

The **Veterans Crisis Line** is a toll-free, confidential resource that connects Veterans in crisis and their families and friends with qualified, caring VA responders.

Veterans and their loved ones can call **1-800-273-8255 and Press 1**, chat online at **www.VeteransCrisisLine.net**, or send a **text message to 838255** to receive free, confidential support 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year, even if they are not registered with VA or enrolled in VA health care. VA also provides support for Service members through the Military Crisis Line. Service members and their families and friends can call and text the Veterans Crisis Line numbers and can chat online at www.MilitaryCrisisLine.net/Chat.

The professionals at the Veterans Crisis Line are specially trained and experienced in helping Veterans of all ages and circumstances—from Veterans coping with mental health issues that were never addressed to recent Veterans struggling with relationships or the transition back to civilian life.

The American Legion sponsors what is known as **Temporary Financial Assistance**, or TFA. This program will grant honorably discharged veterans with minor children money to temporarily assist some financial crisis. However the application process takes some time and must be preceded by exhausting all other means of support. Requesting assistance is harder when you have already reached the cut-off of services stage. We all hate to ask until we absolutely have to, but that can also make it harder.

On our Facebook page I have posted some resources to be used to contact people who can help with employment, utilities, day care, even the rent. When you first feel that you may be approaching difficulties check your options, your budget and needs versus wants. The sooner you act the better the outcome. And keep a list of who you talk to and what the results were. That will greatly speed up any request for TFA.

The most important thing, if you need help, ASK. We are here to assist veterans to the best of our ability.

DID YOU KNOW?

In December of 2014 The Liberty Memorial was designated as a National WWI Memorial, giving it equal status to the National WWI Museum that is housed at the Memorial.

When originally opened in 1926 the exterior building to the east of the tower, now known as Memory Hall, was named Legion Hall. We were there at its dedication in 1921 (holding our 3rd National Convention in KC) and at the opening in 1926. The American Legion logo and preamble are cast in bronze above the door. The architect saw that space as a meeting place for service and civic organizations.

I am proud to be able to do at least one shift of volunteer duty wearing my Legion cap inside that building on Veterans Day, thinking about the Legionnaires who came before me, who sacrificed during "the war to end all wars" and then came home to sacrifice again.
