hotel **Jul 10 – 13**. If you don't know how that works, the Post pays the registration fee but the Delegates pick up their own transportation, room and food costs. The District reimburses \$100 to any delegate who is assigned to a committee and stays the entire convention. Only one of our Delegates saw any reimbursement, we thank all who attended.

Our PR Committee won a "Toot Your Horn" Award at the convention for their work in letting the public know about what we do for our Veterans and in our community. We will pick it up during Fall Conference in October. Keep your eye on the Gladstone Dispatch for our occasional articles.

Dennis L. Woeltje of Cape Girardeau, was elected as the Missouri Department Commander during the convention. A Navy veteran of the Vietnam era, he attended boot camp at Great Lakes Naval Training Center near Chicago II in 1969. During his 32 year military career as a Navy Seabee Reservist,he served with various Seabee Units including NMCB 28, CBMU 302, RNCF SU4, NMCB 15 and RNCB 25. He worked at Proctor and Gamble Paper Products for 25 years as a line operator/mechanic. He also worked on several maintenance teams throughout his career. He has lived all his life in Cape Girardeau County and graduated from Jackson Sr. High in 1967. He attended SEMO College for 3 semesters before he joined the navy. He has been a member of Louis K. Juden American Legion Post 63 at Cape Girardeau since 2003. Woeltje has served as Post 63 Commander, District 14 Commander, and Zone 4 Vice Commander representing the Southeast Missouri area from St. Louis south to Hornersville and from New Madrid west to Thayer MO.

During the **August National Convention** Michael D. Helm was elected national commander. A U.S. Army veteran during the Vietnam War, he served with the 82nd Airborne Division in Fort Bragg, N.C., and earned his Ranger tab in 1972. He has been a member of Jack Helt American Legion Post 313 at Lebanon, Neb., since 1972. Born in McCook, Neb., he grew up in Norcatur, Kansas, where he currently resides. He is a retired U.S. Postal Service rural mail carrier with more than 33 years of service.

Several actions took place during the **July and August Post Membership Meetings** to include seating committee's for the Clay County Veterans Memorial, Fundraising and updating the By-Laws. This year's Veterans Salute at Linden Square will be organized with the help of Bob Box and Gerry Braton. We also wrote and passed two Resolutions to send to Department and National Conventions next year. They deal with having Petty Officer Fords Navy Cross (posthumous) upgraded to a much deserved Medal of Honor and his status of four days MIA changed to POW. I will attempt to write a short article on the story in the near future.

We met at City Hall on **September 8 during a City Council Meeting** and Commander Beer awarded Richard King and Paula Brooks Certificates of Appreciation for their hard work setting up the tents and equipment we used for the flag pole dedication at Big Shoal Cemetery in May instead of being cancelled due to rain. Yes, it can take 4 months to get several people together at the same place and time!

On 9/11 Nelson Duncan, William McDonald and I put the flag to half-staff in the morning and recovered it in the evening.

The **District Meeting on 14 September** was held in Bethany at Post 216. The district voted to replace the worn flag for a new one, to start a fund to cap at \$1000 to help TFA qualified Veterans and their families and will conduct a membership refresh in the near future. I was "Volunteered" to serve on the TFA Committee as well as the Membership Team. Our two Resolutions unanimously passed through District and will go to the Department Resolutions Committee next.

The **25 Sep Membership Meeting** was held and we got a bit done. Changes to the website which formalized some committee's was approved, we agreed to "explore becoming involved in Girls State" this year and immediately came up with one sponsor, and agreed to a \$200 budget for the fundraising committee for material and printing costs. It was also noted that Boys State and Oratorical contest information for next year is available on the internet and that the Americanism Chairman will start contacting the schools involved.

The **27 September American Royal Parade** in KCMO was a good time. The streets were lined with waving citizens and Veterans alike.

DID YOU KNOW?

That SB600 was passed by the MO Senate this year and is named the Honoring Our Veterans Bill? The bill changes provisions for license plates honoring veterans; expands WWII, Korean Conflict, & Vietnam War medallion programs to Missouri National Guard members; creates medallion programs for Operations Iraqi Freedom, New Dawn, Desert Shield & Desert Storm; requires school districts to teach at least one period leading up to an observance that conveys the meaning and significance of Veterans Day, and allows school districts to add Veterans Day as an official school holiday.
