WHAT HAPPENED

We had a successful **Button Sales Fundraiser** and Membership Table at Walmart on the 4th of July. Originally scheduled for Saturday the 2nd, we had to reschedule it for the 4th due to rain. Thank you to Box, Duncan, Bland, Lester, Farris, Owens and Millison for making it happen. And let's not forget that we make those buttons! So a big thank you to Rosales, Millison, Owens, McDonald, and Duncan for putting together 700 buttons.

We appreciate the customers of Walmart who dig a penny out of their pocket or a twenty out of the wallet, without them we would NOT be able to do as much as we do.

The **Department Convention** was held in Kansas City this year and the Post took advantage of that sending 6 delegates and 3 alternates. We hope they all learned a little about the process. We had the Post Store open at the event and also raffled a patriotic garden rock that was donated by Phyllis. A lot of people wanted that rock resulting in 274 tickets being issued and a profit for the Post of \$226!

Neither the Governor nor the Mayor attended the opening even though



they were invited. To be fair that was the same morning that the Officers in Dallas were gunned down, so they could have been seeing to business. The Kansas City Police Chief, Darryl Forte was awarded the Department Law and Order Award and he was not able to attend either for that reason.

The **Post Installation and Initiation Ceremony** went well with 37 in attendance. Tristyn Bowling talked to us about his time in Boys State last year. He was the Posts first pick to attend and had a transformative experience to which he thanked us profusely. When we interviewed him for Boys State he was interested in history and thought that his future was in teaching history to others. After the "week to last a lifetime" he has started on a path to law school. It was great to hear from one of "our" students about their experience. When he was being introduced Hugh Mills told us that he was a

Over 140 boxes of school supplies were donated to the district and boxed on the spot for delivery to classrooms where the supplies were needed. Thank you all for your great work!

On **September 10**th Douglas Millison and RD Mallams were volunteers at the **Atkins Johnson Farm Country** Fair. Dan Lester was the Honor Guard representative from our Post, posting the colors during the opening ceremony for **Hero Fest**, the city's first annual celebration honoring our first responders. Patriot Day started with raising the colors at Big Shoal Cemetery to half-staff by Bill McDonald, RD Mallams, Gaila Sullivan and Doug Millison. One of the things we spend money raised from our button sales are charitable donations. Shortly after 9/11 Joe Farris, who has two sons in Law Enforcement delivered our annual donation to the Surviving Spouses And Family Endowment Fund (SSAFE). This fund gives a cash donation of \$25,000 to the eligible family members of first responders who lost their lives in the line of duty. Sadly, that number for the last 11 months totaled 5. VETERAN AFFAIRS & REHABILITATION

The House of Representatives passed the VA Accountability First and Appeals Modernization Act of 2016 Wednesday Sep 14, a bipartisan legislation that would reform the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs appeals process and reduce wait time for veterans' claims.

Prior to the House vote, The American Legion co-hosted a press conference with Sen. Richard Blumenthal, D-Conn., where he announced that he will introduce separate legislation in the Senate to reform the appeals process.

At the press conference, the Legion, other veterans service organizations, and 10 senators and representatives from both sides of the aisle called on Congress to pass legislation to fix the VA's broken appeals process.

"We strongly encourage Congress to pass the legislation so that our Nation's heroes can get the care and support they deserve in a timely manner," said, Verna Jones, executive director of The American Legion.

You can sign up for "Action Alerts" by creating an account at mylegion.org and sign up to take action. You will receive an email that describes the issue and give you the option to automatically send a pre-written letter supporting the Legions position to all of your representatives at once. Just put in your address and the program does it for you. Easy peasy.

On another front, new National Commander, Charles Schmidt, has announced that his charitable goal as commander is to raise \$1,000,000 each for the Temporary Financial Assistance Fund (TFA) and to train service officers to help you receive your benefits.

DID YOU KNOW?

In early 2003 area Veterans wanted to have a memorial that would honor Clay County Veterans from all wars beginning with the Civil War. As a result, Anita Gorman and John Dillengerham became co-chairman working with Mark McHenry of the Kansas City Parks and Recreation Department to secure funds and receive approval to build the memorial. The Clay County Veterans Memorial was dedicated on October 30, 2005.



Memories have been made through the generous support of many, to include Clay County American Legion Posts and their Auxiliaries, as well as local VFW Posts. A huge bronze eagle welcomes you as you approach the memorial. The black granite walls are engraved with the names of local fallen soldiers who died during combat. The eagle sits upon a rock base surrounded by a brick star. These bricks are available to the public to memorialize a loved one for a fee of \$100.00.

If you have never been to the memorial, it's a loss that you can redeem. The memorial is located in the Anita B. Gorman park at Vivion Rd and North Oak. This memorial is worth a visit and bring your children and grandchildren for a history lesson.

Come visit us, buy a brick so you too can live on at the memorial.

Being a member of the Honor Guard, in my opinion and I know shared by all members of the Guard, is the highest honor any member of the American Legion can be given. Well, the honor really isn't "given" it is earned by each member after hours of drill. The members of the Honor Guard gladly make sacrifices of time and money to make sure that the families of deceased veterans receive proper military honors at the grave site or chapel, whichever the case may be.



For anyone desiring to join the Honor Guard we have a program to help with financial aid in acquiring your uniform and we will do this in such a way that the request for financial assistance will be kept confidential to the extent that only members who need to know will be aware of the request. So please, don't let the "cash flow" issue be a roadblock to your desire to join. Call me and let's discuss how we can help you. Again, no one will even know you called. My number is 816-536-2713.

Another duty that we do is presenting the colors at events like Bluesfest and the Gladfest 5K. If you don't feel comfortable being on the team for funeral honors, what about as a color guard? That would give some of our Honor Guard a break and I would only call you for those details and rehearsals.

And now, a fun tad-bit you may not be aware of. "Why does an Honor Guard fire three volleys from rifles?" Answer: This tradition comes from traditional battle ceasefires where each side would clear the dead. The firing of three volleys indicated the dead were cleared and properly cared for.
