#### WHAT HAPPENED

Several of us attended the **District Meeting** on 12 April at Post 236 in Excelsior Springs. Information shared is the Districts Non-Profit status has been reinstated thanks to the hard work of our Finance Officer. When Department meets its membership goals set by National, the Department gets a little extra money from National that can be used to update and maintain office equipment.

The **Public Relations Chair** attended the Chamber of Commerce's ribbon cutting at the Funky Monkey on the 9<sup>th</sup> of April and the coffee held at the Atkins-Johnson Farm on the 14<sup>th</sup> of April. He won a door prize again! Door prizes won at the chamber are re-gifted as door prizes at the monthly membership meetings.

The **April Membership Meeting** was held on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. Committee reports were heard as well as some preliminary information on Gladstone's Veterans celebration on May 23<sup>rd</sup> and our Memorial Day Ceremony on May 25<sup>th</sup>. The 50/50 stands at \$36. In case you don't know,

our Post does a Mega 50/50. Tickets are purchased prior to every Membership Meeting, but the drawing will not occur until the December meeting. The Law/Order and FF/EMT awards will be made at the Gladstone Ceremony on May 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Clay County Veterans Memorial Committee can now accept credit cards to purchase commemorative bricks. The Outreach Table will be at the Antioch Library for the entire month of May.

On the 7<sup>th</sup> of May, SR Vice, Nelson Duncan and Public Relations Chair, Douglas Millison, set at the Outreach Table at the Antioch Library for the Library's "**Young at Heart**" expo. The idea was to let retiring or retired people know what kind of activities are available for them to keep themselves occupied.

We were at **the Gladstone City Council Meeting** on the 11<sup>th</sup> of May. We presented a Certificate of Appreciation to CPL Bill Brier of the Gladstone Police Department for the sponsorship of a student to the Cadet Patrol Program. CPL Brier is the president of the Police Officers Association which provided \$425 to send the student.

15 May was **Peace Officers Memorial Day**. Members of the Post as well as many Gladstone Police Officers were on hand at the Big Shoal Cemetery to bring the flag there to half-staff.

The Fundraising Committee would like to thank the following members for participating in this year's Armed Forces Day **Poppy Sale** at Walmart, benefitting Veterans, active duty service personnel and their families. Wayne Beer, Bob Box, Robert Owens, Bill McDonald, and Douglas Millison on the AM shift and Nelson Duncan, Jerry Braton. Phyllis Rosales, and Michael McDonald for the PM shift. We received over \$1,200 from the great citizens of Gladstone! Great job by all!

On the 19th of May I attended the **Ground Breaking Ceremony for the Northland Innovation Campus (NIC)** that is being constructed on the corner of 69th St. and N. Oak Traffic way. It will be a \$20 million, 90,000 SF research and educational complex that is a public/private partnership between the City of Gladstone, North Kansas City Schools and Northwest Missouri State University.

NKC Schools will lease 60,000 SF for its Students in the Academically Gifted Education (SAGE) program. Northwest will create additional collaborations for K-12 programming and much more, including numerous completion programs and client-based services as the university continues to develop a seamless pipeline in pursuit of a Northwest degree. The NIC will be able to serve a variety of individuals seeking undergraduate and/or graduate work to complete degrees, and to serve employers needing client-based services.

The project is slated for completion in the spring of 2016 for this phase with an expansion of an additional 50,000 SF in the future, bringing it to 140,000 SF.

On the 20<sup>th</sup> of May Commander Beer, Nelson Duncan, Bob Box and Jerry Braton presented **School Awards** to 2 outstanding eighth grade students at Antioch Middle School. Zach Ropka and Samantha Thomas each received a certificate and a medal.

Gladstone held its annual **Armed Forces and Veterans Day Celebration** on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of May. Thanks to Jerry Braton and Bob Box for serving on that committee and all of their hard work with the assistance of Nelson Duncan. We started the day with a flag raising ceremony at Big Shoal Cemetery. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Missouri Infantry participated this year with a rifle volley and close order drill. The invocation was made by our Post Chaplain Robert Courtney and speeches were made by Mayor Bill Garnos and Army Historian John Dillingham. Museum manager Erica White ran the show. At the end volunteers from the museum historical society and the 3<sup>rd</sup> MO placed wreathes at the graves of Veterans buried in the cemetery. The rain held off for us.

The follow-on show, the main event if you will, was at Linden Square starting at 1100. Even without the rain that we had last year, there were far fewer Veterans to march in the Walk-On portion, and probably attending during any part of

the day. That was disappointing, but we did have more participating entities and things to see. I thought the historical military vehicles were especially neat, and the American Legion Band of Greater Kansas City put on a good show. The star of the show was when Post 626 past member COL (RET) "Doc Ballard, a Medal of Honor recipient, swore in eight upstanding citizens into the United States Army. HOOAH! That is something that very few in the Army can say and I am sure that they will remember it forever. Doc also charged us with not letting down our youngest group of Veterans who are still committing suicide in great numbers. We



must make ourselves available to them, reach out and let them know that they are cared about. If any of you want to get involved in this endeavor, if you have ideas to share, please contact our VA&R Committee and let's get to work!

We also awarded Certificates to our Law Enforcement and Fire Fighter / EMT of the year nominee's Officer LeAnn Smith and Fire Fighter / Paramedic Shawn Rulon. Both of these outstanding public servants were being recognized for performing their duties above and beyond that which is normally expected.



The Travelling Wall, an 80% scale replica of the Vietnam War Memorial was at The National WWI Museum at Liberty Memorial over the Memorial Day Weekend. Several Post members stepped up to volunteer their time to help the event run smoothly allowing Veterans and citizens to see the Wall, and maybe to heal just a little bit. Many displays of raw emotions and tears were witnessed over the weekend. Liz Kelly, one of the Gold Diggers who accompanied Bob Hope on his 1970 tour to Vietnam stayed for the whole weekend lending her support to the Veterans. A big THANK YOU to Legionnaires Bill Morris, Don Pind, Roy Stewart, Nelson Duncan, Samuel James and Mike McDonald for making themselves available. And of course to Liz, for her heart.

Post members put on a **Memorial Day Ceremony** on the 25<sup>th</sup> of May out at Big Shoal Cemetery. Commander Wayne Beer presided over the ceremony, Paula Fulkerson sang the National Anthem for us, Post Chaplain Robert Courtney gave the invocation, Bill McDonald led us in the pledge of allegiance and City Councilman and Legionnaire COL (RET) R.D. Mallams was the guest speaker. We placed the flag to half-staff and a wreath on the mock grave. Adjutant Phyllis Rosales led the POW/MIA Ceremony. Honor Guard members Bob Box, Nelson Duncan, Andy Lester and Bill McDonald finished everything off with a rifle salute and Olivia Fergerson, a Cadet Patrol graduate, played Taps on her Trumpet.

The **May Membership Meeting** was held on the 28<sup>th</sup> and committee reports were heard. The Fundraising Committee did confirm that we are a go for manning a beverage tent at this years' Kansas City Airshow on Aug 22-23 featuring the Blue Angels. It will be non-alcoholic beverages and our share is 10% of the gross. We should get around \$500 for the Post. We have around 10 volunteers on each day, with many working both days. We also held our **elections** for the upcoming 2015-2016 term. Millison was also elected to be the District 3 JR Vice. Congratulations all, and thank you for serving your Post.

I was able to get over to Jeff City on the 4th of June and I observed some of the training that is conducted at the Missouri State Patrol Training Academy for the **Missouri Cadet Patrol Program**. Legionnaire Bob Harper is the Director for the program and he said that in his eight years this has been the best class. They don't get a lot of visitors so Past Dept. Commander Marvin Harper and I were able to observe closely the kind of professionalism that is personified by the Missouri Highway Patrol getting instilled into these cadets. This is a great program and a big "Thank You" goes out to all supporters.

This was the 46th Missouri Cadet Patrol and there were 39 in the class. There are currently around 200 Troopers on the force who have graduated from the program, including LTC Sandy Karsten. The assistant superintendent oversees the

Patrol's Professional Standards and Public Information and Education divisions as well as the Patrol's legal counsel. SGT Day, the Cadets instructor, also a graduated from the Cadet Patrol before joining the Highway Patrol in 1994.

Our District Cadets were Brian Hobbs from Trimble sponsored by Post 626's Bob Box, Gage Aubrey from Polo sponsored by Post 58 and Austin Barker, also sponsored by Post 626 with the funds coming from the Gladstone Police Officers Association. They all had a good time and promised to get back to their Posts with a big Thank You.



On June 5<sup>th</sup> Commander Beer received a call from the Gladstone Chamber of Commerce requesting our help in presenting the colors for the opening of **Blues Fest** that evening. We accomplished the task. Commander Beer, Bill McDonald and Douglas Millison rallied to the cause and got the job done.

The **Public Relations Chair** attended the Chamber of Commerce's coffee on the 9th of June at Mosaic Life Care out on 152 and the Chamber "after hours" at Winnwood Skate Center on the 17<sup>th</sup>. Yes, there will be another door prize drawing at the June Membership Meeting!

I had the opportunity to visit **Missouri Boys State** on the 16th of June. If you haven't been, I highly recommend it. Whether you have anything to do with the program or are just interested in what the Legion does for our youth like I am, it is well worth the effort. In my short time there I was able to witness a session of the House and the House Committee on the Budget; the Federalist Party caucus where students put themselves on the line for positions in the state government from Auditor to Governor, and I also witnessed the Campaign and Political Operations and Television News School of Instructions. Throughout it all I saw outstanding and motivated students and high caliber instructors and staff. The Missouri Boys State House of Representatives was being guided by Representative Mike Colona from the 80th District of the Missouri House of Representatives, and the Dean for the TV News School of Instruction was Matt Flener from Kansas City's KMBC Channel 9 News.

Vietnam Veterans who have medical reasons to go now are being considered on a case by case basis. # Please distribute widely:

Public Institutions of Higher Learning that charge GI Bill students more than the resident rate for terms beginning after July 1, 2015 are breaking the law.

GI Bill claims where the school charges the student more than the resident rate will be disapproved. A waiver has been granted, but only until Dec 31st.

Colleagues and Fellow Veterans,

I would like to provide you a brief update with respect to Section 702 of the Choice Act. Today the Secretary of the Department of Veteran Affairs announced a blanket waiver to all non-compliant states until December 31, 2015 (granted a waiver).

In November, I wrote about the Veterans Access, Choice, and Accountability Act of 2014 ("the Choice Act") which included a provision affecting students using the Post-9/11GI Bill® and Montgomery GI Bill. The law requires us to disapprove programs under the Post-9/11 GI Bill and the Montgomery GI Bill-Active Duty at a public institutions of higher learning if the school charges certain individuals tuition and fees in excess of the resident rate for terms beginning after July 1, 2015.

We've been working with every state and territory since December on complying - no state or territory has indicated its schools do not intend to comply with the law. In fact, as of today 21 states comply with the resident rate-requirements of the Choice Act (www.benefits.va.gov/gibill/702.asp).

We are working hard to ensure all GI Bill beneficiaries have up to date information. As well, we are updating the GI Bill website with the latest information as schools and states comply with these requirements. We will also post breaking information on the GI Bill Facebook page at https://www.facebook.com/gibillEducation.
