The **Department Fall Conference** was held in Jefferson City as usual, 21-23 Oct. The big news was that the Post was awarded the National Commanders Post Excellence Award. This award is given to Posts that can demonstrate their excellence in main areas of concern to the American Legion. To qualify for the award, the Post is required to achieve a standard of participation in each of four areas; membership, youth activities, community service and support to currently serving troops and veterans. Only Post 626 received the award at this year's Department (State) conference. A District Vice Commander received it from the Department Commander and the District

Commander R.E. Holtz presented the award to Commander Nelson Duncan during a Post meeting at the Gladstone Community Center on October 27<sup>th</sup>. "It's my pleasure to present this award on behalf of the American Legion to such a fine Post, said Holtz. "It just shows how much this group does for veterans and the community."

The award reads: Post 626 "Has demonstrated excellence in serving their community above and beyond all expectations. In keeping with the aims or our preamble, this Post and its members have displayed exemplary efforts through their devotion to mutual helpfulness. The Posts exemplary efforts deserve recognition for their support of the programs and activities of the American Legion, all the while being an asset in their community."



The Post Historian who also sits on the Department Centennial Committee attended that meeting. The committee is finalizing the details surrounding the Centennial Convention in ST Louis as well as promoting the Legions Centennial across the State. The Historian has Challenge Coins that were produced to raise funds for

this event and if you want one of these fine-looking coins they can be purchased from him for \$8 each. BUT WAIT, there's more. Some other highlights from the meeting;

- Bret Reistad, the endorsed candidate for National Commander in two years visited for the weekend giving us his background.
- The Legacy Ride will pass through Legion Park in St. Louise in 2018 or 2019 to pick up the time capsule encase there and bring it back to Indianapolis for the 2019 Convention.
- We are still trying to increase membership and ask that every member just recruit one more.
- The National Executive Committee has passed a resolution that states anyone not rendering proper respect to the flag during a Legion program will be ejected from the event.
- Last year Legion members donated 4 Million volunteer hours and 76,000 pints of blood.
- The Legion has pressured the VA to move away from the automated 1010EZ forms for health care enrolment because they were too hard to use. There are still other problems in the system slowing down enrolments which reduces the backlog because less claimants are getting in. We are still working on them to get the system working more efficiently.
- The scholarship forms are being updated and new ones should be sent to the schools shortly. Same deadline, but more money is available.
- A little late for this printing but our Department Legislative Committee Chairman Richard Heigert reminds us to NOT wear any Legion apparel at political events to avoid the possibility that your presence would be mistaken for Legion endorsement of that candidate. Remember that for the next cycle.
- Training was available in Membership and Americanism programs to include Children and Youth. This may become a mainstay of the spring conferences.

#### **VETERAN AFFAIRS & REHABILITATION**

The cold and flu season is upon us and the Department of Veterans Affairs has once again teamed up with Walgreens Pharmacies nationwide to allow all veterans who are currently enrolled in the VA healthcare system to walk into any of the over 8000 Walgreens nationally (and the Duane Reade pharmacies in the New York metropolitan area) to receive a vaccination *at no cost*. Vaccinations will be available through March 31, 2017.

Veterans wishing to receive the no cost vaccination simply need to present a Veterans Identification Card and a photo ID, at any participating Walgreens to receive the vaccination.

In addition, after the Walgreens pharmacist administers the vaccine Walgreens will transmit that information securely to the VA where it becomes part of the patient's electronic medical record.

VA is committed to keeping Veteran patients healthy, and during this flu season, vaccination is the best way to prevent the spread of flu. No matter where you live, visit your local VA clinic or Walgreens to get a free flu shot.

# **DID YOU KNOW?**

On July 20, 2015, the president signed into law the Veterans Identification Card Act of 2015. This act allows Veterans to apply for an identification card directly from VA. The VA identification card will allow Veterans to demonstrate proof of service for discounts at private restaurants and businesses.

It should be noted that the identification card is different from a Veteran Health Identification card or a DoD Uniformed Services or retiree ID card. As such, the VA identification cards cannot be used as proof of eligibility to any federal benefits and does not grant access to military installations.

When available, Veterans will be able to request an ID card from VA for a fee. VA is currently making plans to implement the new law in the most efficient and cost-effective way possible while protecting Veterans' personal information. We estimate that VA will be able implement the program in 2017. The cost of each card has not yet been determined.

In the meantime, Veterans who would like an identification card that displays their military service do not have to wait until VA implements the new law. You have several options:

- You can access and print a free Veterans identification proof of service letter through the joint VA/DoD web portal, eBenefits. This serves as proof of honorable service in the Uniformed Services, as defined in laws about the Department of Defense (DoD). Veterans can get a free eBenefits account by going to <a href="https://www.ebenefits.va.gov/ebenefits/homepage">https://www.ebenefits.va.gov/ebenefits/homepage</a>.
- Your driver's license or state identification card can carry a Veteran designation. This option is currently available in 49 states, along with Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia. We expect the 50th state, Washington, to offer this service in August 2017. Veterans wanting more information should contact their state department of motor vehicles or state department of Veterans affairs at http://www.va.gov/statedva.htm.
- Veterans who are enrolled in VA health care can obtain a free Veterans Health Identification Card (VHIC). For more information, please go to <a href="http://www.va.gov/HEALTHBENEFITS/vhic/index.asp">http://www.va.gov/HEALTHBENEFITS/vhic/index.asp</a>.
- Veterans who have retired from military service can receive an identification card from DoD. For information on obtaining or renewing such a card, please contact your nearest DoD identification card facility. You can find the location of these facilities through this link: <a href="https://www.dmdc.osd.mil/rsl/appj/site">https://www.dmdc.osd.mil/rsl/appj/site</a>.

# 2016 Honor Guard Report

2016 was a memorable year for Post 626 in many ways, one of which was the reactivation of the Honor Guard. For many weeks in the winter and spring of 2016 the members of the Honor Guard drilled weekly and got our uniforms assembled in preparation for our "Certification Tryout." With the help and direction of the Past Captain, Bob Box, and under the leadership of the new Captain, Dan Lester, we finally got to the point where we felt comfortable enough to request a Certification Tryout from the National Guard.

On Saturday, 25 June 2016, at 10:00 hours, location Big Shoal Cemetery, two members of the MO National Guard, Dept. of the Adjutant General of MO put us through the drill and we passed with flying colors! Participating in the tryout were the following: Honorary Captain Bob Box, Dan Lester, Joe Farris, Mike Bland, Bill McDonald, Jerry Braton, Doug Millison and Commander Nelson Duncan. On that date we became eligible to proudly wear the Missouri Military Funeral Honors Program patch on our uniforms which shows that we are certified by the Adjutant General's office to perform the military honors for deceased veterans. An honor and privilege, not a duty!

Since being certified, Kim Murch, after weeks of training made the "lineup" and has been a very good and loyal addition to the Honor Guard.

Here are some statistics about your Post's Honor Guard that I am proud to share with you:

Military Funeral Honors were given for: **13 soldiers**, **2 Marines**, **2 Airmen** (1 of which was US Army Air Corps.)

The Honor Guard generated \$1,700.00 of revenue for the Post.

In the month of May, 2016, I began keeping track of the Public Service Hours earned by the Honor Guard. From May 1 through December 31, 2016, the Honor Guard performed **415.75** man hours of public service!

I would also like to express my appreciation to Don Pind, our Post Armorer for maintaining our rifles and to the Millisons for the use of their garage as a "drill pad" on those rainy or cold days.
