At the end of every fiscal year the Historian prepares what is known as the CPR, or Consolidated Post Report. This report tells National what kind of work our Post is doing for our veterans, children and the community as a whole. In turn National annually reports that information to Congress to justify our Charter. And I'll tell you, our numbers look pretty good. Just a couple of them are; 3,284 volunteer hours at the VA with 5,890 *reported* community service hours altogether, \$615 donated to Volunteer Services at the VAMC, 5 VA Volunteers, 8 students sponsored to Boys State, attended 10 community events, a closing membership of 256, \$900 raised and distributed to local charities and the formation of a certified Honor Guard to give the graveside respect due to veterans and represent our Post in the community.

WHAT HAPPENED

Post 95 in Liberty had a nice **spaghetti dinner fundraiser** on the 9th of April. Only three of us from the Post made it. There was good food, a chance to see people we hadn't for a while and lots of door prizes. Thanks 95, see you next year!

This quarters **District Meeting** was on Apr 10th and was hosted by Post 58 in Smithville. Some notes from the meeting;

- Ronnie McBee, Post 95's service Officer and the Legions VSO at the KC VAMC was there with a few hospital updates
 - ER expansion is going well. When the new part is done they will use it, then update the old part and finally use the whole expanded area.
 - The ground has been broken for the 400 space parking garage.

- Issues with the Veterans Choice Card are being worked on.
- The Hospital has been without a Catholic Priest for some time. They are talking to the local diesis to possibly get a "loner".
- Boys State applications in our District were lower than normal this year. We sent 34 students and have 23 on standby.
- The District had 3 Cadet Patrol applicants, all paid for by Post 58.

A **Membership Meeting** was held on April 28th which went really long due to the amount of events we have going on in May. Candidates for Post Officers and Executive Committee were announced to be voted on at the next membership meeting. The Executive is staying the same as are most of the officers. The only changes are Gaila Sullivan taking Robert Owens place as Sgt. at Arms, Craig Lantz replacing Robert Courtney as Chaplain and Douglas Millison taking over for Robert Box as SR Vice. No, we are not purging all of the Roberts from our leadership rolls...

The Elks held a **scholarship fundraising breakfast** on Apr 30th and May 1st. We had 6 Legionnaires and two spouses attend at 0800 on the 30th to show our Posts support for what the Elks do for the youth of our community. We do plan on doing this every year and it would be great to see more people attend!!

Peace Officers Memorial Day ceremony May 15th was short and sweet. Only four Legionnaires showed up (Duncan, Braton, Mallams, and Millison) along with four police officers. It was a good opportunity to meet some of our young officers and show them a little of the respect that they deserve.

Many of us thought that the program itself was much better with all of the events taking place on the stage and the music finishing up the day. The Missouri National Guard brought in an artillery piece for everyone to look at and one young man was inducted into the Army. All in all a good day but we definitely need more veterans like you to participate!

Elections were held for the officers and executive committee at the Membership Meeting on the 26th of May. Results were the same as written above. Installation of the Officers will be on July 14, see below...

The Biannual **Poppy Sale** at Walmart was held on May 28th and \$948 was donated to the Posts VA&R Fund. Thank you Duncan, Beer, Braton, Sullivan, Robertson, Lester, Mallams, Owens, Papert, Farris, and Millison for volunteering your day. We did run out of Poppies in the last couple of hours, but that will get fixed for next year.



Our annual **Memorial Day ceremony** was held at the Big Shoal Cemetery at 1000 hrs on May 30th. Former Mayor and Post Commander Wayne Beer was the guest speaker, Bill McDonald lead the Pledge of allegiance, Jerry Braton placed the wreath and Gaila Sullivan presented the POW/MIA table. Thanks to them and to the Honor Guard for presenting a nice ceremony.

We had many volunteers helping out with the 20^{th} Gladstone Blues Fest on June 3rd through the 5th. From set up to tear down, the Posting of the Colors and running the concessions in-between we did a great job and the Gladstone Chamber of commerce was very grateful for our help. It also earned us \$300 in advertising during the event. On the plus side, all of our volunteers had a fun time and we can probably get them to do it again next year. Thanks to the Honor Guard (Farris, Millison, Beer, and McDonald) for the great job they did on the colors and all of the member helpers; Duncan, Millison, Bresee (from unit 61), Robertson, Farris, Rosales, Sullivan, and non-member Fergeson for a successful event.



A **Veterans Benefits Fair** was held at Post 95 on June 11th and our Post supplied more volunteers to help run it than any other organization. Thank you Rosales, Box, Braton,



Duncan, and Millison for your help. Unfortunately only four veterans showed up for help! Some issues that may have contributed to that are being addressed for when they hold the next one. But if you help only one, you have made a difference to that one.

Another **District meeting** was held in Belton on 12 June and it was decided to move the lunch/meeting time from 1200/1300 to a meeting/meal schedule of 1400 with the meal immediately following adjournment. We hope that this will give more people an opportunity to attend after church or whatever else they are doing. It was also announced and voted on (again) that the district host a hospitality room at the Department Convention that is in Kansas City this year. And unfortunately 3 rural District Posts are or will be closed soon. Gilman City, Holt, and Kidder are finding it impossible to stay open. That is something that comes from a lack of PARTICIPATION unfortunately.

Our **Executive Committee** meeting was held on the 18th of June. We discussed the possibility of moving our Membership Meetings to the Third Thursday of the month. This will eliminate the confusion for those 3 months out of the year that we have to move it from the 4th Thursday due to Holidays and Corporate Challenge. It will be discussed at the next membership meeting (still on the 4th Thursday). It may not change if there are scheduling conflicts with the hall, so just put it in the back of your mind until we tell you otherwise.

Boys State is held on MSU's Warrensburg campus from June 19th to the 25th. I checked online and found 9 of the 10 Oak Park candidates, 4 of the 7 Staley candidates and 3 of the 3 St. Pius candidates on the city rosters. One Oak Park and 2 Staley students are not on the roster at all because they could not come due to unforeseen circumstances (our #5 and #6 picks among them) and one Staley student was on the standby list and could have gone but did not answer any attempts to contact him.



Joe Farris and Doug Millison went to see how things are run down there on the 21st of June and stayed for part of the Legion appreciation event that evening. It is quite an eye opener to go and see first-hand what goes on and to talk to the young men and the counselors involved in this intense "week to last a lifetime". Two of our Oak Park students followed us from the Senate Chamber over to the House and then waited for us to come out just to say hi and to show their appreciation for Post 626 sponsoring them. For those involved in picking the kids, and the donors also, you should go down at least once. An idea for next year could be to invite the school counselors who are involved in the process to join some Legionnaires on a field trip.

On the 20th of June the Honor Guard, with the assistance of Joe's Grand Daughter LT Jessica Farris signing the National Anthem, conducted a **Flag Pole Dedication Ceremony** at the newly constructed Linden Woods Village on 72nd after which Past Post Commander and Former Mayor Wayne Beer gave a nice patriotic speech on the meaning of the flag and the valor of the Military and First Responders who serve under it. Their conduct and professionalism was well received by the residents.

The **Honor Guard** passed their **certification** test on June 25th at Big Shoal Cemetery. Now that they are certified they will be getting calls to perform gravesite honors in the area. We hope that more people join the guard to help spread-out

the workload; it takes 5 to do it properly with a minimum of 3 rifles. It would be easy to burn out and quiet if the same people do it over and over. Think of it this way, *who's going to do it for you then if you won't do it for them now?* (If you are physically able of course)

DID YOU KNOW? - Old Dogs Can Still Learn by Phyllis Rosales, Adjutant

Did you know that Missouri has over 30 different types of military and veteran personalized license plates available to qualified individuals? Any surviving spouse of a qualified individual would still be able to obtain the plate as long as the spouse does not remarry.

I took advantage of this benefit as soon as the state released the woman veteran license plate. I had to come up with several different choices for my plate, include the fee, and a copy of my DD214. When the plates were ready, they were

sent to the DMV that I requested and I traded my current plates for my personalized ones. That was over two years ago, and I have only seen one other woman veteran plate in my outings.

Another bit of information I just learned involves disability tags. A person who presents proof of permanent disability from the United States Veterans Administration is exempt from the four-year certification requirement for renewal of disabled license plates or placards. Initial applications must include a physician's statement confirming the individual's disability.

Missouri also offers free parking for certain veterans. Upon the approval of a local authority's governing body, a Veteran displaying a Congressional Medal of Honor, Prisoner of War, Silver Star, or Purple Heart specialty license plate may park his or her motor vehicle without charge in a metered parking space within the authority's jurisdiction if it is less than 6,000 pound gross weight. A Veteran who has been awarded the Bronze Star may apply to the Director of the Department of Revenue for a windshield placard which will allow him or her to also park without charge in a metered parking space if the placard is hung from the front, middle rearview mirror or displayed on the dashboard on the driver's side if there is no rearview mirror. Certain vehicle and parking restrictions are specified.

I want to tell you about one more thing Missouri has to offer her veterans that I personally took advantage of and have used several times. Missouri offers Veterans Identification on Driver's Licenses or State I.D. cards. Most veterans rely on their DD214 to prove their veteran status. Missouri has a VETERAN banner to the left of the bar code on the back of your drivers license to prove your status as a veteran. You can do this at any time at any DMV. You will need to bring a copy of your DD214 and the money to pay for a new drivers license. I waited until mine was going to expire because it was within a few months, but had it been years, I would have gladly paid to get a new license. I was able to prove to some unbelievers on Veterans Day that I did qualify for a free dinner.
